Markwayne Mullin, Cherokee Nation Citizen U.S. Senator for Oklahoma

Senator Elect, Markwayne Mullin (R) is an enrolled citizen of the Cherokee Nation. He was born July 26, 1977 in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He is 45 years of age.

Mullin ran for the unfinished term of retiring Sen. Jim Inhofe. He is the third American Indian in the 245 year history of the United States of America to be elected to the U.S. Senate.

Charles Curtis (January 25, 1860 - February 8, 1936) A Republican, was the first American Indian to be elected as a U.S. Senator for Kansas.

Curtis served one six-year term from 1907 to 1913 and then most of three terms from 1915 to 1929, when he was elected as vice-president. He served as the 31st vice president of the United States from 1929 to 1933 under Herbert Hoover.



Ben Nighthorse Campbell from Colorado was the second American Indian to serve as a U.S. Senator.

Ben Nighthorse Campbell was born in Auburn, California on April 13, 1933 and is member of the Northern Cheyenne tribe.

He is an American Cheyenne Indian politician who represented Colorado's 3rd congressional district in the United States House of Representatives from 1987 to 1993, and as a United States Senator from Colorado from 1993 to 2005.

He also serves as one of forty-four members of the Council of Chiefs of the Northern Cheyenne Indian Tribe.

During his time in office, Tom Cole (R) (Chickasaw Nation), was elected to the House in 2003. Until Cole was elected he was the only American Indian serving in the U.S. Congress.

As of 2022, Campbell remains the last American Indian elected to the U.S. Senate.

Mullin received 62% of the votes as they Oklahoma voters made their dissatisfaction with Horn's record in congress clear.

President Trump also endorsed Mullins among many other republican leaders.

He was also the biggest fundraiser with over \$5 million as of the end of October 2022.

He was the frontrunner as he lead former Democratic congresswoman Kendra Horn by 13 points — 52% to 39% — in an Amber Integrated poll released Monday, October 24, 2022 while independent Michael Delaney had 4% and Libertarian Kenneth Blevins had 3%.

Historically Democratic candidates face long odds and headwinds created by President Joe Biden's low approval in the state. Pollster Jackson Lisle, a partner at Amber Integrated, said, *"Biden is certainly impacting the federal races. His unpopularity in Oklahoma seems to be keeping Republican voters in lockstep behind the Republican U.S. Senate candidates. President Biden received less than 33% of the vote in Oklahoma in 2020. His unpopularity has certainly grown with increased economic anxiety."*

An Amber Integrated poll in June showed 68% of Oklahoma voters had a negative view of the president.



Neither of the Democratic candidates had an advantage among women, according to the new poll, even after Oklahoma enacted strict abortion bans.

Kendra Horn, of Oklahoma City, who served in Congress from 2019 to 2021, was supported by 45% of women in the new poll, while Mullin was backed by 46%.

U.S. Rep. Markwayne Mullin is an American Indian politician, businessman, and former professional mixed martial arts fighter serving as the U.S. representative for Oklahoma's 2nd congressional district since 2013.

He is a member of the Republican Party. Mullin's district covers about a quarter of Eastern Oklahoma.

Mullin and his wife, Christie, live in Westville, a few miles from the Arkansas border, and have six children.

Mullin was one of five Americans Indians serving in the 117th Congress. The others were Tom Cole (R) (Chickasaw Nation), Yvette Herrell (R) (Cherokee Nation), Sharice Davids (D) (Ho-Chunk Nation), and Alaska Native Mary Peltola (D) (Yup'ik).

