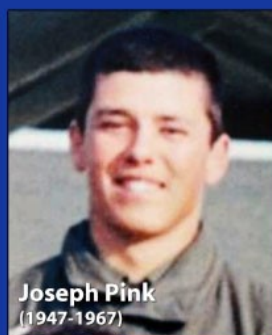

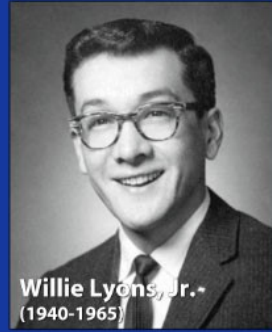

Dr. David Risling April 10, 1921 - March 13, 2005

"The Father of American Indian Education"

Dr. David Risling was a tribal member of the Hoopa Valley Tribe located in Humboldt County, in northern California.

Dr. Risling was often referred to as “The Father of American Indian Education” and rightfully so. He was an educator, tribal rights activist and tribal leader.

He was first and foremost an American Indian Warrior. In his youth he was a Golden Gloves middleweight champion and an outstanding running back during his high school years.

After serving in the United States Navy during World War II, he attended Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo where he earned a BA degree in vocational agriculture.

For 20-years, from 1950 to 1970, he taught agriculture at Modesto Junior College.

His increasing involvement in Tribal Rights issues compelled him to move to UC Davis in 1970, where he helped to develop the first Native American studies program. He remained at UC Davis until he retired in 1993, when the program became a full-fledged department.

He was a co-founder of **California Indian Legal Services**, the **Native American Rights Fund** and **California Indian Education Association**.

In 1967, Dr. Risling began meeting with like minded tribal people that believed that education was the vehicle to overcome the challenges to the U.S. Government domination of the tribal people and “Self Governance” or “Tribal Sovereignty” of which neither term was readily known or used at that time.

The ‘Grassroot Group” evolved into the **California Indian Education Association** within a couple of years and served as the catalyst for the formation of the **California Indian Legal Services** and the **Native American Rights Fund** which have served the **American Indian tribes for over 50-years**.

Dr. Risling was involved in securing passage of the federal Indian Education and Indian Tribal Community College acts.

Thirty-one American Indian community colleges and dozens of K-12 reservation school programs resulted from this legislation.

He was also a major consultant in the creation of the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian and was a three-time appointee to the National Advisory Council on Indian Education.

D-Q University The achievement he was reportedly most proud of was his role in creating D-Q University, one of the first six tribal colleges and the only one in California.

Jack D. Forbes (a co-founder of the University) has said, "*It was a dream that the late Carl Gorman and I had worked on from 1961-1962, but it was Dave's organizing skill and patience that came to the fore in 1971 when DQU finally acquired flesh and bones.*"

For many years, Dr. Risling served as President of DQU's board of trustees. Only two months before his death, he participated in the decision to close the University, which had lost its accreditation.

In the early 1990's, Risling, Jack D. Forbes, Morrison & Foerster and many others collaborated with filmmaker Jan Crull, Jr. to make a film about the controversy surrounding D-Q University and its turbulent relationship with the U.S. government.

The media had labelled this school as being "*controversial*" for years and as one of the **American Indian Movement's (AIM) Centers**, to which he didn't acknowledge because it was.

Crull was drawn to the D-Q U story from the time that he was a professional Hill staffer responsible for the shaping of a U.S. House hearing on legislation that D-Q U was seeking in 1981. He and the Risling family had

developed a rapport over the years since which ultimately led to the ***Free People, Free To Choose*** film project.

However a schism between some of the film's subjects erupted into becoming litigation.

Morrison & Foerster was the first sponsor to withdraw from the project and eventually Crull had to scrap it even though distribution for a completed film was already in place.

I first met Dr. Risling at a CIEA meeting at my own Reservation, Soboba in 1968. But it wasn't until around December 1969 that I was reintroduced to him by Mrs. Margret “Britten” Holly, a Pala tribal elder and a very well educated lady.

My problem was that I challenged the jurisdictional authority of the State of California and the County of Riverside under Public Law 280.

