Canada mourns as remains of 215 children found at indigenous school

A mass grave containing the remains of 215 children has been found in Canada at a former residential school set up to assimilate indigenous people.

The children were students at the Kamloops Indian Residential School in British Columbia that closed in 1978.

The discovery was announced by the chief of the Tk'emlups te Secwepemc First Nation.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said it was a "painful reminder" of a "shameful chapter of our country's history".

he First Nation is working with museum specialists and the coroner's office to establish the causes and timings of the deaths, which are not currently known.

Rosanne Casimir, the chief of the community in British Columbia's city of Kamloops, said the preliminary finding represented an unthinkable loss that was never documented by the school's administrators.

Canada's residential schools were compulsory boarding schools run by the government and religious authorities during the 19th and 20th Centuries with the aim of forcibly assimilating indigenous youth.

Kamloops Indian Residential School was the largest in the residential system. Opened under Roman Catholic administration in 1890, the school had as many as 500 students when enrolment peaked in the 1950s.

The central government took over administration of the school in 1969, operating it as a residence for local students until 1978, when it was closed.

"To our knowledge, these missing children are undocumented deaths," Ms Casimir said. "Some were as young as three years old."

"We sought out a way to confirm that knowing out of deepest respect and love for those lost children and their families, understanding that Tk'emlups te Secwepemc is the final resting place of these children."

The tribe said it had reached out to the home communities whose children attended the school. They expected to have preliminary findings by mid-June.

British Columbia's chief coroner Lisa Lapointe told Canadian broadcaster CBC "we are early in the process of gathering information".

The reaction has been one of shock, grief and contrition.

Canada's minister of indigenous relations, Carolyn Bennett, said residential schools were part of a "shameful" colonial policy. The government was committed to "memorializing those lost innocent souls", she said.

Terry Teegee, the regional chief of British Columbia's Assembly of First Nations, called finding

such grave sites "urgent work" that "refreshes the grief and loss" of communities in the region.

Those views were echoed by other indigenous groups, including the First Nations Health Authority (FNHA).

"That this situation exists is sadly not a surprise and illustrates the damaging and lasting impacts that the residential school system continues to have on First Nations people, their families and communities," its CEO Richard Jock wrote in a statement.

What were residential schools?

From about 1863 to 1998, more than 150,000 indigenous children were taken from their families and placed in these schools.

The children were not allowed to speak their language or to practice their culture, and many were mistreated and abused.

A commission launched in 2008 to document the impacts of this system found that large numbers of indigenous children never returned to their home communities.

The landmark Truth and Reconciliation report, released in 2015, said the policy amounted to "cultural genocide".

The Missing Children Project documents the deaths and the burial places of children who died while attending the schools. To date, more than 4,100 children who died while attending a residential school have been identified, it says.

Rose Mary Salgado

March 7, 1956 — May 14, 2021

"The Lord is my Shephard, I shall not want..."

Rose Mary Salgado was born on March 7, 1956 and went to Jesus on May 14, 2021 at age 65. She was a mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, Godmother, tribal and community leader and goodwill ambassador for her people.

She was the youngest of her parents', Ernest Salgado Sr. and Fidelia Juarez Salgado, six children. And like her mother, father, brothers and sisters she was raised on the Soboba Indian Reservation. She attended public school in San Jacinto, graduated from San Jacinto High School in 1974 and attended the University of California, Riverside.

She retired from Southern California Edison after 27 years of service as a senior planner in 2002. Her ability to work under extreme pressure won her respect and praise early in her career with SCE.

Rose credited her parents with instilling a prominent work ethic in her, teaching her to always be tolerant, fair and honest in dealing with people. Those who knew her know that her life was shaped by these values.

Rose was an active community and tribal leader. She served on the Soboba Tribal Council for 28 years. She also served as a Trustee with the San Jacinto Unified School District, Valley-Wide Recreation and Parks District, Hemet-San Jacinto and Menifee Valley Chambers of Commerce and the Ramona Bowl Amphitheatre Board of Directors and as the President of the Board. Her fundraising efforts were credited with helping save the Ramona Bowl Amphitheatre from bankruptcy.

Rose also served with several other nonprofits and educational agencies. To assist these organizations with their fundraising efforts, she established the Soboba Lip Sync Contest.