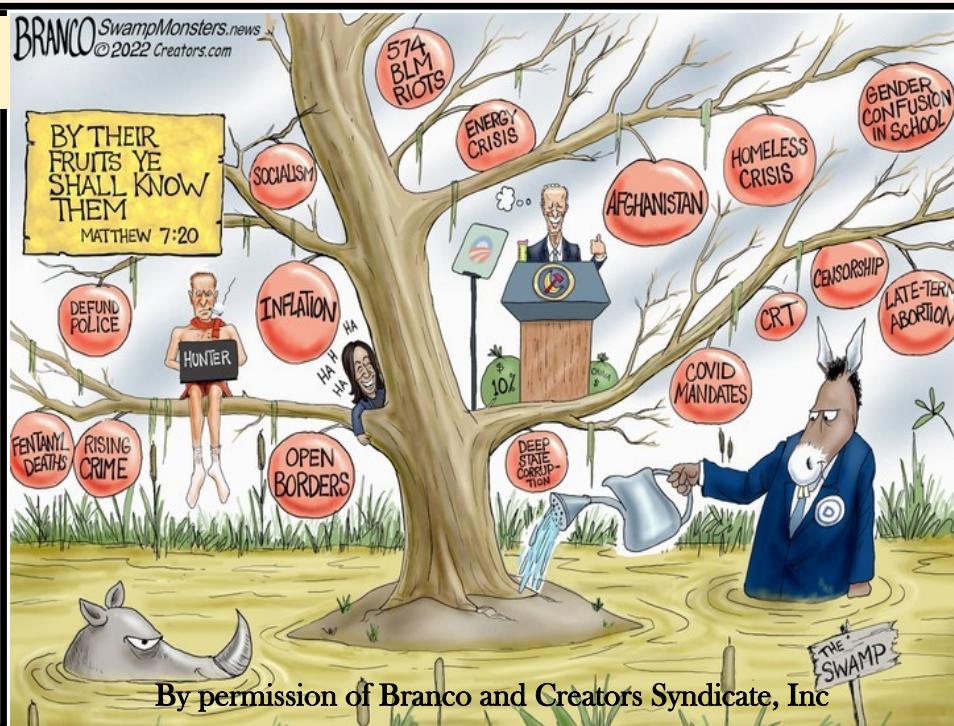
Although the House is in control of the GOP and the Senate may remain in the control of the Socialist/Democrats if it ends in a 50-50 tie as it is currently.

