## **Gavin Newsom is 'Incredibly Proud' of Biden leaving Californians to be captured and killed in Afghanistan**

Gavin Newsom, the silver-spoon governor who faces a recall election next month, has come out in defense of Joe Biden after his disastrous execution of the U.S. evacuation from Afghanistan.

The California Democrat said what he did not have to and should not have - that he was "incredibly proud" of the president's job giving back the fruits of 20 years of American effort to the Taliban. He then ignored a question from a reporter who asked about Biden backing off of the campaign trail.

Our abandonment of Afghanistan and our allies has global implications, but California bears a crucial burden - five of the 13 American servicemembers killed by the terrorist attack in Kabul hailed from the Golden State.

Two of them were not yet born when the U.S. initially invaded after 9/11. The five were Marines Nicole Gee, Hunter Lopez, Dylan Merola, and Kareem Nikou and Navy Hospital man Maxton Soviak.

Even though Biden quit the evacuation on Monday, before any deadline, his administration admits that some 250 Americans remain in the country. In spite of the State Department's downward revision (by more than 50%) of the number of Americans left in Kabul, the real figure is po- longer an avenue."

Hunter Lopez, who graduated from La Quinta High in 2017, had participated in the department's Sheriff's Explorer Program for three years before joining the Marine Corps in September 2017, Sheriff Chad Bianco said.

"When I was his age, I had the same dream of joining the Marines," said Julian Valles, a Marine Corps veteran and close friend of Lopez. "And I remember when I met Hunter when he was 11 years old and he had that same dream."

Valles was not close to Lopez growing up, he said, but the pair quickly bonded through a mutual friend in the five months leading up to his deployment. The group of friends would often workout together, go to the shooting range and talk about their goals in lif"Hunter had a way of pushing his friends," Valles said. "He would ask what your goals are, and you would tell him and he would say 'OK, then what?" "I told him I wanted to be a nurse," he said. "And he kept pushing me for what was next, and I ended up with the goal of becoming a flight nurse."

That drive, he said, was emulated in Lopez' own life too. Bianco said Lopez planned to follow in his parents' footsteps and become a Riverside County Sheriff's Deputy after his deployment.

Lance Cpl. Rylee McCollum, of Bondurant, Wyoming, was married and his wife is expecting a baby in three weeks, his sister, Cheyenne McCollum, said.

"He was so excited to be a dad, and he was going to be a great dad," McCollum said. She said

her brother "was a Marine before he knew he was allowed to be a Marine.

"He'd carry around his toy rifle and wear his sister's pink princess snow boots and he'd either be hunting or he was a Marine."

McCollum said her brother wanted to be a history teacher and a wrestling coach once he complet-

A week before she was killed, Sgt. Nicole Gee cradled a baby in her arms at the Kabul airport. She posted the photo on Instagram and wrote, "I love my job."

Gee, 23, of Roseville, just north of the Sacramento area, was a maintenance technician with the 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit from Camp Lejeune in North Carolina.

Sgt. Mallory Harrison, who lived with Gee for three years, wrote about the magnitude of her loss.

"I can't quite describe the feeling I get when I force myself to come back to reality and think about how I'm never going to see her again," Harrison wrote on Facebook. "How her last breath was taken doing what she loved – helping people. ... Then there was an explosion. And just like that, she's gone."

Gee's car was still parked in a lot at Camp Lejeune and Harrison mused about all the Marines who walked past it while she was overseas.

"Some of them knew her. Some of them didn't." she said. "They all walked past it. The war stories, the losses, the flag-draped coffins, the KIA bracelets and the heartbreak. It's not so distant anymore."

Lance Cpl. Dylan R. Merola, of Rancho Cucamonga, was a graduate of Los Osos High School. On Friday, students there honored him during the school's first foot-

ball game of the season by wearing red, white and blue.