She was highly regarded within the local community and was recognized for her community commitment and service with several awards. Two special acknowledgements of her community contributions were her serving as the grand marshal for the San Jacinto 4th of July Parade in 2016 and the Hemet Christmas Parades in 2011.

In 2015, Rose was considered a top candidate to replace Jeff Stone as the Riverside County Supervisor for District 3. However, it was not to be as she was forced to cancel her candidacy due to health issues.

During her tenure with the Soboba Band of Luiseño Indians Tribal Council she helped navigate the tribe through many years of political and legal conflicts with local, state and federal governments, courts and agencies to bring about meaningful tribal self-governance, economic development and community growth.

Rose was an unyielding force for a quality and meaningful education for the American Indian people. Also among her top priorities were community improvement, housing, the protection of tribal water rights and the preservation of tribal traditions, customs and values.

And, given all her success and accomplishments, Rose never lost her sense of humor and the ability to laugh at herself. She also never saw the need to live anywhere other than the Soboba Indian Reservation.

Rose always made spending time with her family and friends a priority. She showed great pride in their accomplishments. She was extremely pleased with her grandsons, Ataax and Ayalkawut for graduating from high school and planning to continue their education. Her youngest granddaughter Tuupash, at age-9, gave her great pleasure with her interest in tribal culture.

She was especially proud of her granddaughter, Avellaka Arviso, who plans to attend Law School.

Rose was preceded on her ascent into heaven by her mother Fidelia Juarez Salgado, father Ernest Salgado Sr., brother Robert "Bobby" Salgado Sr., brother-in-law Francis "Franny" Diaz Sr., sisters-in-law Patsy Ann Salgado and Gwen Saubel Salgado, nephews Robert "RJ" Salgado Jr. and David Diaz, and great nephews Daniel Salgado and Muhammad Kabeer.

Rose is survived by her daughter, Desiree "Dez" Salgado, (son-in-law Alfred Arviso III) her four grandchildren, Avellaka, Ataax, Ayalkawut and Tuupash Arviso Goddaughter Mica Diaz, brothers Ernie Salgado Jr. and Richard Salgado Sr., sisters Lorraine Maciel (Frank Maciel Sr.) and Frances Diaz, sister-in-law Claudia Salgado (Robert Sr.).

In addition to her immediate family, Rose is survived by Aunties Barbara Guanche, Rose Mary Torte and Alice Bentiste Helms and Uncles William "Billy Joe" Bentiste and George Smith. She also leaves scores of nieces and nephews and literally hundreds of cousins.

Memorial services for Rose were held at 9 a.m. on Saturday, May 29, 2021 at the San Jacinto Assembly of God, 300 W. 1st St., San Jacinto CA 92583. Burial followed at the Soboba Indian Reservation Cemetery and was followed by a traditional lunch at the Soboba Sports Complex on the Reservation.

Critical Race Theory & NY Times' "1619 Project" in classrooms Under Attack as Un-American

Fox News reports that a coalition of 20 state attorneys general called Wednesday for the Biden administration to withdraw education proposals that they argue are meant to promote critical race theory and the New York Times' "1619 Project" in classrooms.

The group's criticism centered on recent proposals from the Department of Education that detail plans in April to provide grants under American History and Civics Education programs for a curriculum teaching diversity and the effects of "systemic" inequality.

The Biden regime has been force feeding racism down all of our throats all the while claiming they want "peace and unity", which is nothing more than lies and manipulation.

People need to stop listening to anyone who endorses critical race theory and start openly shutting down anyone and any corporations who endorse it. The department's proposal on April 19 referenced the 1619 Project, a series of long-form essays that seeks to reframe American history by analyzing the long-term consequences of slavery and the contributions of Black Americans.

ic racism and the country's failings. However, a number of historians have questioned its accuracy, and critics argue it misrepresents the country's institutions.

"Congress made clear that the purpose of the programs is to advance a traditional understanding of American history, civics, and government," the letter added. *"The proposed priorities would do little to advance that goal and, based on the proposal's support for the "1619 Project," would endorse teaching factually deficient history."*

The role of schools in examining systemic inequality has been a source of partisan discord in recent months. In January, President Biden issued an executive order disbanding the "1776 Commission," an initiative formed by former President Donald Trump as a response to the 1619 Project.