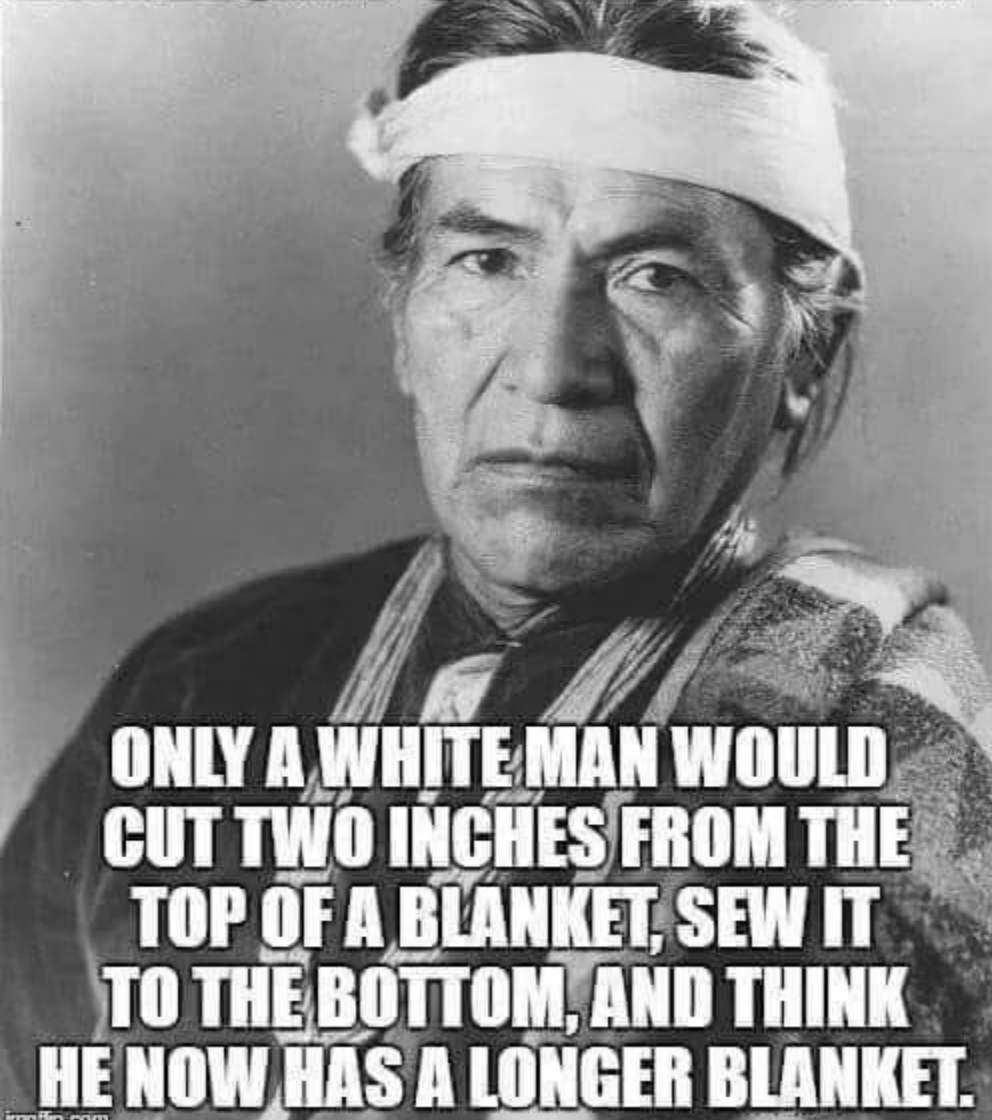

SUPREME COURT JUSTICES SEEM TO FAVOR MOST OF ICWA LAW

The Supreme Court appeared likely Wednesday, November 10, 2022 to leave in place most of a federal law that gives preference to Native American families in foster care and adoption proceedings of Native children.

The justices heard more than three hours of arguments in a broad challenge to the Indian Child Welfare Act, enacted in 1978 to address concerns that Native children were being separated from their families and, too frequently, placed in non-Native homes.

It has long been championed by tribal leaders as a means of preserving their families, traditions and cultures. But white families seeking to adopt Native children are among the challengers who say the law is impermissibly based on race, and also prevents states from considering those children's best interests.

Justice Brett Kavanaugh called the case difficult because the court is being called on to draw a line between tribal sovereignty and *"the fundamental principle that we don't treat people differently because of race, ethnicity or ancestry."*

He was among conservative justices who expressed concern about at least one aspect of the law that gives preference to Native parents, even if they are of a different tribe than the child they are seeking to adopt or foster. Chief Justice John Roberts, Justice Samuel Alito and Justice Amy Coney Barrett also raised questions about whether that provision looked more like a racial

classification that the court might frown upon.

"To get to the heart of my concern about this, Congress couldn't give a preference for white families to adopt white children, Black families to adopt Black children, Latino families to adopt Latino children, Asian families to adopt Asian children," Kavanaugh said.

But none of the non-Native families involved in the case has been affected by the preference the conservative justices objected to, Justice Department lawyer Edwin Kneedler told the court.

Even if there is a court majority to strike down that provision, the rest of the law could be kept in place, Ian Gershengorn, a lawyer for the Cherokee Nation, the Navajo Nation and other tribes said.

He urged the court to uphold the law *"that has made such a meaningful difference to so many children."*

Representing the non-Native families, lawyer Matthew McGill called on the court to strike down the law because it "flouts the promise of equal justice under law."

Justice Neil Gorsuch, a conservative who is a strong supporter of Native Americans' rights, and the court's three

liberal justices seemed strongly inclined to uphold the law in its entirety.

"Congress understood these children's placement decisions as integral to the continued thriving of Indian communities," said liberal Justice Elena Kagan.

Gorsuch said a broad ruling in favor of the challengers also would take *"a huge bite out of"* other federal programs that benefit Native Americans, including health care.

The law's fate is in the hands of a court that has made race a focus of its current term, in cases involving the redrawing of congressional districts and affirmative action in college admissions. Two members of the court, Roberts and Barrett, also are the parents of adopted children.

The full 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals struck down parts of the law last year, including preferences for placing Native children with Native adoptive families and in Native foster homes. It also said Congress overstepped its authority by imposing its will on state officials in adoption matters.

But the 5th Circuit also ruled that the law generally is based on the political relationship between the tribes and the U.S. government, not race.

The tribes and the Biden administration appealed some parts of the lower court ruling, while the white families and Texas, allied with those families, appealed others.

More than three-quarters of the 574 federally recognized tribes in the country have asked the high court to uphold the law in full, along with tribal organizations. They fear widespread impacts if the court attempts to dismantle the tribes' status as political sovereigns.

Nearly two dozen state attorneys general across the political spectrum filed a brief in support of the law. Some of those states have codified the federal law into their own state laws.

