Democratic gubernatorial candidate Stacey Abrams is defending remarks she made over the weekend that Georgia is the “worst state in the country to live,” referring to its poor rankings in maternal mortality and incarceration rates, among other issues.

Abrams's remarks drew instant rebukes from her Republican rivals. One, former Sen. David Perdue, used her comments as a point of departure to accuse her of "demeaning her own race."

Abrams made the comments in question at a fundraising dinner for Gwinnett County Democrats outside Atlanta when she pushed back on Republican Gov. Brian

Kemp’s frequent boasts about Georgia being ranked the best state in the country for business.

*“I am tired of hearing about being the best state in the country to do business when we are the worst state in the country to live,”* Abrams, who is expected to formally receive her party’s nomination for governor in Georgia’s primary, said Saturday in remarks that received extended applause.

*“Now, somebody’s going to try to Politifact me on this — let me contextualize,”* Abrams continued. *“When you’re No. 48 for mental health, when you’re No. 1 for maternal mortality, when you have an incarceration rate that’s on the rise and wages that are on the decline, then you are not the No. 1 place to live in the United States. But we can get there. You see, Georgia is capable of greatness. We just need greatness to be in our governor’s office.”*

Both Kemp and Perdue criticized Abrams for her comments.

Perdue made his response racial during an afternoon interview with John Fredericks, a conservative radio show host who bills himself as "America's Godzilla of Truth."

### FOX News National School Board Association: Parents' actions should be examined under the PATRIOT Act as "Domestic Terrorists."



The NSBA had originally sent a letter to President Biden in September 2021 that asked for parents protesting at school board meetings to be federally looked into, saying school officials were facing threats and violence at meetings. Most significantly the NSBA requested in its original letter that parents' actions should be examined under the PATRIOT Act as "domestic terrorists."

Then, on Oct. 4, 2022 Attorney General Merrick Garland issued a memorandum instructing the FBI to collaborate with state and local leaders to address "threats against school administrators, board members, teachers, and staff." He went on to say that this collaboration "will open dedicated lines of communication for threat reporting, assessment, and response."

Early demands from the National School Boards Association to the White House included calling for the deployment of the Army National Guard and military police to monitor school board meetings, according to an early draft letter

the organization's independent review released Friday, May 20, 2022.

In contrast to the final version, the draft of the NSBA letter said, *"We ask that the Army National Guard and its Military Police be deployed to certain school districts and related events where students and school personnel have been subjected to acts and threats of violence."*

The NSBA's early draft also called parents speaking out *"plotters who are targeting schools and educators."*

Another removed portion cast doubt on whether critical race theory is being taught in schools. It said, *"An increasing number of public school officials is facing physical threats because of propaganda purporting the inclusion of critical race theory within classroom instruction and curricula."*

The independent review also showed the collaboration between the NSBA, the White House and the DOJ as well as internal responses to the swift blow back.

Despite the Declaration of Independence describing the indigenous people of Turtle Island as "Merciless Indian Savages," it might surprise many to know that much of the U.S. Constitution was inspired by the "Great League of Peace" founded by the Iroquois

Confederacy. The Iroquois Confederacy is the oldest living participatory democracy on earth. It initially united five nations: the Mohawks, the Onondaga, the Cayuga, the Oneida, and the Seneca. Over 300 years later, the Tuscarora nation joined the Iroquois, and the six nations formed a multi-state government while maintaining their separate governance.

In October 1998, Congress passed a resolution (H.Con.Res.331) acknowledging the influence of the Iroquois Confederacy on the U.S. Constitution.

Ben Franklin met with Colonial and Iroquois leaders in 1754 to discuss how the colonies might govern

themselves. During that meeting, a Mohawk chief showed them the strength of the Iroquois Confederacy by holding up one arrow and breaking it. He then held up five arrows tied together and showed that they could not be broken because of the combined power, just like the Confederacy.

After the U.S. was established, Franklin replaced the original imperial eagle with the bald eagle on the U.S. seal to represent the Iroquois Confederacy. He added 13 arrows to symbolize the strength of the colonies together in unity.