People need to start writing to their state officials to push for their state Attorney Generals to do the same and continue to put the pressure on to make it happen.

This is the way to but the brakes on government controlled racism and to start to heal communities at the state levels. When the federal government refuses to lead the way when it comes to real healing, real unity and accountability, then it must fall on each state to do what is right and prevent federal indoctrination.

Native American Liberator of Nazi Germany Recognized by Jewish Human Rights Group

LOS ANGELES — On the 76th anniversary of the liberation of Nazi Germany's Dachau Concentration Camp, a Jewish human rights center based in Los Angeles is celebrating a Native American soldier of Chickasaw and Choctaw descent for his assistance.

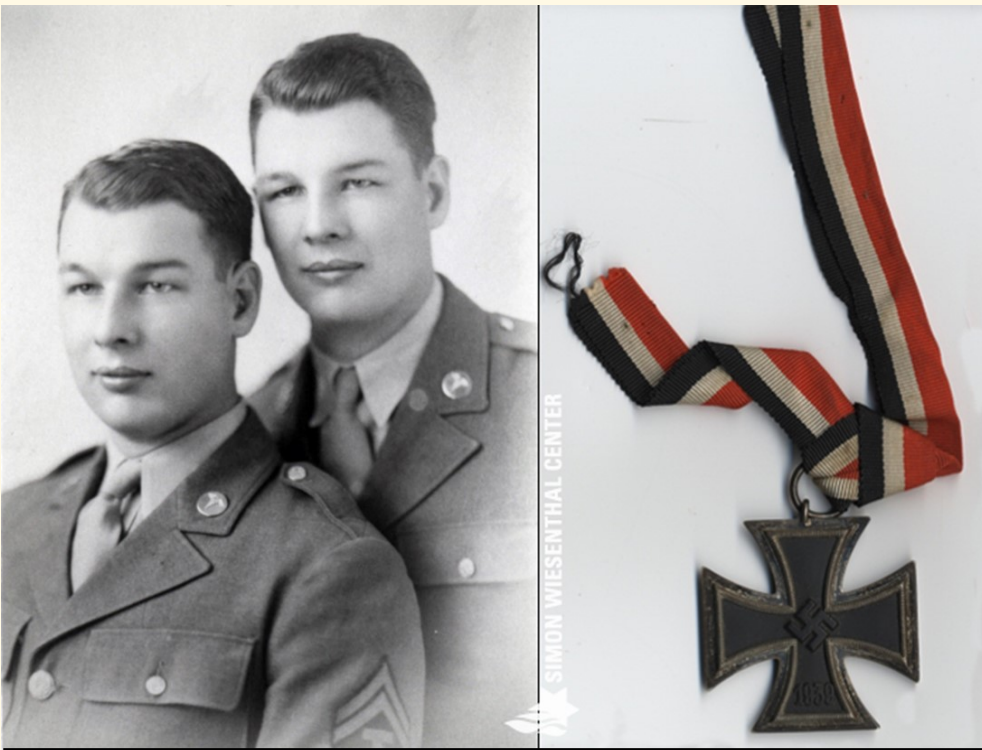
Twin brothers Bennett Freeny and Benjamin Freeny—born in 1922 in Caddo, Okla.—enrolled in the U.S. Army as 18-year-olds, both serving as combat medics, according to information provided by the Simon Wiesenthal Center.

The boys were enrolled in the 45th Infantry Division, a regiment of the United States Army's National Guard also known as the Thunderbird Division, consisting of 14,500 troops, including more than 1,500 Native Americans. The group was composed of soldiers from the American Southwest, and thus bore the symbol of a Native American Thunderbird, according to the Oklahoma Historical Society.

The Thunderbirds fought battles in North Africa, Italy and France between 1943 and 1944. In 1945, the final year of World War II, the Thunderbird Division captured the German cities of Nuremberg and Munich.

Bennett Feeny was part of one of the first units to enter Dachau Concentration Camp on April 29, 1945, where they helped liberate tens of thousands of prisoners.

His brother, Benjamin Freeny, was

killed in combat in Italy two years earlier, according to the Center's archivist.

More than 11,000 Jews were killed at Dachau—the first Nazi concentration camp established in March 1933, shortly after Adolf Hitler became chancellor of Germany—through starvation.