A ruling in favor of the families and Texas could undercut the 1978 law and, the tribes fear, have broader effects on their ability to govern themselves.

When child protection authorities remove Native children from their homes, the law requires states to notify tribes and seek placement with the child's extended family, members of the child's tribe or other Native American families.

All of the children who have been involved in the current case at one point are enrolled or could be enrolled as Navajo, Cherokee, White Earth Band of Ojibwe and Ysleta del Sur Pueblo. Some of the adoptions have been finalized while some are still being challenged.

It's more than lockdowns, because 'America is getting dumber'

'Education has been hijacked by the teachers unions'

"America is getting dumber because education has been hijacked by the teachers' unions," Levin told the [Daily Caller News Foundation](#) (DCNF). *"The executives of the National Education Association (NEA) and the American Federation of Teachers (AFT) and most state and local union leaders don't care about education - they care about their cash cow."*

Levin continued. *"Randi Weingarten, president of the AFT earned more than \$426,000 in 2020-2021 while Becky Pringle, the president of the NEA in 2020-2021, the year of the Covid shutdown prolonged by the unions, earned \$25,000 more than in the previous year, for a total of \$534,234."*

The NEA recommended for summer that students read *"Why We Fly,"* a book about two girls who kneel in protest of the national anthem. In July, the NEA committed to spending more than \$140,000 to research and target opposition groups who are *"are actively working to diminish a student's right to honesty in education, freedom of sexual and gender identity, and teacher autonomy."*

A New Jersey chapter of the NEA ran an ad for the 2022-2023 school year calling parents who speak out against Critical Race Theory (CRT) and gender identity lessons *"extremists."* In September, the NEA gave an Ohio school LGBTQ Ally badges that read *"I'm Here"* and a

QR code for students to access adult resources on sexual education.

Levin told the DCNF that the lack of academic achievement also extends to the classroom where lessons have strayed from traditional science and history.

"America is getting dumber because our students no longer learn actual science in K-12 and in college," Levin told the DCNF. *"Now the Scientific Method is racist, and students are being taught that doctors 'guess the baby's gender at birth' and that gender is a spectrum and has nothing to do with biological sex. They are learning that 'people menstruate,' 'people breastfeed,' and 'people give birth.' Women are being erased."*

Teachers are prioritizing CRT in the classroom; approximately 90% of high school students say they have either been taught or heard about CRT in school. About 57% were taught that *"white people have unconscious biases that negatively affect non-white people"* and 69% said they had at least heard in school that *"white people have white privilege."*

Back-to-school curriculums grounded in social-emotional learning (SEL), which lay the foundation for CRT, are recommended for teachers to take five days, or 230 minutes, away from their normal lessons to teach their students to inspect their identity and *"wrestle"* with *"multiple perspectives."*

Almost 70% of voters believe elementary school students should not learn about sexual orientation and gender identity in school, yet school districts are teaching it; in Wisconsin, a school district implemented a sexual education curriculum which tells teachers to refer to a female as "a person with a vulva" and teaches third-graders about *"they/them"* pronouns.

School districts are promoting lessons and classes that focus on CRT and transgenderism; in Seattle, Washington, parents say their child was *"totally duped"* into taking a *"anti-American socialist"* history course that was labeled as U.S. American history. In Pennsylvania, an elementary school held a training for teachers to learn how to add transgenderism les-

sons and create a *"gender inclusive"* classroom.

Handel told the DCNF that there is a solution and way to change the direction of students' academic achievement and that begins with transparency in the classroom.

"Our response to it is to say at a minimum, these teachers need to be posting the curriculum online," Handel told the DCNF. *"It shouldn't be the case where a parent is having to file a Freedom of Information Act request just to see what their kid is being taught in school. That's really what we've been emphasizing, making sure parents are fully aware, fully informed on everything that's being taught to their kids."*

Warnock's church promotes speaker that claims evangelical Christianity is racist

'There is nothing that would make you think it values black lives'

Voters in Georgia, where there's a hotly contested Senate race between incumbent Democrat Raphael Warnock and GOP challenger and NFL star Herschel Walker, are being recommended to listen to a message promoted by Warnock's church.

He was a pastor at Ebenezer Baptist Church, which still pays him a massive housing allowance each month, even though he's getting the full salary of a U.S. senator.