I ended up in jail for violation of County zoning codes and contempt of court. The court dropped the zoning codes violation and gave me a slap on the wrist for the contempt of court.

However, the challenge to the jurisdiction authority of the State and County was merged with other tribal law suits including the Pechanga case which my grandfather was instrumental in getting file while he was tribal chairman for Pechanga.

In 1976 the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in favor of the tribes, stating that P.L. 280 did not give the States or local government zoning authority over tribal lands.

However, to this day tribes are still fighting to maintain their jurisdictional rights. But, as they become more politically active in local, state and national issues change is coming.

Jurisdiction continues to be a primary concern for the tribes. And although many tribe have trained law enforcement and court systems they have still have no jurisdiction over non-Indians. Why? Because the majority of the members of congress

believe that tribal police and courts would not be fair in dealing with non-Indians.

Yes, these are the same hypocrites that shout “Racism” from the towers of congress. And although their claim is baseless no legislation has been introduced to rectify this injustice.

For the first time in history there is six American Indian elected to the House of Representatives. **Correction five** since Rep. Haaland has been appointed as the Secretary of the Interior.

Of the five, two are Democrat and three are Republican. We would hope tribal rights and issue would trump non-Indian political ideology.

However, based on my observations I find it difficult to conclude that the non-tribal political ideologies will be set aside.

Many tribal leaders understand that the American Indian Tribes do not have a substantial block vote other than in given areas of New Mexico, Arizona and Oklahoma.

However, they could make their presents known by pooling their resources and money such as in a “**Political Action Committee**.”

It was only recently that the first California American Indian was elected to the State legislator, James Ramos a tribal member of the San Manual Tribe and who was born in 1967.

Again, these are some strategies I learned some 50-years ago from my friend and mentor, David Risling a true tribal leader from the Hoopa Indian Reservation.

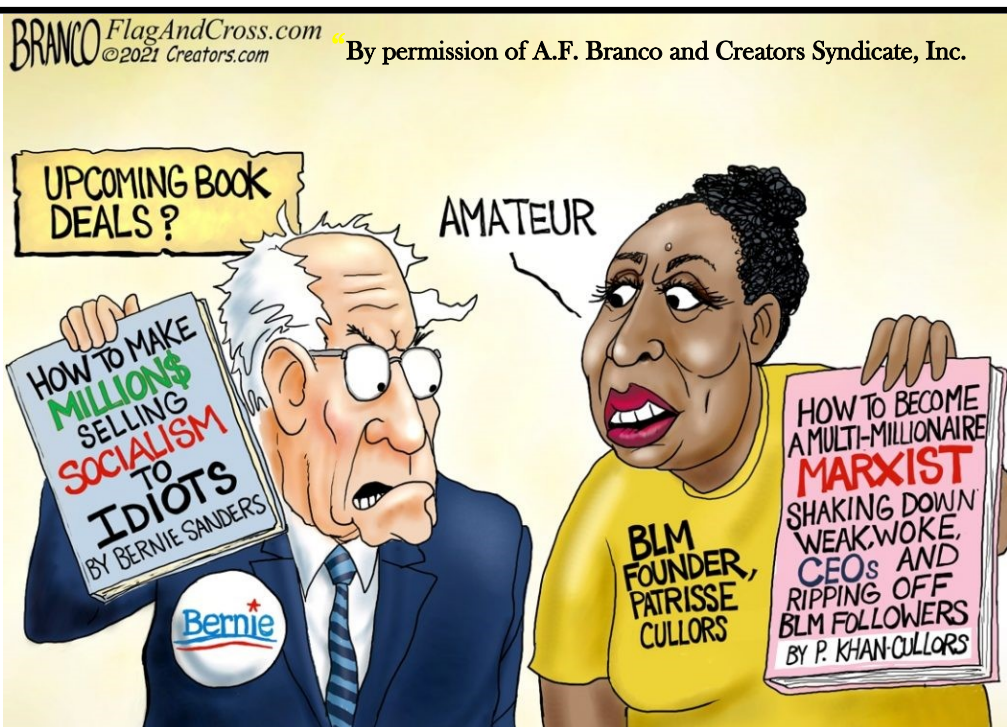

The DOJ notified the admission administration at Yale to provide the DOJ with a plan to correct the illegal admission practices.