According to the Simon Wiesenthal Center's press release, Bennett Freeny stripped a German officer of an iron cross, or military decoration, after the liberation.

A fellow soldier, Ace Caldwell, de-

tailed the account in a letter sent to Freeny's daughter, a copy of which she later gave to the Center to keep in their archives.

"Bennett and I were both medics with the 45th and we encountered a great many prisoners who had contracted Typhoid and other ailments, and even more who had been starved," the letter, quoted by the Center, reads. "We were very disheartened by the condition of these poor souls and still enraged by the evil and carnage we had encountered liberating the camp."

He goes on to say that a German SS officer walked through the camp with "a sort of sneer on his face."

"Your dad stood, walked up to him and pulled out his knife," Caldwell wrote. "A couple of our boys stood by and prevented the officer from moving. Your father, one at a time, cut his medals and insignias off his uniform - Death Head, Edelweiss insignia, various patches and came to the Iron Cross hanging around his neck. Bennett grabbed it, cut the ribbon, and said 'this is the sign of a hero - there are no heroes here' and stuffed all the medals and patches in his pocket."

"A few of the prisoners who were able, clapped. We were young men who had a lifetime of horror and violence visited upon us by age 23. None of us would ever be the same, but that day your father was bigger than life."

Three of the handful of Congressional Medals of Honor that American Indians received in World War II were awarded to soldiers in the 45th: Ernest Childers, Jack Montgomery, an Oklahoma Cherokee and classmate of Childers at Chillico Indian Agricultural School, and Van T. Barfoot, a Mississippi Choctaw, according to American Indian Magazine.

Jacob's twelve sons became the ancestors of the Israelites, also known as the *Twelve Tribes of Israel* or *Children of Israel*. Jacob and his sons had lived in Canaan but were forced by famine to go into Egypt for four generations, lasting 430 years, until Moses, a great-great grandson of Jacob, led the Israelites back into Canaan during the "Exodus". The earliest known archaeological artifact to mention the word "Israel" as a collective is the Merneptah Stela of ancient Egypt (dated to the late 13th century BCE).

The area is also known as the Holy Land, be-

ing holy for all of the several Abrahamic religions including Judaism, Islam, Christianity and the Bahá'í Faith.

Through the centuries, the territory was known by a variety of other names including Canaan, Samaria, Djahy, Judea, Yehud, Iudaea, Syria Palaestina and Southern Syria.

Fast forward. After World War II, the UK found itself facing a Jewish guerrilla campaign over Jewish immigration limits, as well as continued conflict with the Arab community over limit levels.

Haganah joined Irgun and Lehi in an armed struggle against British rule. At the same time, hundreds of thousands of Jewish Holocaust survivors and refugees sought a new life far from their destroyed communities in Europe.

The Haganah attempted to bring these refugees to Palestine in a program called Aliyah Bet in which tens of thousands of Jewish refugees attempted to enter Palestine by ship. Most of the ships were intercepted by the Royal Navy and the refugees rounded up and placed in detention camps by the British.

Three years after the end of World War II and winning its independ-

ence from Britain and in-going conflict with the Muslim Countries Israel was admitted as a member of the UN by majority vote on May 11, 1949 with the full support the United States of America and President Truman.

Israel was established as a homeland for the Jewish people and is often referred to as a Jewish state. The country's Law of Return grants all Jews and those of Jewish ancestry the right to Israeli citizenship.^[324] Retention of Israel's population since 1948 is about even or greater, when compared to other countries with mass immigration.

Feds OK tribal casino, sports betting deal

PHOENIX — Gambling on sports events and online fantasy sports betting became legal in Arizona on Monday, along with a host of new gambling options at tribal casinos, after the U.S. Department of the Interior approved an updated tribal gaming compact with the state.

The approval puts into effect emergency legislation Gov. Doug Ducey signed in April that was a counterpart to the new tribal gambling agreement. The deal the Republican governor signed with the tribes allows them to expand their casino gambling offerings and offer sports and fantasy betting.

Outside of the reservation casinos, major professional sports groups will be able to offer wagering on pro sports like the NFL, and NBA. And online fantasy sports operations like DraftKings can piggyback on the licenses.