Saul Alinsky: "8-steps to

## Oklahoma Gov. Stitt signs bill requiring students to use bathrooms aligned with their biological sex at birth

Oklahoma Republican Gov. Kevin Stitt, Tribal Citizen of the Cherokee Nation



Oklahoma Republican Gov. Kevin Stitt says the measure he signed into law on Wednesday, May 25, 2022 that requires students in schools across the state to use restrooms that align with their biological sex at birth is "common sense" and that it is "kind of crazy" that the law had to be passed in the first place.

The legislation, Senate Bill 615, now applies to students in pre-K to 12th grade at public and public charter schools in the state. In addition to bathrooms, the new law also requires students to use locker rooms that align with their biological sex at birth.

The bill, which successfully passed through the Oklahoma state legislature last week, calls for schools to "provide a

reasonable accommodation to any individual who does not wish to comply" with the new law. That accommodation, according to the measure, is "access to a single-occupancy restroom or changing room."

"It's common sense," Stitt told Fox News Digital as he described the law during an interview. "It's kind of crazy that we have to pass laws like this nowadays, but it just simply says we're gonna protect girls. Girls are going to go to girls bathrooms, boys are going to go to boys bathrooms, and that's gonna be law for children K through 12 in Oklahoma. We'll have a third, single-use, single-person bathroom for anyone who maybe doesn't, you know, wanna use any one of those bathrooms — which is fine."

"We've heard from parents, we've heard from families, we've heard from little girls, they're not going to be comfortable sharing a bathroom with boys throughout school," he added.

Asked about what safety this provides for those who have raised concern about sharing bathrooms with transgender students, Stitt reiterated that it is "common sense" and insisted that during his tenure as governor he will not allow boys to expose themselves to little girls in school bathrooms or locker rooms.

"We're not attacking anybody," Stitt said. "We're just simply protecting our young ladies and our young people."

"We think that, with kids of my own, I've got three daughters and I've got three sons, there's a difference between boys and girls," he said. "We're going to protect the innocence of our young people. That's something that's the parents decision, but I'm not going to let a boy expose himself to a little girl in the bathroom or share a bathroom with the opposite sex."

Discussing potential backlash he may receive over the new law, Stitt said those who are opposed to the law can "argue with me and we can have a disagreement."

"I represent four million Oklahomans, it's overwhelmingly passed the House

and the Senate that are elected by folks all over the state," he added. "I'm elected overwhelmingly by Oklahomans to put my values in bill signing and different boards and commissions and the conservative view that I have. I'm the same person that ran and was elected..."

"Are there some fringe, out-of-touch, socialist Democrats that want something different? Maybe so. But I don't think that represents the Oklahoma that I grew up in and I'm a fourth generation Oklahoman," he added.

Earlier this year, Stitt signed into law the "Save Women's Sports Act," which prevents transgender girls and women from competing on female sports teams.

Stitt said he has spoken with several residents throughout the state who have voiced their support for the measure and thanked him for "standing up for what's right" and for "not being pushed around by just a very small, vocal minority."

The law states that non-compliant school districts could lose 5% of their state funding and also provides parents and legal guardians with an opportunity to file civil lawsuits against school districts who are in violation. Those lawsuits will be investigated by the Oklahoma State School Board.



## Whitewashing The Truth: Why Is The CDC Dancing Around Who Is Really At Risk For Monkeypox?

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention officials said that although anyone can catch or spread the monkeypox virus, the "handful" of cases in the United States did not pose a risk to the larger population. They did not say that those infected are predominantly gay men who participated in deviant sexual behavior, although they did say LGBTQ members had a higher risk factor.

Unlike AIDS, which hit the gay community hard in the 1980s and '90s, Monkeypox is not deadly, however, it is a disease that is transmitted through direct physical contact, in most cases it has been sexual contact between two men.

But the CDC is going out of their way to not stigmatize gay men, widely seen as a nod to progressive activists who have called on the CDC to not label this a sexually transmitted disease.

