Martha's Vineyard 'leftist hypocrisy' on Full Display for the American to See. Deporting illegal immigrants from island

Martha's Vineyard activated the National Guard in response, and released a statement calling the situation a "humanitarian crisis." The 50 migrants were ultimately loaded onto buses two days after arriving and transported off Martha's Vineyard to military housing on the Cape Cod mainland.

"National Guard sent to interdict 50 illegal immigrants who disturbed liberals' golf games & Chardonnay at Martha's Vineyard," Sen. Ted Cruz, R-Texas, tweeted. "Biden does NOTHING to address 4.2 MILLION illegal immigrants who have flooded small towns in Texas. Biden doesn't care."

"Just 50 illegal immigrants entered Martha's Vineyard, and within 48 hours the wealthy liberal residents rounded them up and shipped them off to a military base," conservative commentator Michael Knowles tweeted.

"Any residents of Martha's Vineyard who have a 'Coexist' bumper sticker on their car are hereby required to remove it," said Rep. Lauren Boebert, R-Colo.

Radio host Sebastian Gorka used the incident on Martha's Vineyard to take aim at Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, D-N.Y., tweeting, "Hey @AOC: how's that 'tired, poor, huddled masses' thing working out on Martha's Vineyard? Cried at any fences today?"

Columnist Derek Hunter wrote, "Add 50 illegal aliens and a rich liberal utopia becomes Thunderdome. But they all insist border states eat millions."

"The Martha's Vineyard thing might be the best and clearest example of what so many of us have been talking about for years," tweeted comedian Dave Smith. "The progressive elites advocate for policies that they never have to suffer the consequences of. And the one time they do, it ends quickly."

"They are against building a wall but they live in gated communities. They are for gun control but they have armed security. They destroy public education but send their kids to elite private schools. They support mask mandates but only their servants wear them at their parties," Smith continued.

"DOJ should prosecute the mayor of Martha's Vineyard for human trafficking, right Dems?" wrote conservative pundit John Cardillo.

"Martha's Vineyard set a beautiful example for the nation. They used the military to deport every last illegal migrant from their island in less than 48 hours. The entire nation should emulate Martha's Vineyard," wrote Breitbart News reporter Alana Mastrangelo.

"I just want to say thank you to the progressive left for these last few days of entertainment. The hypocrisy of you defending elitist, rich, white people in Martha's Vineyard has been nothing short of pure hilarity," tweeted Blaze TV host Chad Prather.

"Governors should have the same right as Martha's Vineyard. They should be able to deport illegal migrants out of their states and out of the country. Joe Biden, Kamala Harris, and [Mayorkas] are enabling a massive daily invasion endangering all Americans," wrote Rep. Marjorie Taylor Greene, R-Ga., adding, "Impeach!"

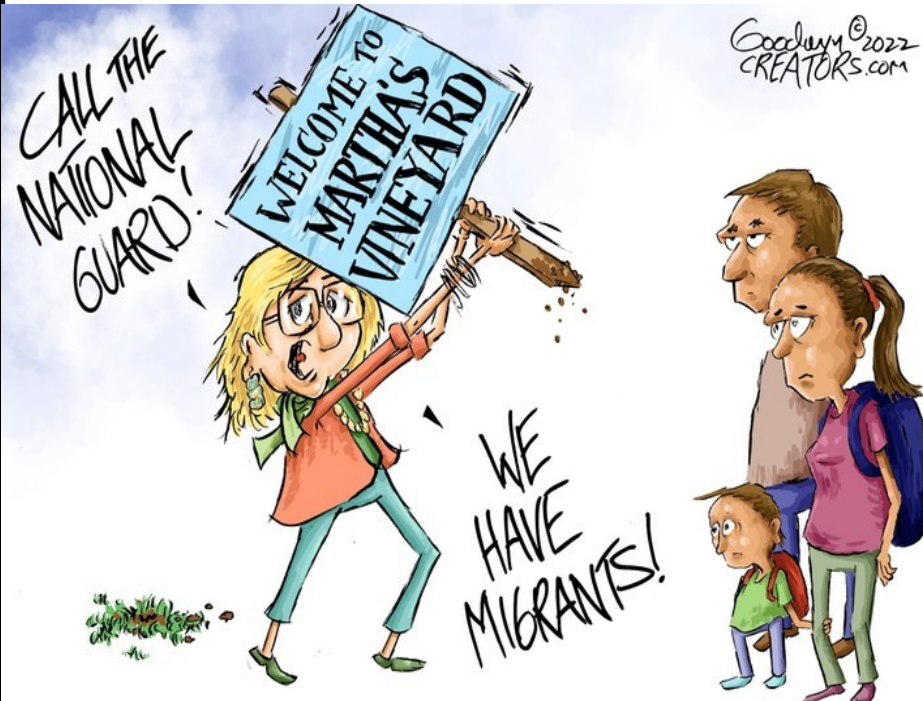

Tribal leaders cast doubt on Supreme Court ruling

A federal committee heard testimony against ruling that stripped overturned tribal law

WASHINGTON D.C. - A congressional subcommittee investigating the impact of a Supreme Court ruling that overturned decades of Native American law was told that the court ignored tribal sovereignty to reach its decision.