The approval by the Interior Department's Bureau of Indian Affairs was the last cog needed for the gambling options to be fully legal in the

state. Pro teams will need to get state-issued licenses and set up operations. Backers of the legislation hope that is possible by the start of the NFL season this fall.

The tribes fiercely protected their exclusive right to most gambling in Arizona under the gaming compact approved by the state's voters in 2002 and will continue to get that protection under the new deal.

In addition to the new sports and online betting, the tribes can now greatly expand their exclusive gambling offerings, adding games such as Baccarat and craps and increasing the number of slot machines while maintaining existing offerings of blackjack and poker.

Ducey hailed the milestone, which came after five years of negotiations with tribes.

"Gaming creates thousands of jobs for Arizonans, it generates tax revenue that benefits key areas of our communities, and it draws visitors to our state," Ducey said in a statement.

Arizona:

Connecticut governor signs sports betting bill

HARTFORD, Conn. — Connecticut Gov. Ned Lamont on Thursday signed legislation that finally legalizes sports wagering and online gambling, the last step before the U.S. Department of Interior is asked to sign off on an amended gambling compact between the state and the Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan Tribes.

Proponents are hopeful that bets can be placed as soon as this fall.

"I am confident that the federal government will see fit to approve these amendments to our compact, and in the coming months we can launch a modernized, 21st century gaming experience in Connecticut," said Lamont in a statement.

By signing the bill into law, Lamont ended years of debate and failed negotiations with the state's two federally recognized tribal nations, who have exclusive rights to certain forms of gambling in the state. They own and operate Mohegan Sun and Foxwoods Resort Casino in southeastern Connecticut.

Under the agreement Lamont and his administration reached with tribal leaders, both sovereign nations will be allowed to offer sports betting, online gambling and online fantasy sports, on and off their reservations, in return for providing the state a share of the revenues.

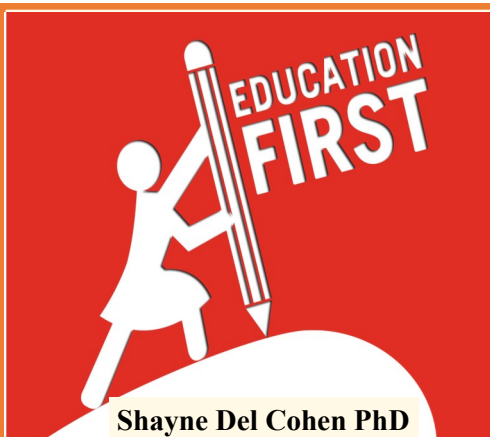

“The Struggle, Adaptation and Survival”

While seemingly off point, I am including this article I wrote because it points out that another era is upon us, or in another analysis, history is about to repeat itself wherein a group of individuals perceive that the rules of the world they inhabit are not working for them - that they have a vision of how the world should be and any persons or laws in their way can be overrun. Corporate governance is not new; John Collier thought the only way for tribes to transit from the Age of Agriculture to the Industrial Age.

A Over 150 years ago, probably 10,000 or more persons tramped across Nevada territory, doing some irreparable ecological damage and, of course, altering traditional lifestyles of existing residents forever. Some had visions of empire building; some were adventure seekers exploring new worlds and realities. Others were wanting to reinvent themselves with unknown opportunities. And there were the gold seekers.

Later came those sent by the Church; those sent by Eastern capital to create a human support system to Pacific markets and ports, and then the Railroads tying together the edges of the emerging empire.

Out of this chaotic parade of disparate goals and objectives, with assistance from Washington, D.C., a group (of men) created a Territory and then State of Nevada in 1864.

Over the next few years, the land base expanded and counties were

created. (Historical anomaly is the acquisition of some Clark County land from Arizona which was not legally consecrated until the 1970's).

The seventeen county state prospered, starved, prospered and starved in varying epochs. Government institutions were kept at a minimum for a small population. “Leaders” spent one hundred years decrying (and attacking) the devastated tribal communities as they developed a system of self governance, home rule and emergent economies.

Legislatively, politicians developed a stratified system to respond to the different realities of local government, often passing laws that distinguished between “populations over 400,000, for populations over 100,000 and those less than 100,000.”

The population/political center moved from Elko (*mining and agriculture*) to Reno (agriculture and gambling) to Las Vegas, a phenomena known throughout the world. (*What goes on in Vegas, doesn't always stay in Vegas*).