The fact is, if the CDC was blunt in the 1980's perhaps less people would have become afflicted with the disease. In 2022, there is no reason to not simply come clean and say sexual deviance has consequences, and monkeypox is one of them.



Dancing around the issue, a CDC representative gave a very carefully worded statement. "In terms of a public health concern, only a handful of cases are being seen in the United States right now," Capt. Jennifer McQuiston, a veterinarian and deputy director in the CDC Division of High Consequence Pathogens and Pathology, said during a conference call with reporters.

"We are typically surveillance on them and trying to track them to be sure we are capturing cases, but the case count is low now. I don't think there is a great risk to the general community from monkeypox."

McQuiston said there was one confirmed case of monkeypox in Massachusetts, four other possible cases in New York, Florida, and two in Utah, which are men who traveled internationally. All of the suspected cases are with members of the LGBTQ+ community and in Europe, it is known that several of the infected participated in a multi-sexual group sex party.

CDC Epidemiologist Dr. John Brooks said the cases spreading around the globe seem to be especially among gay men. Others with extended physical contact also could get and spread the disease.

According to the World Health Organization, "monkeypox virus is transmitted from one person to another by close contact with lesions, body fluids, respiratory droplets, and contaminated materials such as bedding. The incubation period of monkeypox is usually from 6 to 13 days but can range from 5 to 21 days."

The zoological virus is from the same family as smallpox, known as orthopox-virus. It is spread from an animal, like a rodent transmitting to a human, and then spreading through the humans.

McQuiston said the outbreak being observed was from a milder West African strain of the virus circulating for the last few years in that region.

McQuiston also said the virus was not something people would likely contract from casual contacts, such as passing someone in a grocery store aisle.

People developing a rash after a fever were advised to isolate themselves for up to 14 days to prevent spreading the virus to others in their families, Brooks said. McQuiston also said the U.S. had a previous outbreak of monkeypox in 2003.

# Congressional Medal of Honor America Indians Recipients

Memorial Day and D-Day have special meanings: **Me-morial Day** because it is the day we pay our respects to all the veterans that were killed in action and to those that have passed on.

And **D-Day** has a special meaning to me because my dad, Ernest Salgado, Sr. and Sam Powvall from the Pau-ma Indian Reservation were together on June 6, 1944 for the invasion of Normandy, France then later on to the **“Battle of the Bulge”** and on into Berlin, Germany.

Memorial Day and D-Day are only days apart and many American patriots view them as one. We often hear of the 'greatest generation' in reference to Memorial Day on May 29 dating back to the civil war and D-Day in reference to the WW II military invasion of Normandy, France on June 6, 1944 that let to the occupation of Berlin, Germany and the end of WWII.

Even less notice is the contributions of the American Indian Warriors courage and commitment in the many military conflicts of the Nation over the 246 PLUS-years.

Why is this? Especially since American Indians have voluntarily participated in every military effort to establish and defend this land and people for all America.

The American Indians courage and achievements examples from both theaters of WW II is well documented but too often historically ignored.

Over 2,000 American Indians from Oklahoma and New Mexico trained and fought as part of the 45th Infantry Division known as the **"Thunderbirds"**. They saw almost two years of combat in Italy and Central Europe.

During the second World War, the U.S. military recruited American Indian from several different Tribes from trough out the country for their unique tribal 1st languages for usage as a battlefield code.

Although many American Indian Tribes were **“Code Talker,”** such as the Assiniboiné, Choctaw, Cherokee, Comanche, Meskwaki, and Seminole to name a few the Navajo **“Code Talkers”** became the most celebrated and publicized of the radio units. They were assigned to the U.S. Marines Corps.



Six American Indians were awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor in recognition for their bravery and

many other distinguished themselves as well.

The six Congressional Medal of Honor recipient were: Lt. Ernest Childers Lt. Jack Montgomery, Lt. Van Barfoot, John Resse Jr., Ron Harmon and Ernest Edwin Evens.