"Dylan's heroism, selfless courage and ultimate sacrifice will never be forgotten," Chaffey Joint Union Superintendent Mat Holton wrote in a statement Saturday. "He joined the Marines because he wanted to make a difference, and in the end stood side-by-side with his fellow soldiers in helping more than 100,000 people evacuate one of the most dangerous places in the world."

Merola worked as a theater technician during his years at Los Osos, Holton wrote, and was "one of the kindest students ever to call Los Osos home."

Merola's mother, Cheryl, told CBS2 her son had been in Kabul for less than two weeks and was planning to go to college and study engineering. "He was one of the best kids ever," she told the news channel. "Kind. Loving. Giving to every single person. He would give anything for anybody."

#### Johanny Rosario Pichardo, 25



Sgt. Johanny Rosario Pichardo was being mourned in the Massachusetts mill town of Lawrence she called home. Her birthplace was in the Dominican Republic.

"We will not allow her to be forgotten," said Jaime Melen-

dez, director of veterans services in Lawrence, where Rosario attended high school. Rosario served with the Naval Amphibious Force, Task Force 51/5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade, which praised her work as supply chief this spring.

#### Deagan William-Tyeler Page, 23



Cpl. Daegan William-Tyeler Page planned to go to trade school and possibly become a lineman after his enlistment ended, his family said in a statement. Page was raised in Red Oak, Iowa, and in the Omaha area and joined the Marines

after graduating from Millard South High School. He is mourned by his girlfriend, parents, stepmom and stepdad, four siblings and grandparents, the family statement said.

"Daegan will always be remembered for his tough outer shell and giant heart," the statement said. "Our hearts are broken, but we are thankful for the friends and family who are surrounding us during this time."

Family friend Paul Arreola said the videos show "the heart of this young man, the love he has."

Nikoui was also in the JROTC, and the Norco High School Air Force JROTC posted on Facebook that he was "one of our best Air Force JROTC cadets" and that "Kareem was set on being a Marine and always wanted to serve his country."

"When that child was little, he wanted to be a Marine. That's all he talked about," Yvette Nikoui-Smith, his aunt, said when reached Saturday. "He liked people, and he loved helping people.""

He's amazing – they're all amazing – and I'm really broken for everybody who's lost somebody over there," Nikoui-Smith said. "It's a really crushing loss, because they're all so young."

## Pascal Cleatus Poolaw, Sr., Kiowa: The most decorated American Indian soldier in U.S. history

First Sergeant Poolaw's a full blooded Kiowa, was born on January 22, 1922 in Apache, Oklahoma.

Poolaw served in World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War and was awarded 42 medals which included 4-Silver Stars., 5-Bronze Stars, 2-Distinguished Service Crosses, 3-Purple Hearts

He died on the battlefield in the Republic of Vietnam on 7 November 1967, while on a "Search and Destroy mission" near Loc Ninh. He was serving with Company C, 26th Infantry Regiment, 1st Infantry Division. It should be noted that in the ferocious fighting at the Battle of Loc Ninh where he posthumously awarded the Congressional Meda1 Medal of Honor.

In 1942, Poolaw, his father, and his two brothers joined the armed forces. While serving with the 8th Infantry Regiment's M Company near Recogne, Belgium on September 8, 1944, he earned his first Purple Heart and Silver Star.

On that day, Poolaw's unit was engaging fire with the Germans. He pushed his company forward while facing heavy machine gun fire for give minutes as he hurled hand grenades, causing numerous enemy casualties.

Poolaw's military career did not end in Belgium or with the Germans. During the Korean War, Poolaw saw combat and was wounded again and awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, a second Purple Heart and two more Silver Stars.

His first Silver Star for that war was for his heroic actions on September 1950 when his company met still enemy resistance.

The second Silver Star during this war came on April 4, 1951 near Chongong-ni where Poolaw and his platoon was pinned down by a automatic weapons and mortar barrage.

He exposed himself to the enemy and slowly advanced across the open terrain, firing his weapon as he went. By keeping the North Koreans' eyes on him, his platoon maneuvered to a better position and were able to carry on the mission at hand.