According to a report in the Washington Free Beacon, that church recently held an political voter outreach event.

And it was then that it aired a pre-taped 2020 sermon from Billy Honor, who insisted that "evangelical white Christianity" is racist.



"There is nothing about evangelical white Christianity that would make you think it values black lives," Honor charged in his sermon. "The fact is that this is a tradition that devalues black bodies, so much so that the devaluing of black bodies is about as American as apple pie."

Warnock's name was at the top of a welcome message to those to came to the political event.

"The sermon could reignite concerns about Warnock's

own controversial statements and promotion of extremist rhetoric, including a sermon in which he said Americans need to repent for their 'whiteness' and his defense of anti-Semitic pastor Rev. Jeremiah Wright," the report explained.

Wright is the Chicago pastor under whom Barack Obama took lessons, and he became famous for his attack on the United States, with a "God **** America!" statement.

Honor claimed that "evangelical Christianity" was the "ideological basis for the enslavement of Africans, the expansion of white supremacy, the resistance to reconstruction, the acceptance of racial segregation laws, and the recent dismissal of the Black Lives Matter movement to end murders of black bodies by police."

Walker criticized Warnock for allowing such a message at the church where he still is listed as pastor.

Walker told the Free Beacon, "Raphael Warnock and his

allies believe America is a bad country full of hateful people. They even smear evangelicals who love Jesus as racist. They should be ashamed."

He said, however, that the Democrats' "politics of division and hate" is about to come to an end in his state.

He's leading Warnock in polls just days before the election.

The report noted a Marist poll found white evangelicals make up over a quarter of registered voters in Georgia.

It was a few years earlier, in 2016, that Warnock claimed Americans must "repent" for their "worship of whiteness," the report said.

Honor is, the report said, an organizer for the New Georgia Project, a leftist group funded by Democrat candidate for governor Stacey Abrams.

Pennsylvania spend nearly \$17 million of Taxpayers Money for the mutilations on kids

Trans ideology also includes injections that make hairlines

Procedures that involved handing out chemicals to children and doing body mutilation surgeries have cost taxpayers in Pennsylvania nearly \$17 million in recent years, according to a new report.

The findings from the Pennsylvania Family Institute were outlined in a report in the Daily Wire.

The organization filed a right-to-know case with the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services and discovered that since 2015, more than \$16.7 million tax dollars have been handed over for puberty-blocking drugs, cross-sex hormones and those surgeries that disfigure healthy body parts and leave the victims likely sterile for life.

Emily Kreps, of the institute, said, "When Gov. [Tom] Wolf took office, he unilaterally changed state policy to cover things like double mastectomies to remove healthy breasts from minor

girls and irreversible experimental hormones for children. The same drugs used to chemically castrate convicted sex offenders are being funded by tax dollars for minors. This type of 'care' is happening right now at major institutions like CHOP, Penn State Health and UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh—especially to children in

foster care."

In 2015 when Wolf took office, he named Rachel Levine, a man who dresses as a woman, as the state's physi-

cian general.

On March 26, 2021 Joe Biden appointed Levine United States assistant secretary for health.

While in Pennsylvania, he worked to make sure insurance companies paid for what leftists now call "gender-affirming" care.

The result is that from 2015 to 2021, Pennsylvania saw a nearly 5000% increase in spending on "gender-affirming" care for minors under 18.

From about \$78,000 in that first year, the costs grew to \$1.8 million in 2018 and nearly \$4 million in 2021.

The institute noted that from the beginning of 2022 to October 21, the state spent \$3.7 million on medical "interventions" for minors.

Alexis Sneller, also of the family organization, charged, "This level of state-endorsed harm upon children is reprehensible. While we knew the Wolf administration was funding services relat-

ed to these irreversible procedures on minors, now seeing the exact numbers - millions spent towards these detrimental acts - is still shocking."

The Daily Wire noted, "A young Pennsylvania woman named KC Miller had a viral video on Twitter describing the significant hair loss and receding hair-

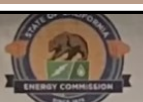
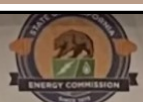

California Energy Commission approves \$31 million for tribal long-duration energy storage project

Viejas Tribe of Kumeyaay Indians 60-megawatt-hour solar microgrid project one of the first of its kind in the country



CALIFORNIA ENERGY COMMISSION

A \$31 million grant from the California Energy Commission (CEC) will be used to deploy a cutting-edge, long-duration energy storage system that will provide renewable backup power for the Viejas Tribe of Kumeyaay Indians and support statewide grid reliability in the event of an emergency.