The ruling, which came in June, saw the court assert that both federal and state agencies held concurrent jurisdiction when it came to prosecuting non-natives for crimes on native land. In Oklahoma, the 5-4 ruling modified the impact of the court's landmark **McGirt v. Oklahoma** which has led to the affirmation of Indian Country reservations covering much of eastern part of the state while setting new precedents in terms of criminal jurisdiction.

Five tribal leaders from across the country testifying before the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the U.S. uniformly denounced the decision that impacts more than 500 tribes across the country.

"Castro-Huerta undermines tribal jurisdiction and sovereignty by creating a

false narrative that native victims are best protected by the state, they are not," said Jonodev Chaudhuri, ambassador for the Muscogee Creek Nation of Oklahoma.

Chaudhuri denied that the Castro-Huerta decision was needed to address the public safety crisis created by McGirt.

"Any actual crisis was entirely manufactured by the individual county sheriffs, prosecutors, and others, who have not only refused to collaborate (with tribes), but actively used criminal cases, and most disgustingly, victims, as political proxies to create the illusion of a crisis," he said.

But District Attorney Matthew J. Ballard of Oklahoma's 12th district celebrated the Castro-Huerta ruling, comparing it to a "beacon of hope" for the native American victims that he represents.

He insisted the McGirt decision created chaos in Oklahoma with hundreds of criminal cases in his three-county

district in northeast Oklahoma being dismissed or thrown out.

"Native American victims were bearing the brunt of the McGirt decision," he said.

Whitney Gravelle, President of Bay Mills Indian Community, highlighted that while the Castro-Huerta ruling is intended for criminal jurisdiction, it could bleed over into civil jurisdiction and have unforeseen consequences on standing federal laws.

"(CVH) casts doubt on any federal law that exists including its application in Indian Country. This may include permitting requirements and regulations, control of land, and natural resources."

Sara Hill, the Cherokee Nation attorney general, warned of the dangers rulings attacking tribal sovereignty like Castro-Huerta can create.

Hill specifically called on Governor Stitt to *"come back to the table,"* and *"end his anti-tribal agenda."* Governor Stitt has long been a strong opponent of McGirt and celebrated the Castro-

Huerta ruling calling it a *"clear victory"* for the *"rule of law."*

"It is my belief, founded as it must be in faith in our democracy and our justice system, that McGirt will not be the highwater mark but the Castro-Huerta is certainly a retreat from the principle decision in McGirt," Hill said, *"That should give people who believe in tribal sovereignty and the rule of law some pause."*

Carole Goldberg, a University of California School of Law professor, was very blunt in her testimony.

"I can say with quite emphasis that Castro-Huerta got the relevant law entirely wrong," citing how the ruling was in direct conflict of Public Law 280 which can give states jurisdiction in tribal territory **only with the consent of the tribes.**

The Interior department told the committee that is still reviewing the effects of the Castro-Huerta ruling and plans to work with both tribal leaders and the justice department to outline guidance for tribes affected by the ruling.

On August 12, 2022, five tribes filed a brief with the U.S. Supreme Court in *Brackeen v. Haaland* defending the constitutionality of the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA). Cherokee Nation Principal Chief Chuck Hoskin, Jr., Morongo Band of Mission Indians Chairman Charles Martin, Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez, Oneida Nation Chairman Tehassi Hill, and Quinalt Indian Nation President Guy Capoean issued the following statement:

The United States Congress passed the Indian Child Welfare Act 44 years ago. In the decades since, Indian Child Welfare Act has continued to receive strong, bipartisan support while being repeatedly upheld in both state and federal courts.

Our brief filed today outlines not only the tremendous benefits that Indian Child Welfare Act has brought to the health and safety of children, but also

demonstrates how the law adheres to the Constitution and the principles of tribal citizenship dating back to America's founding.

National child welfare experts and advocates regard Indian Child Welfare Act to be the gold standard of child welfare laws because, when properly followed, it delivers better outcomes for children and their families.

But if those attacking Indian Child Welfare Act are successful, they would not only dismantle a law that is central to our sovereign interests in protecting our children but also create chaos and instability throughout the country by overturning the basic framework of Indian law and the political nature of

tribal citizenship.