The face of Vegas was not mining or agriculture. The image of sin, glamour and glitz covering a nuclear age industry, was the precursor to the new realities of the Information Age and all the possibilities the electronic world brings - an eon away from the loquacious days of Paiutes at Warm Springs.

History is repeating itself. Enter the Innovation City.

Here come visions of empire build-

The culture of Nevada will be dramatically changed if/when this new generation of “techie” entrepreneurs who's world view and interests are vastly different than those of the current residents.

Did the transition of lifestyle from living off the land to being in the bottom sectors of most USA statistics benefit Nevadans?

Probably no one wants to spend their time grubbing the land for something to eat. We love shopping and revel in the creature comforts of the times. The pandemic has caused many to reexamine values and goals. Emergent 21st technologies are prevalent throughout our lives and lifestyles. We have definitely arrived in the Age of Information from the Era of Agriculture and the Industrial Age.

Are our institutions and government systems able to deal with this in their present form? These academic, administrative and often surreal topics are now the subject of hot debate (in some circles).

Where there is hot air, there is smoke. Where there is smoke, there is fire. To suppress fire, one needs chemical suppressant or water.

With a nod to beef, where is the water?

The final historic irony is that, at present, the Pyramid Lake Tribe holds the key to the first proposed Innovation City in that water is to be transported by pipeline from CA/NW Nevada through the res to the new city.

Former Hawaii Rep. Tulsi Gabbard accused Chicago Mayor Lori Lightfoot of “*blatant anti-white racism*” Friday for only granting one-on-one interviews to “*black and brown*” reporters.

“*Mayor Lightfoot's blatant anti-white racism is abhorrent,*” Gabbard, a fellow Democrat, said. “*I call upon President Biden, Kamala Harris, and other leaders of our county—of all races—to join me in calling for Mayor Lightfoot's resignation.*” “*Our leaders must condemn all racism, including anti-white,*” Gabbard, who is Samoan, added.

The Chicago mayor did not immediately respond to a request for comment from the Daily Caller News Foundation. Lightfoot announced earlier this week that she is “*prioritizing media requests from People of Color reporters*” as she commemo-

rates “*the occasion of the two-year anniversary of my inauguration as mayor of this great city.*”

“*This is an imbalance that needs to change,*” Lightfoot tweeted. “*Chicago is a world-class city. Our local media should reflect the multiple cultures that comprise it.*”

“*We must be intentional about doing better,*” she continued. “*I believed that when running for office. I stand on this belief now. It's time for the newsrooms to do better and build teams that reflect the make-up of our city.*”

The White House did not immediately respond to a request for comment from the DCNF regarding Gabbard's call for President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris to condemn Lightfoot's “*blatant anti-white racism.*”

Biden received funds from Russian lobbyist before conceding on major pipeline

President Joe Biden received a sizable campaign contribution from a Russian lobbyist just months before declining to enforce sanctions on a Russian firm building the Nord Stream 2 pipeline, according to a report.

"He was not flagged during our vetting process," a spokesperson for the Democratic National Committee told the *New York Post* regarding McLarty Associates Managing Partner Richard Burt, confirming the donation.

Burt, a former Republican and U.S. ambassador to Germany in the 1980s, made a pair of donations to assist Biden's presidential election: a \$4,000 contribution to Biden's Victory Fund just ahead of the 2020 presidential election and a \$10,000 donation to Unite The Country, a liberal political action committee, in March 2020.

"When Richard Burt donated to Biden Victory Fund, he failed to acknowledge that he was a registered foreign agent and was therefore ineligible to contribute," the spokesman said. "Because Burt also listed a different employer than on his [Foreign Agents Registration Act] registration, he was not flagged during our vetting process."

Biden violated his own campaign's pledge not to accept lobbyist cash when he took the payment,

and Burt actively lobbies for five European energy companies (ENGIE, OMV, Shell, Uniper, and Wintershall Dea) that are partnering together to construct the Nord Stream 2 pipeline.

The DNC confirmed they ultimately returned the funds.

Anna Massoglia, an investigative researcher at the Center for Responsive Politics, said that the donation was not particularly illegal but was business-as-usual for Washington.