The project, which is funded by one of the largest state grants ever awarded to benefit a tribal government, will demonstrate the performance and potential of long-duration energy storage systems as California works to achieve 100 percent clean electricity.

The 60-megawatt-hour long duration system is one of the first of its kind in the country. The project will provide renewable backup power to the Viejas community in the event of local outages and provide the opportunity for the tribe to shift electricity use away from the statewide electrical grid during calls for conservation.

The CEC awarded the grant to Indian Energy LLC, a privately held Native

American-owned microgrid developer who will build the project for the tribe.

"This solar microgrid project will enable us to create a reliable and sustainable source of clean energy for our gaming, hospitality, and retail operations going forward. In turn, the associated non-lithium battery system supports the environmental protection and cultural stewardship of our ancestral land, thereby ensuring the vibrant future of our children," said Viejas Band of Kumeyaay Indians Chairman John Christman. *"We are proud to stand shoulder to shoulder with the California Energy Commission (CEC) and Indian Energy in the development and implementation of this forward-thinking technology for the collective betterment of our great State, and the nation at large. We are appreciative of the CEC's financial support, and for the foresight and planning of the Governor's Office, and his personal commitment towards the advancement of clean energy solutions. As a large electricity consumer, we recognize our responsibility to lead by ex-*

ample in lessening our burden on the electric grid, and it is our sincere hope that the demonstrated financial and environmental merits of this project will serve as a repeatable model for others."

An event was held November 3, 2022 to celebrate the grant at the tribe's facilities about 35 miles east of San Diego.

Event attendees included Viejas Band of Kumeyaay Indians, Chairman Christman, Christina Snider, tribal affairs secretary to Governor Gavin Newsom; Geneva Thompson, assistant secretary for tribal affairs for the California Natural Resources Agency; CEC Chair David Hochschild; and Nicole Reiter from Indian Energy.

"The CEC is proud to support this unique project with the largest grant we have ever provided to a tribal community," said CEC Chair Hochschild. *"Not only will it support critical operations for the tribe during wildfire-driven power outages, it can also benefit the statewide grid in the event of emergencies while supporting innovation and investment in the long-duration storage industry as this new resource becomes fully commercialized."*

This is the first award under the state's new \$140 million Long-Duration Energy Storage Program. The program is part of Governor Gavin Newsom's historic \$54 billion commitment to fight climate change and implement world-leading measures that will cut pollution, deploy clean energy and new technologies and protect public health.

"Indian Energy's mission is to support Indian Country on their journey toward energy sovereignty while creating a sustainable future for our seventh generation. This project continues the great partnership between Indian Energy, Viejas Band of Kumeyaay and the California Energy Commission," said Allen G. Cadreau, founder and chief executive officer of Indian Energy.

Energy storage is essential to the state's transition away from fossil fuels, absorbing excess renewable power generated during the day for use into the evening when demand peaks as the sun sets. Most storage systems today use lithium-ion battery technology, which typically provides up to four hours of energy. The Viejas Tribe project will use non-lithium long-duration technologies, which provide up to 10 hours of power.

Pennsylvanians vote for more crime, inflation, and children being taught men can have babies

Based on Tuesday, November 6, 2022 midterm election results in Pennsylvania, most of the state likes record-breaking crime and inflation. Whatever criticisms one might have about Oz, he was leaps and bounds better than Fetterman. However, I am saying that from a conservative Republican perspective.

