CNN Settles For \$250,000,000.00 Catholic School Student, Nick Sandmann

CNN settled the defamation lawsuit with Covington Catholic High School student Nick Sandmann, who was the subject of its false and misleading coverage of a viral confrontation with a Native American elder, (Nathan Phillips) on January 18, 2019 on front of the Washington Memorial in Washington D.C.

The amount of the settlement was reported by Fox News at 250 million as a CNN representative confirmed the suit's resolution to the Washington Examiner.

A video from January 2019 went viral, and it appeared to show Sandmann and his classmates taunting a Native American man. Many outlets reported that they were the instigators in the conflict, but it turned out only to distort the actual events that unfolded. The longer video revealed that the students had seemingly been harassed by a group of Black Hebrew Israelite protesters, which had not been seen in the original viral clip.

The suit, which was filed in March 2019, addressed four television broadcasts and nine articles specifically, alleging that they contain statements toward or about Sandmann that are defamatory. It sought \$75 million for harm to Sandmann's reputation and \$200 million in punitive damages.

"The CNN accusations are totally and unequivocally false and CNN would have known them to be untrue had it undertaken any reasonable efforts to verify their accuracy before publication of tions," the suit read.

Sandmann's attorney, Todd McMurtry, told Fox News that lawsuits against "as many as 13 other defendants will be filed in 30 to 40 days."

Among them: ABC, CBS, The Guardian, the Huffington Post, NPR, Slate, The Hill and Gannett, which owns the Cincinnati Inquirer, according to Mc-Murtry. In addition, separate lawsuits against The Washington Post and NBC have been filed.





In 1919-1920 the American Indian people as "Wards of the U.S. Government" were under the direct control of the Bureau of Indian Affairs. And as such they had limited if any Constitutional On April 22, 1921, one year after rights.

The ideology of Tribal Rights, the rights of the individual tribal members, Self-Determination and Tribal Sovereignty is still not acceptable for many government officials today as it has been for the two and a half centuries.

Over the following few years the Federation became a very strong political tribal organization expanding it membership to include other California tribes and many from Arizona, New Mexico, Nevada and Oregon until it formally closed in the mid-1960's.

The long term strategy of the BIA to bring about the termination of the effort was the establishment of "Blood Quantum's" making the Tribal-Government relationship racial.

And to a great extent it has been successful. One only needs to look at the membership requirements of many of the tribes requiring a specific degree of "*Tribal Blood*" or "Indian **Blood**" for membership.

The Federal Government has also extended Treaty Rights made with mid-western and eastern tribes to the California Indians in its effort to create a "One Size Fits All" policy for dealing with the Tribal Governments which is beneficial to the California Indian tribes.

Several bills were introduced into Congress during the 1880s which sought relief for the "Mission Indians" proved unsuccessful. The Dawes Act of 1887 which provided for the allotment of reservation lands further imperiled their homes.

Once again, one must remember that the American Indian people were not American citizens until June 2, 1924.

The Indian Citizenship Act of 1924, also known as the Snyder Act, was sponsored by Representative, Homer P. Snyder (R) from New York that granted full U.S. citizenship to America's indigenous peoples, which were The Federation served as a strong called "Indians" in this Act.

Although many were not elected official to many of the Tribal Governments they operated as a "Shadow Government."

The Federation also formed its own police forces and although they had no legal jurisdiction they enforce law and order on the reservations. The BIA also maintained an "Indian Police" force but it was not well respected by the tribal people because of their unfairness and corruption.



As with all political organization money was needed for mail, printing and travel. A major fundraiser for the group was the annual fiestas that were held on various reservation.

In addition to the sale of food and wares wine and whiskey were bootlegged as until 1953 it was illegal for Indians to drink or buy liquor. Gambling was another revenue source at the fiestas.

And not one administrator or medical provider were ever held accountable.

> The organization held regular membership meetings that were well attended although the locations, times and dates of the meetings were held in the strictest confidence.

> Water rights was s major concern of the Federation. They assisted many southern California Tribes with filed law suits against the Government for negligence of duties of protecting the tribes water rights and against local water agencies for infringement on their water resources.

> However, the Governments legal strategy was to stall any court proceedings which they implemented successfully. Many examples include the Soboba water litigation that was settled after 67 -years, Rincon 65 years, Pala, and Auga Caliente to name a few. The resent Supreme Court landmark decision on the water rights of the Auga Caliente tribe proved the Federation to be correct in their claims on tribal water rights.

> In 1953, Congress passed Concurrent Resolution 108 and Public Law 280, which reduced the influence of the BIA on reservations and transferred the policing of reservations to the State.

> The P.L. 280 legislation was and to this day a disaster. While it allowed the States to enforce criminal laws on tribal lands the State and local governments have clashed with the Tribal Governments over the extend of jurisdic-

Church Shooter DOA

GRANBURY, Texas: Despite training church members security team to be vigilant, 71-year old Jack Wilson never expected he would have to shoot down a man as he did during a church service as he did at the West Freeway Church of Christ.

Wilson was hailed as a hero by local law enforcement officials after stopping a gunman who killed two members of the congregation in the town of White Settlement, deacon Anton "Tony" Wallace and fellow security team member Richard White. Wilson, who owns a gun range, told NBC News on Monday that he was still grappling with the death of his two friends and concerns for the close-knit congrega-

"I don't feel like I killed a human, I killed an evil and that's how I'm coping with the situation," Wilson said.

Wilson, a former reserve deputy for the Hood County Sheriff's Office, said he felt an instinct the moment the stranger walked in with his long coat, wig and a fake beard.

Wilson said he walked back to the church's audio and visual room to make sure there was a camera on the man, later identified as Keith Thomas Kinnunen, while White kept an eye on him from his chair in the auditorium.

Kinnunen got up from his place on the pew twice before approaching Wallace during communion and pulling out a shotgun.

"Richard did get his gun out of the holster, he was I think able to get a shot off but it ended up going into the wall." Wilson said. "The shooter had turned and shot him and then shot Tony."

Wilson, said that he had his gun out as the shooter turned to the front of the auditorium, but had to wait a second to get a clear shot as members of the church reacted to the attack. "The man went down and didn't get up from the head wound after I shot him, as other congregation members on the security team came in." He added.

He said the congregation began training a security team about 18 months ago, after nearly two dozen churchgoers were killed in Sutherland Springs in late 2017.

And so Wilson began training members as he does many others who come to his gun range, On Target Firearms Academy. He said that had the team not been in place, the outcome for the more than 200 members of the church could have been much worse.

"The whole time from when he stood and turned till it was over was less than six seconds." Wilson said of the shooter. "I was watching the replays with the FBI yesterday, it's between four and six seconds from the start to finish.

Saul Alinsky's Doctrine: 8 steps to topple a nation & create a socialist state


- **1)Healthcare** Control healthcare and you control the people