**Lt. Ernest Childers (Creek)**, was born February 1, 1918 in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, A Muscogee (Creek), he graduated from the Chilocco Indian Agricultural School in north-central Oklahoma. ***He was the first American Indian to earn the Medal of Honor since the Indian Wars of the 19th century.***

He first distinguished himself in Sicily, Italy where he was awarded a battlefield commission. Later in Italy, unaided and despite severe wounds, he destroyed three German machine gun emplacements.

Childers reached the rank of lieutenant Colonel before retiring from the Army in 1966. He died at age 87 and was buried at Floral Haven Memorial Gardens in his birthplace of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma.



**First Lt. Jack Montgomery (Cherokee)**,

Lt. Jack C. Montgomery, who also earned the Medal of Honor in World War II for service in Italy, graduated from same school as Childers, the Chilocco Indian Agricultural School in north-central Oklahoma.

During the Anzio, Italy military Campaign he single-handedly attacked a German stronghold killing eleven of the enemy and taking thirty-three prisoners. *Lt. Jack Montgomery graduated from the University of Redlands, California.*

**Pfc. John Resse Jr. (Comanche)** was from Pryor, Oklahoma. On February 9, 1945 he was serving as a private first class in the Philippines. when an attack on the Paco Railroad Station hit and Reese and fellow soldier Private Cleto L. Ro-



driguez went ahead of their unit, took a position closer to the station, and began firing on the Japanese defenders. Together they killed over eighty Japanese soldiers before a shortage of ammunition forced them to turn back. Reese was killed while trying to return to the American lines; he was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor eight months later, on October 19, 1945. Private Rodriguez survived the battle and was also awarded the Medal of Honor



**Coronel Van Barfoot (Choctaw)**, was also at the Anzio Campaign in Italy where he knocked out two machine gun nests and captured seventeen prisoners. He then went on to defeat three German tanks and carried two of his wounded men to safety. All of these exploits reinforced the "warrior" image.

Barfoot had been awarded a combat field commission prior to his action in Italy. He went on to serve in Korea and Vietnam and retired as a Coronel.

After his retirement from the military he moved to a retirement community in Henrico County, Virginia to be near his daughter.

In mid 2009, the homeowners' association (HOA) of the Sussex Square, where Barfoot lived ordered him to remove the flagpole from which he flew the U.S. flag.

The HOA bylaws didn't forbid flagpoles, but the HOA ruled Barfoot, then aged 90, would not be allowed to use it ***"for aesthetic reasons."***

Barfoot contested the order, and received support from politicians, including Virginia Senators Mark Warner and Jim Webb, White House Press Secretary Robert Gibbs and Hannity at Fox news.

The HOA dropped its request on December 8, 2009

**Sergeant Ron W. Harmon ( Creek)** joined the Army on from his home town in Pixley, California. On July 1, 1944, he was serving as a Sergeant in Company C, 362nd Infantry Regiment, 91st Infantry Division.

On that day, near Casaglia, Italy he single-handedly attacked three German posi-



tions which were firing on a friendly platoon.

He destroyed one position and despite being wounded on his approach, continued to silence another. He was killed while attacking the third position.

He was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor a year later on October 2, 1945. Harmon was buried at the Florence American Cemetery in Florence, Italy.

**Comdr. Ernest E. Evens (Cherokee/Creek)** was born in Pawnee, Oklahoma. He graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1931.



In 1941 he was assigned to the destroyer Alden, and was serving on her in the East Indies when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941.

He became commanding officer of Alden on March 14, 1942, and held that position until July 7, 1943. While serving on Alden he participated in operations in and around Australia, New Guinea and the Dutch East Indies.

On October 25, 1944 as commanding officer of the U.S.S. Johnston, against major units of the Japanese fleet during the battle off Samar he was first to lay a smokescreen and to open fire on a vastly superior forces in number, firepower and armor as they rapidly approached.

Comdr. Evans gallantly diverted the powerful blasts of hostile guns from the lightly armed and armored carriers under his protection, launching the first torpedo attack when the Johnston



came under straddling Japanese shellfire.