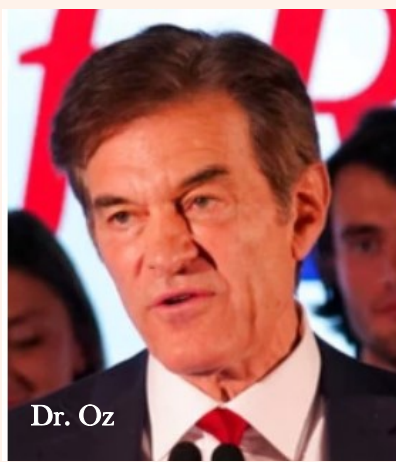

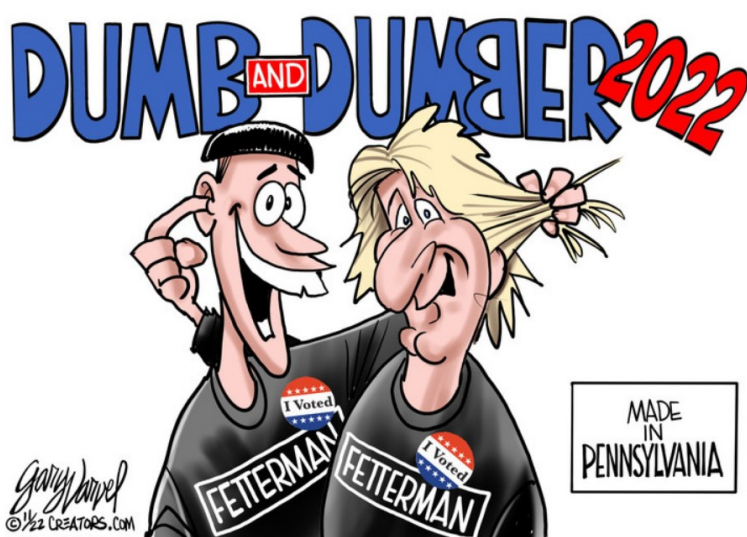
cal men competing with women is permissible. If that's not indicative of a severe issue, I'm not sure what is.

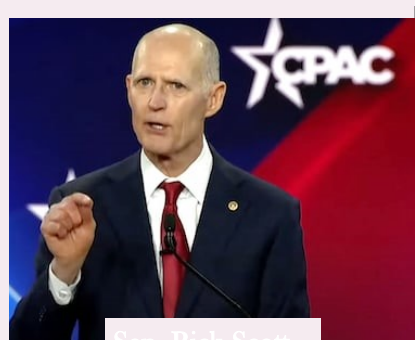

Florida Senator Rick Scott challenges Mitch McConnell as Senate GOP leader

'We must start saying what we are for, not just what we are against'

Republican Sen. Rick Scott of Florida will challenge Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell for his role in the upcoming leadership election, per a letter he wrote on Nov. 5, 2022.

Scott's office circulated a letter among GOP senators and senators-elect announcing his intention to run in the election, which will be held on Wednesday in the Old Senate Chamber, per Fox News.

Though the contents of the letter have not yet been released, McKinley Davis, Scott's spokesperson, later confirmed the plan.

Scott, as chairman of the National Republican Senatorial Committee, had been engaged in a monthslong dispute with McConnell regarding the funding

of Senate candidates, with McConnell having publicly criticized candidate quality in these races.

Senate nominees in battleground states were all public supporters of former President Donald Trump, with some receiving his endorsement over more moderate candidates in GOP primaries.

Scott is very popular with the GOP senators.

FBI director refuses to say if bureau had sources 'dressed as Trump supporters' in Jan. 6 riots

FBI Director Christopher Wray refused to answer multiple questions Tuesday, Nov. 15, 2022 from a Republican congressman concerning whether FBI sources were embedded among Jan. 6 protesters during a House Homeland Security Committee hearing on Worldwide Threats to the Homeland.

Republican Louisiana Rep. Clay Higgins asked Wray at the hearing if the FBI had "confidential human sources embedded within the Jan. 6 protesters" that day. Wray said he had to "be very careful about when we do and do not and where we have and have not used" such sources, "categorically" denying that bureau sources or employees "instigated or orchestrated Jan. 6."

The FBI has arrested more than 850 people in connection with the Jan. 6 events, with hundreds pleading guilty to related charges, according to NBC News. Earlier this year, the House Jan. 6 Committee dismissed an "unsupported" claim that the FBI helped to incite the riot, The Washington Post reported.



"Did you have confidential human sources dressed as Trump supporters inside the Capitol on Jan. 6 prior to the doors being opened?" Higgins subsequently questioned. Wray began to repeat that he needed to be "very careful," but the congressman loudly insisted, "It should be a no! Can you not tell the American people no?"

The FBI director urged Higgins not to "read anything into" his choice not to divulge information about informants, with committee Chairman Bennie Thompson cutting off the exchange for time.