"Reading between the lines, you can clearly see what that lobbying looks like," said Massoglia. *"While it's not evidence of anything illegal, it's just something that is evidence of how influence works in Washington."*

Gazprom, a company controlled by the Russian government, will own and operate the pipeline, which runs 1,200 kilometers from Russia to Germany.

Biden announced his decision to waive the sanctions on the Russian company, and its construction of the pipeline *"is almost completely finished."*

"Because it's almost completely finished, No. 1. The idea that anything that — and it's not like I can allow Germany to do something they're

not," he said, noting the Nord Stream 2 pipeline was *"almost completed by the time I took office."*

"To go ahead and impose sanctions now, I think, would be counterproductive now in terms of our European relations. And they know how strongly I feel. And I hope we can work on how they handle it from this point on," he said.

Secretary of State Antony Blinken released a statement last week signaling the administration's opposition to the pipeline.

"Today's actions demonstrate the Administration's commitment to energy security in Europe, consistent with the President's pledge to rebuild relationships with our allies and partners in Europe. We will continue to oppose the completion of this project, which would weaken European energy security and that of Ukraine and Eastern flank NATO and EU countries," Blinken said.

"Our opposition to the Nord Stream 2 pipeline is unwavering. Though we may not always agree, our alliances remain strong, and our position is in line with our commitment to strengthen our Transatlantic relationships as a matter of national security," he continued.



Creepy Comrade Biden Makes "Chester the molester" Remarks to 7-Year Old Children

Creepy Joe Biden looks at a little girl in the audience, the daughter of a veteran, and says *"I love those barrettes in your hair. Man I'll tell you what, look at her she looks like she's 19 years old sitting there like a little lady with her legs crossed."*

Two days after President Joe Biden made "creepy" comments to the press about deceased Minneapolis criminal suspect George Floyd's 7-year-old daughter, he made yet another set of creepy comments — this time directly to a little girl.

During a Memorial Day weekend speech Friday to military families at Joint Base Langley-Eustis in Hampton, Virginia, he briefly focused his attention on the reportedly very young daughter of a veteran who was in attendance.

"I love those barrettes in your hair, man," he said directly to her. *"I tell you what, look at her. She looks like she's 19 years old sitting there like a little lady with her legs crossed,"* he then said to the audience.

The little girl he'd spoken to can be seen standing on stage by her family at the beginning of the event in a video posted on the internet.

The remarks drew widespread attention from conservative media — none from the mainstream press, predictably — and spawned the hashtag #CreepyJoe on Twitter.

As noted earlier, the entire mainstream press ignored the story. Classically liberal journalist Matt Taibbi would likely not be surprised. In a post for Substack published earlier this week, he bluntly noted that the media are in love with Biden.

"Biden has the press paper-trained to a degree we haven't seen in modern times. Not even at the height of the media's drooling love affair with Barack Obama — a phenomenon I confess I was part of — did we ever see such enthusiastic, reflexive backing of White House messaging," he opined.

Meanwhile, leftists on social media responded to Friday's video by publishing photos of President Donald

Trump spending time with *his own daughter* Ivanka and arguing that these photos prove he's just as "disturbing" as Biden.

The disturbing "predatory" remarks came two days after Biden, following a private meeting with Floyd's family, including his daughter, described to the press how his interactions with her, in particular, had gone.

"The first thing she did when she ran in, she just threw her arms around me, gave me a big hug and wanted to sit in my lap," he said.

"And we spent ... she also loved the idea that ... she said, 'I'm really hungry.' She said, 'Do you have any snacks?'" the president added.

A reporter then asked, *"What did you give her?"*

"Well, my wife would kill me. We gave her some ice cream, she had

some Cheetos and I think she had some chocolate milk. I'm not sure." the president replied.

While Biden's whole career has been dogged by "sinister" and "Chester the molester" accusations, Wednesday's remarks marked the first time in a while that he'd made overtly "unsettling" remarks since taking office. Yet only two days later, he did it again.

This seems to suggest that his "creepy" behavior is here to stay for the full term of his presidency, be it four years or eight years.

In the words of Antoine Dodson, an Alabama housing project man who went viral in 2010 over the way he responded when questioned by reporters about a nearby home invasion and attempted rape, *"Hide your kids, hide your wife!"*