Undaunted by damage sustained under the terrific volume of fire, he unhesitatingly joined others of his group to provide fire support during subsequent torpedo attacks against the Japanese. Outshooting and outmaneuvering the enemy as he consistently interposed his vessel between the hostile fleet units and our carriers despite the crippling loss of engine power and communications with steering aft, shifted command to the fantail, shouted steering orders through an open hatch to men turning the rudder by hand and battled furiously until the Johnston, burning and shuddering from a mortal blow, lay dead in the water after 3 hours of fierce combat.

Seriously wounded early in the engagement, Comdr. Evans, by his indomitable courage and brilliant professional skill, aided materially in turning back the enemy during a critical phase of the action.

His valiant fighting spirit throughout this historic battle was beyond the Call of Duty and will venture as an inspiration to all who served with him.

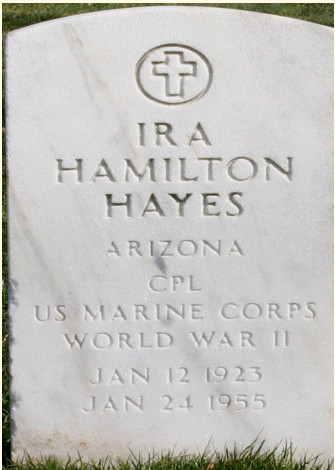
He was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor.

**IRA HAYES AMERICAN INDIAN ICON HERO**

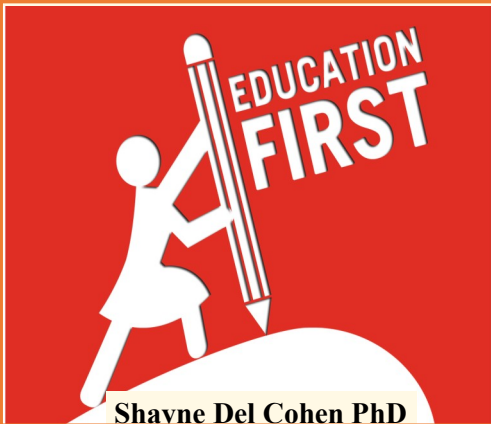


Ira Hayes (Pima) became the face of the American Indian serving in the U.S. military during WW II when the icon Flag Razing photo in which he was pictured went viral.

Lumberjacks, Mail Sorter, Patternmakers, Metal Pourers and Casters, Watch Repairers, Coal Miner, Taxi Driver, Surveyors and Mapping Technicians, Parking Enforcement, Prepress Technician, Restaurant Server, Referee, Herders and Wranglers, Elevator Operator, Air Traffic Controller, Travel Agent, Mortgage Brokers, Bookkeeper, Lawyer, Broadcasters, Middle Managers, Casino Cashier, IT Support, Financial Planners, Floral Designers, Postal Workers, Photo Processor, Data Entry Clerks, Farmer, Fast Food Cook, Newspaper Reporter, Jeweler, Textile Machine Workers, Furniture Finisher, Door-To-Door Salespeople, Print Binding and Finishing Workers, Detective, Routine Architect, Primary Care Physicians, Detective.

Many of the functions within the occupations listed above will be or are being replaced by computer functions, algorithms, and robots. Some may wail; some may celebrate another opportunity

to lessen their labor. But it will not cause massive unemployment in small economies; each one of those functions will require a programmer as well as a “fix-it” person for wither software or hardware. **How many persons in your labor pool or still in high school have those skills?**

The Bureau of Labor Statistics relates *“Employment of network and computer systems administrators is projected to grow 6 percent by 2026, about as fast as the average for all occupations.”* Persons “administering client servers may do it remotely.

**But restaurant consulting firm Aaron Allen & Associates said** more than 80 percent of all positions in the industry **could be automated**, and of those, 37 percent of wait staff will be affected.

**Video, drones and other technologies will allow farmers/ranchers** to monitor stock/fence lines/ produce higher yields from less land/etc., reducing the need for buckaroos of the past but the world will still need to eat, utilize fiber, and develop new crops, so farming will remain a widespread and necessary profession.