However, Yale denied the findings of the DOJ and refused to comply.

"There is no such thing as a nice form of race discrimination," said Eric Dreiband, assistant attorney general for the department's Civil Rights Division. "Unlawfully dividing Americans into racial and ethnic blocs fosters stereotypes, bitterness, and division. It is past time for American institutions to recognize that all people should be treated with decency and respect and without unlawful regard to the color of their skin."

The DOJ added: "Yale rejects scores of Asian American and White applicants each year based on their race, whom it otherwise would admit."

However, the Biden White House ordered the Department of Justice to curb any legal action under Civil Rights Act against Yale or other Colleges and Universities. In doing so the U.S. Government is allowing racial discrimination against Whites and Asians in favor of Blacks, Hispanics and other minorities.

TOP FACEBOOK OFFICIAL; SOCIAL MEDIA COMPANIES ARE 'NOT BOUND BY THE FIRST AMENDMENT'

A top Facebook official dismissed the criticism that the social media giant violated former President Donald Trump's First Amendment rights by keeping him off the platform.

Michael McConnell, co-chairman of Facebook's Oversight Board, discussed the company's recent decision to uphold its ban on Trump for six months while the company clarifies its policy. The former president was kicked off the platform after the Jan. 6 riot at the U.S. Capitol.

"Private companies are not bound by the First Amendment," McConnell said Sunday on Fox News. **"And so, he has no First Amendment rights. He's a customer. Facebook is not a government, and he is not a citizen of Facebook."**

Trump's accounts on Facebook and Instagram were suspended indefinitely after the attack at the Capitol, which several social media giants tied to his assertions about the illegitimacy of the 2020 election. While Wednesday's (May 5, 2021) decision by the independent board kept

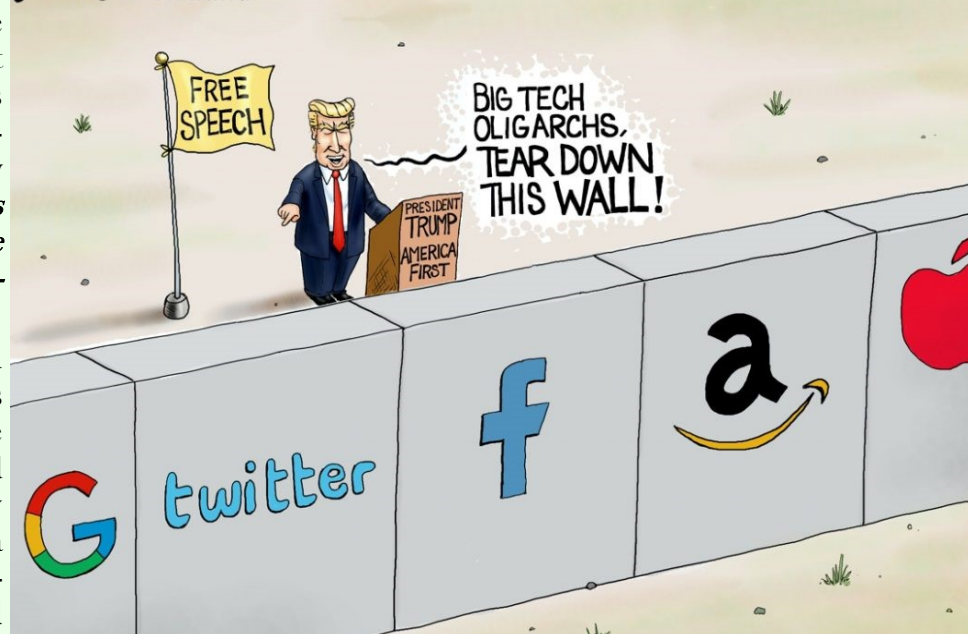
Trump's decision in tact for the time being, the former president may be allowed to reactivate his profile in six months, when Facebook will once again need to justify **"a proportionate response that is consistent with the rules that are applied to other users of its platform."**

The platform said Trump violated its content moderation standards after the former president told the rioters they were **"very special"** and that he would subsequently **"remember this day forever"** in a video posted to the platform. Facebook argued those comments had praised those engaging in violence.

