Study Finds Lack of Awareness, Data Hinders Cases of Missing and Murdered Native American Women

Tammy Carpenter was in tears as she drove through a rural stretch of Northern California two years ago to Shasta County, near where her adult daughter, Angela McConnell, was found shot to death with her boyfriend in an encampment favored by transients.

She still remembers the way a sheriff's detective, who was not Native American, like herself, handled the delicate conversation.

Carpenter said that his line of guestioning insinuated that her daughter had come from a broken home where no one had jobs and all were involved with drugs.

"I'm a very vocal person, and I gave it to that detective," Carpenter, 51, said this week. "All my sisters and I graduated from college. We worked. We all loved Angela. With society today, people look and think: 'It's another dead Indian girl. Probably a drug addict. Homeless. Who cares?' That got me very upset."

The mysterious circumstances surrounding McConnell's killing is one of hundreds of cases of missing or murdered Indigenous women and girls across the United States that never garnered national headlines or social media attention or demands for justice from powerful people.

Annita Lucchesi, a Cheyenne descendant who started the Sovereign Bodies Institute, said becoming invested in the issue has to go beyond opening an office and also requires the difficult work of meeting with families and understanding the systemic racial and economic disparities that foster cycles of violence, poverty and crime.

"Cold case reviews are really important, but the issue is so complex and goes much deeper that we need a holistic team that can figure out not only why this is happening, but how can we stop it from happening to others, "Lucchesi said.

Abby Abinanti, the chief judge of the Yurok Tribe and the first Native American woman to be admitted to the California State Bar, said attitudes toward Indigenous women today can also be traced historically to the stealing of Indigenous children to work as indentured servants for white settlers through the Civil War and the sending of thousands of Native American children to boarding schools for federal assimilation programs in the late 19th century, in effect severing cultural connections and damaging familial relationships through the generations.

"That has a trickle-down effect, as they say," Abinanti said. "We have been invisible as Native people for a very long time."

Abinanti said that while it's important for tribal, local and state jurisdictions to find common ground in order to solve cases today, a lot of mostly rural communities are struggling to respond with adequate reworking with Indigenous communi-

It's not just adults who are traumatized and seeking answers, either. Sumi Gail Juan, a Hoopa Valley Tribe member, has been missing since 2010, when she was 33.

Her 16-year-old daughter has tried to piece together what happened to her mother, who had been battling drug addiction and suffered from

She said she knows the people her mother had been socializing with, and believes someone can say definitively whether she's still alive or not. "Cases like my mom's might be put on the back burner," said Juan's daughter, who has struggled with her own drug use and asked that her name not be used.

"People don't pay attention to Native women because maybe they think it's their fault what happened to them," the teen said. "But I can't give up on my mom."

Alveda King: Obama took the nation back to segregated '60s

Blasts former president for making Lewis funeral a political

It was more like a stump speech than a eulogy, taking America back to the segregated '60s, according to Alveda King, a niece of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

King was talking about Barack Obama's "wordplay" in the funeral of Congressman John Lewis. <u>BizPacReview report-</u> <u>ed.</u>

"Well, I guess we should have expected that the left, including President Obama, would take that occasion for a political moment," King said. "They'll grab at any opportunity, that's to be understood. I have chosen not to politicize the death of Congressman Lewis, but to remember him as a peaceful, nonviolent warrior and encourage everyone to resolve our conflicts peacefully."

She said Obama took a different road.

"Obama, with wordplay, took us back to 1960s, and that was a time when segregation was still on the books, segregation was still legal, and those in power, some of them, were trying to enforce that and **keep that,** "she said.

The report explained: "While Obama couldn't summon enough courage to speak President Trump's name, there was no mistaking his criticism of the president in what sounded more like a stump speech than a eulogy. As smug and arrogant as ever, not to mention divisive, the former president used the occasion to push the myth of voter suppression."



Obama said: "Even as we sit here, there are those in power who are doing their darnedest to discourage people from voting by closing polling locations, by targeting minorities and students with restrictive ID laws, and attacking our voting rights with surgical precision, even undermining the Postal Service in the run-up to an election that's going to be dependent on mail-in ballots so people don't get sick."

King also rejected the claims of voter suppression.

"President Trump is not trying to suppress the vote. As a matter of fact, you can see in my community, I'm telling everybody, 'Make sure you vote, register to vote. Pastors and leaders, encourage your people to vote.' We do want people to vote safely and we need the voting process to be fair," she said.

Obama's eulogy, King said, was nothing more than political grandstanding.





This is Jewish tribal history. It is a history that was never forgotten, not under imperial subjugation by the Babylonians nor the Persians, not under the Hellenists, the Romans, Arabs, Crusaders, Mamluks, Ottomans, or the British.

Though Jews never completely left Israel, most were forced into exile. But even over 2,000 years in the diaspora, we never forgot our connection to our ancestral homeland.

In exile we prayed, as observant Jews do today, to Jerusalem every day. Facing expulsions, massacres, and genocides, we maintained our language, our matrilineal blood ties, our dietary practices, our beliefs.

King Solomon established the First Temple in the tenth century BCE, 1,500 years before Muhammed was born. Muslim conquerors would build the al-Agsa mosque on top of the Jewish temple, just as Hernan Cortes built his castle on top of the great palace Tlahuica. Such is impe-