With a new look at domestic manufacturing those that are machinist will see a 12.9 percent increase in the number of available jobs as lathes, milling machines and grinders will be back in fashion.

Many skills from “**exiting**” occupations are transferable. Those with visual design, highly prize by floral designers, can be transferred to interior design, merchandise display, etc.

**Since no one will read copy without a picture within the article/manuscript**, portrait and commercial photographers will be in demand by business and advertising firms, to say nothing of newspaper stringers. Gone will be the processing skills as digital cameras send digital signals straight to the copy desk, altho some enhancement/manipulation may be employed.

**“Doctors, Lawyers and Indians Chiefs”**. Some would say one of those categories could be eliminated but there will always be the need. Routine diagnostics, initial case review/research, may lighten a load, but the necessity for compassionate leadership in maintaining/restoring physical health, assert/

maintain legal status and rights and ensuring a community is safe, secure, sustainable and sovereign will never go away.

**The field/practice may change**, new skills will be needed, different paths toward certification evolve, but human interactions will not.

**The list is endless** and does not address emergent trends but you get the idea.

**And by the way**, below is a listing of “the most dangerous jobs in America”

## Wearing Native American regalia kept Illinois high school American Indian student from grad walk

An Illinois high school American Indian senior was denied the opportunity to walk with his graduating class because he refused to remove a beaded cap and feather representing his Native American heritage. **NimkiCurleyi** , a 17-year-old senior at **Evanston Township High School**, planned to graduate on May 22, wearing his graduation cap adorned with Native beads and an eagle feather, WLS reported.

**Instead**, he was pulled out of line and sat in the stands with his family while his classmates crossed the stage.

*“They wanted him to put on a plain one and he said nope not walking then,”* his mother, Megan Bang, wrote on Twitter. *“I’m so proud of him and furious at the same time.”*

Curley told WLS that his beaded cap was not for decoration to spice up typical graduation regalia.

*“It’s not just, like, a decorative thing,”* he told the news outlet. *“It’s a religious belief to hold these feathers sacred.”*

According to the school about 15 miles north of Chicago, administrators have “**consistently shared**” that adornment on caps is not allowed during graduation.

*“Two people pulled him out and started yelling at him,”* Bang wrote in another tweet. *“...Trying to convince him. Both my daughters cried watching this unfold.”*

However, Curley told WLS that the principal hand-delivered his diploma and apologized for the incident.

Evanston Township High School District 202 confirmed to McClatchy News that the district had apologized for the senior’s graduation experience and added that it is *“taking the opportunity to examine our past practices.”*

*“ETHS is reviewing the graduation guidelines, particularly as they relate to acknowledging the history and stories of indigenous students, and we will let students and families know when*



*there are changes in the future,”* the district said in a statement.

**The family has started a petition** for the district to change its policies. As of the afternoon of May 24, 2022 the petition received more than 10,000 signatures.

Curley plans to attend the University of Wisconsin to study Environmental Engineering.

**EDITORS NOTE:** Is it irony, racism or a complete failure to recognize the individual person, and/or the religious and cultural rights of the American Indian?

**The irony** is that the issue of American Indian students graduating high school has been resolved in almost every state in the Union, but I guess Evanston Township High School District 202 didn’t get the memo.

**Then again**, I don’t think it has anything to do with Nimkii Curley’s American Indian regalia. The school’s policy of “**consistently shared that adornment on caps is not allowed,**” yet suable, but clear that collectivism trumps individualism.

**From news reports it appears that Nimkii Curley’s** academic status is good and he has plans to attend the University of Wisconsin.

At age 17 he is a man in Indian world and for him to stand up for what he believes is right tells me we will be hearing from him again.

## US Senator, Marsha Blackburn (R) Tennessee censored by Facebook for post about men competing in women’s sports, calls it ‘Hate Speech’

Tennessee Sen. Marsha Blackburn, a Republican, was censored by Facebook after she published a post this week that pithily stated that *“Biological men have no place in women’s sports.”*

Published to Blackburn’s personal Facebook page, the post wound up being removed by Facebook on the grounds that it didn’t follow the social media network’s widely criticized *“Community Standards on hate speech.”*

The senator was not pleased by this act of censorship.