Facebook also claimed Trump's **"unfounded"** claims of voter fraud related to the election had **"created an environment where a serious risk of violence was possible."**

Prior to his removal, Trump had 35 million followers on Facebook and 24 million on Instagram, which is owned by Facebook.

Following the riot, the former president was also removed by YouTube and Twitter, a platform Trump frequented to share his thoughts about political opponents and announce policy decision.

Since his ousting from major social media platforms, Trump has been using emails and media interviews to communicate with the public.

The former president created a one-way communicative platform, **"From the Desk of Donald J. Trump,"** to share his thoughts with supporters, and speculation continues to suggest that he will create an engaging social media platform that will allow users to interact in a manner more akin to Twitter or Facebook.

Special Guest Mark Macarro, Chairman of the Pechanga Band of Luiseno Indians in southern California.

Mark Trahant:

For the past year we have asked many tribal leaders about how the coronavirus has impacted their people and their economies. We've heard many stories, some familiar and others unique to the tribe. Joining us today is Mark Macarro. He's the chairman of the Pechanga Band of Luiseno Indians in southern California.

The coronavirus created several issues for tribes such as putting people on lockdown and closing tribal businesses and services. Perhaps one unexpected outcome of the pandemic is the increase in tribal enrollment.

Kalle Benallie joins the show to talk about how COVID-19 helped increase the population of the Navajo Nation.

Mark Macarro:

"Well first, our hearts go out to all our fellow Indian people from all over Indian Country. I think every nation appears to have been touched by the pandemic. And so our hearts go out to them for all our lost loved ones during this pandemic period. Just like everywhere else, I think the the pandemic has certainly had its impact in Southern California and even with our tribe. I also want to tie this into something historical because for our people, this is probably the third pandemic that I think we have dealt with since the late 17 hundreds."

"Certainly the first was with father Serra and the onset of the missions. And when he created the mission system in Southern California, and the one that impacted my tribe the most. We didn't have immunity to what they brought and suffered probably a 90 percent population loss at that point in time. I can tell you the thought of a pandemic, bearing its head over a year ago, such as it did. It was certainly a frightening prospect.

But the second time was the influenza of 1918, which also affected our people tremendously and in a very rapid way."

"So the spacing is just long enough for everybody to almost forget that these things have happened, unfortunately. And so I will say that our community without going into any numbers or anything, our community has certainly felt the direct impact of COVID. And it's been sudden it's been tragic and it's been something that I think we've all pulled together around and try to find new and safer ways of doing things as well."

Federal Judge Breaks Silence on Far Left Wing Controlled Propaganda

Federal Judge Laurence Silberman dared to break the liberal Omerta of the D.C. Circuit for the Court of Appeals to slap down the far-left network media. He actually called the well oiled propaganda mills “a threat to a viable democracy.” The cancel of conservative thought must end or we’re doomed. *“The first step taken by any potential authoritarian or dictatorial regime is to gain control of communications, particularly the delivery of news,”* Silberman warns. 1984 is here at last and the surveillance microphone can have a pizza delivered.

You know things are getting out of hand when even progressives notice that *“control of major media by one political party is a dangerous threat to the country.”*

Judge Silberman was talking right to CNN when he “warned in a blistering dissent” that it’s time for courts to strip the shield of protection from libel laws which allow the propaganda mills to get away with pumping out fake news.

“It should be borne in mind that the first step taken by any potential authoritarian or dictatorial regime is to gain control of communications, particularly the delivery of news,” Judge Silberman wrote. *“It is fair to conclude, therefore, that one-party control of the press and media is a threat to a viable democracy.”*

He has had enough of the precedents set by New York Times v. Sullivan and wants to take a hard look at the principles behind it. That’s the case which *“shaped press law in favor of media outlets for more than five decades.”*

Because of Sullivan, The New York Times and the Washington Post *“are virtually Democratic Party broadsheets. And the news section of The Wall Street Journal leans in the same direction,”* the judge declared on Friday. Don’t even get him started on AP.