*“Big Tech and the Democrats are colluding to radically transform America. They want to silence and censor conservatives for speaking out against their woke agenda. It does not take a biologist to know the difference between a man and a woman, and I will not be silenced or threatened by Silicon Valley oligarchs. Biological men have no place in women sports,”* she said in a statement to Fox News.

While the precise motivation behind Blackburn’s post remains unknown, she published it exactly a day after a female skateboarder who lost a Red Bull-sponsored competition to a biological male spoke out about the unfairness of the loss.

In an Instagram post, skateboarder Taylor Silverman revealed that thanks to Red Bull allowing a biological male to compete in its latest Red Bull Cornerstone contest, she and her female

peers were denied the prestige and money they’d earned.

*“My name is Taylor Silverman. I am a female athlete. I have been skateboarding for eleven years and competing for several years. I have been in three different contests with trans women, two of which I placed second. At the last contest series I did for Redbull, I placed second,”* she wrote.

*“The trans competitor who won took \$1000 in qualifiers, \$3000 in finals, and \$1000 in best trick. This totaled to \$5000 of the prize money meant for the female athletes. I took \$1000 in qualifiers and \$1750 for second place, so \$2750 in total. The girl who took third received \$750. The girl who deserved \$1000 for best trick took nothing along with whoever would have placed third.”*

She concluded the post by saying that she’d deserved to place first and be paid accordingly. She also revealed that she’d tried to reach out to Red Bull, but to no avail.

*“I deserved to place first, be acknowledged for my win, and get paid. I reached out to Redbull and was ignored. I am sick of being bullied into silence,”* she wrote.

While it’s true that Blackburn has long been an outspoken advocate of protecting women’s sports, the timing of her Wednesday Facebook post suggests that she was motivated by Silverman’s Instagram post.

The senator has also been an outspoken opponent of big tech censorship. Last July, she penmed a letter to Democrat President Joe Biden excoriating his administration for teaming up with Facebook to target so-called COVID vaccine “misinformation.”

*“I write regarding White House Press Secretary Jen Psaki’s recent remarks about the White House’s oversight of social media posts it considers problematic or ‘disinformation.’ Ms. Psaki noted that the White House is ‘in regular touch with the social media platforms’ and is ‘flagging problematic posts’ that they believe should be removed relating to COVID-19 and the COVID vaccine. Ms. Psaki also suggested that Americans who are banned from one social media platform should be banned on others,”* the letter read.

*“These revelations are deeply concerning. The blatant actions by your administration to work with big tech companies to censor Americans’ free speech are shocking – and arguably a violation of the First Amendment. Communist countries such as Cuba are currently taking away their citizens’ right to use the internet to communicate; the U.S. government should be standing up to, not looking to mirror, authoritarian regimes such as these.”*

It may perhaps be no coincidence that this Democrat administration stands on the side of transgender activists, particularly around the sports issue.

As soon as Biden took office, for instance, his administration withdrew the Trump-era federal government’s support for a lawsuit brought by three female high school track stars who’d been forced to run against biological males.

As far as this administration is concerned, biological males who identify as transgender females are no different physically than their biologically female counterparts. Anyone who says otherwise is, therefore, a disseminator of “misinformation.”

It appears that to this administration, biological facts – especially the biological fact that men are on average physically stronger than women – are themselves a form of so-called “misinformation.”

Blackburn for her part staunchly disagrees with this seemingly pseudoscientific mindset.

All this comes roughly a month and a half after Blackburn interviewed University of Kentucky swimmer Riley Gaines, a biological female who was forced to compete against notorious transgender woman Lia Thomas.

“The majority of us female athletes, or females in general, really, are not okay with this, and they’re not okay with the trajectory of this and how this is going and how it could end up in a few years,” Gaines says in the video above, referencing the NCAA’s decision to kowtow to the transgender lobby.