“That orientation also controls the Associated Press and most large papers in the country, including the Los Angeles Times, Miami Herald, and Boston Globe.” In fact, Silberman adds,

“nearly all television—network and cable—is a Democratic Party trumpet.” All liberal, all the time, 24/7 and even Faux News is unfair and imbalanced these days.

Judge Silberman is convinced that Silicon Valley has “enormous influence” over how news gets distributed and it *“similarly filters news delivery in ways favorable to the Democratic Party.”*

He was especially upset about the Hunter Biden laptop coverup. He used his dissent to highlight *“the shocking suppression of stories about Joe Biden and his family when he was running for president.”*

“Any media outlet who dared to report accurately about the Biden family’s dealing with foreign entities faced total censorship on Twitter and Facebook.” The Judge was horrified at the way *“Twitter suspended users, including White House press secretary Kayleigh McEnany, for merely sharing accurate information.”*

Not only that, they even *“prevented people from sharing the information privately on its platform.”* Over at Facebook, Mark Zuckerberg promised to *“censor coverage of the Biden family corruption pending a ‘fact-check,’ an unprecedented privilege given to Biden in the closing days of one of the closest presidential elections in history.”*

Silberman issues a stark warning that *“it should be sobering for those concerned about news bias that these institutions are controlled by a single man and his son.”* Just last week, a New York Supreme Court judge *“ruled against The New York Times’ effort to get a defamation suit against it dismissed.”*

That’s bad news for the Times. *“Its reporters were inserting opinion into news stories,”* but *“opinions are not actionable for defamation.”* That judge didn’t buy it either. He *“critiqued the blending of news and opinion in purported news stories.”*

Earlier this week 124 retired generals and admirals posted an open letter questioning the legitimacy of the 2020 election results and President Joe Biden’s mental and physical health.

The letter added that the FBI and Supreme Court *“must act swiftly when election irregularities are surfaced and not ignore them as was done in 2020.”*

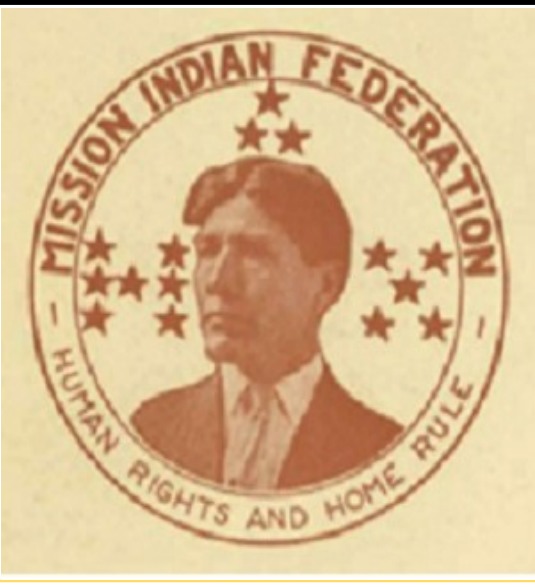
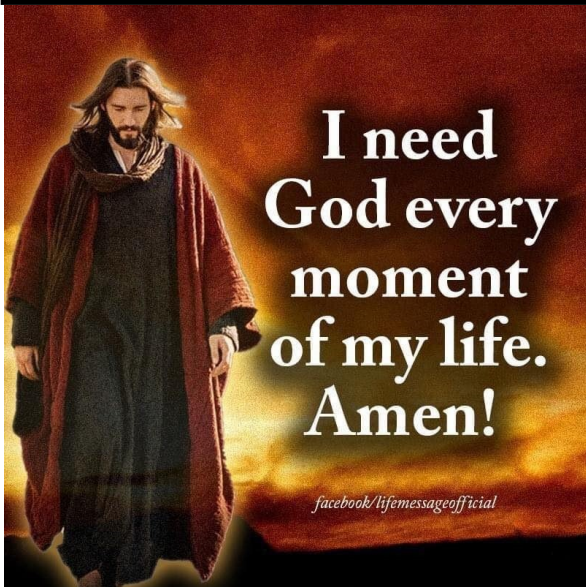