## California opens recycling plant to turn sewage into drinking water

As drought-stricken California prepares to restrict water usage for tens of millions of residents, a new water recycling plant could come to the rescue.

The Los Angeles plant already cleans waste water, making it safe to go back into the ocean.

At the cost of \$4 billion dollars, it could also clean up to 150 million gallons a day to the standard of tap water, supplying the homes of around 500,000 people.

Governor Gavin Newsom, who toured a prototype of the water recycling plant, said purifying waste water destined for the Pacific Ocean was ‘revolutionary’.

*‘There’ll have never been a project like this in US history,’* he said.

He added it would be *‘profoundly important’* for the future of his state.

The plant still requires regulatory approval but, if granted, it could be up and running by the end of the decade.

California has spent years in and out of drought but saw its driest ever start to a year in 2022 with precipitation in January, February and March almost ten inches below the previous record low.

Governor Newsom said the state had never experienced so many consecutively dry years in a row.

Much of California’s water comes from the Colorado River or from snowmelt on the mountains running downstream.

Lake Mead – which stores the water and

also supplies Nevada, Arizona and New Mexico – is at a historic low right now with levels dropping more than 100 feet over the last 20 years.

It comes as California brings in hefty water restrictions, with LA residents told to significantly cut down on their usage from June 1.

The state is planning to introduce set watering days based on location, plus strict limits on the amount of times sprinklers can run.

Watering plants on any day between 9am and 4pm will also be completely banned and officials also want pools to be covered to minimize evaporation.

EDITORS NOTE: It appears California will be transcending from the covid-19 pandemic over restrictions and mandates to *“Water Rationing.”* Agriculture has already been issued restrictions which are questionable at best.

As a matter of fact some areas in San Diego County residences are already under restricted water usage.

However, the small Delta fish is exempt from any water restrictions as millions of gallons of water continue to drain into the ocean that could be used for farming and drinking, but you won’t hear of see a word about it in the media.

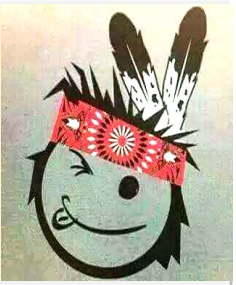

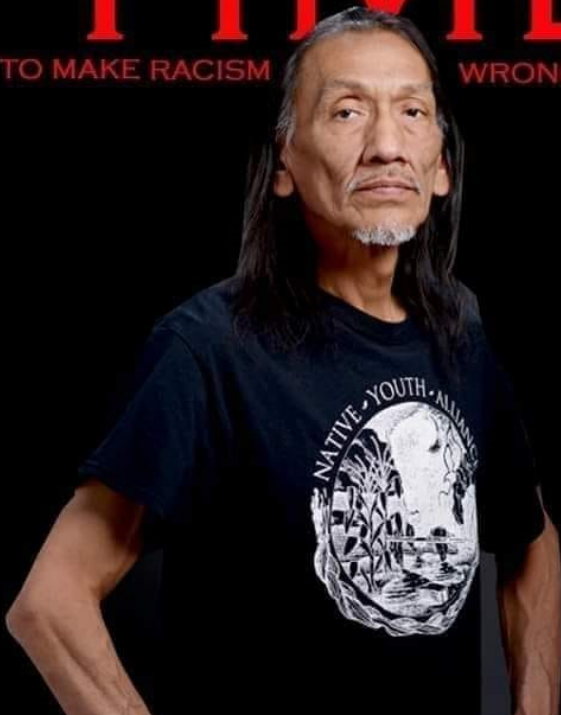

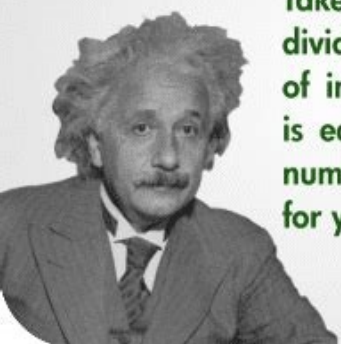