On November 9, 2022, the Supreme Court will hear arguments and then decide the future of Indian Child Welfare Act.

"We are confident that the court will rule on the side of Indian Child Welfare Act, of the Constitution, of history, of child welfare experts, of states, and of children and families. To do otherwise, the court would be ignoring decades of precedent, overriding congressional authority, and putting our tribal children's safety at risk. We stand with hundreds of tribes across the nation in defending Indian Child Welfare Act in court and look forward to once again seeing its constitutionality upheld."

In the brief, the tribes explain why Indian Child Welfare Act remains critical and relevant today, noting that a *"mountain of evidence – from 1978 to today – shows that Indian Child Welfare Act provides an essential buffer against practices that continue to yield the unwarranted removal of Indian children"* and that *"Indian Child Welfare Act is based on a simple idea: When Indian children can stay with their families and communities, Tribes and children alike are better off."*

Over 500 American and Alaskan Native Tribes, 60 tribal organizations, 87 different members of Congress, 23 states, and a county with the largest child welfare system in the country filed amicus briefs that defend ICWA's ability to encourage tribal-state and tribal-federal relations, as well as emphasize ICWA's effectiveness in practice in state contexts.

Thanks to Democrats, the IRS is coming to your front door

Democrats in Washington just added \$80 billion to the Internal Revenue Service's budget, supercharging and rewarding an agency that has a notorious track record of abusing its power for political purposes.

Nine years ago, the Obama-Biden IRS was caught targeting conservative organizations leading up to the 2012 presidential election. People were assured the scandal would be thoroughly investigated, but the IRS was already busy destroying evidence behind closed doors. In total, 422 backup tapes holding 24,000 emails from Lois Lerner, the IRS official in charge of the targeting scheme, were erased.

In June 2013, two months after the scandal broke, the IRS paid out \$70 million in bonuses to staff. Lerner received \$42,000 and retired three months later with a full taxpayer-funded pension without ever being held responsible for the role she played. Indeed, not a single IRS employee ever faced charges, even after the case was referred to Obama's Justice Department.

In short, the federal government targeted people with dissenting political beliefs, violated their constitutional rights, and was never held responsible for it.

In the years since then, the IRS has done little to regain the trust of the public. In fact, the agency's recent actions have only deepened the public's mistrust of the agency.

In August 2021, for example, the private tax information of more than 1,000 wealthy people was leaked coincidentally at the same time the White House was seeking public support for raising taxes on the very same people to finance its spending plans. Last month, the tax documents for Ambassador Nikki Haley's nonprofit group were leaked, exposing the private donor information of one of President Joe Biden's potential 2024 opponents.

And just weeks ago, the agency again leaked the confidential information of 120,000 taxpayers with individual retirement accounts. These are the same type of accounts that millions count on for retirement and on which Democrats want to impose additional contribution limits.

They even included such a proposal in their original \$5 trillion Build Back Better legislation that passed the House of Representatives last year.

This brings us to the so-called Inflation Reduction Act, which includes \$80 billion in new funding for the IRS to hire 87,000 new agents. The legislation was passed by Democrats in Congress and signed into law by Biden this summer.

The act essentially empowers the IRS to search under the couch cushions of every living room in America. More than half of the \$80 billion allocated to the agency is earmarked for enforcement, like conducting audits, while only 4% goes to fixing the agency's atrocious customer service. Even Obama's IRS Commissioner John Koskinen has admitted the agency cannot "efficiently use that much money."

To assuage the public's fears, Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen sent a letter directing the IRS not to conduct audits above "historical levels" on families making less than \$400,000 per year. But this should assure no one since a return to "historical levels," which includes the levels of the 2010 Obama-Biden IRS, would result in 1 million more audits on families making less than \$200,000 per year. Even the Congressional Budget Office has acknowledged that expanding the size of the IRS to this degree will increase enforcement actions on families making less than \$400,000 per year, regardless of what Yellen or Biden says.

Democrats have repeatedly dismissed Republicans' concerns about a tyrannical IRS with little to no regard for how the agency's frequent abuses affect people's everyday lives. Just last year, House Democrats proposed giving the IRS the power to snoop in every single bank account that had inflows or outflows of at least \$10,000 each year. Biden even included this proposal in his budget submission. If this policy had passed, up to 134 million taxpayers would have been targeted by such an invasion of privacy, according to the Joint Committee on Taxation.

The vast majority of people make good-faith efforts to pay the taxes they owe. The truth is that Washington has a spending problem, not a revenue problem.

So far this year, overall revenues are up 23% and on pace to be more than 20% of GDP, the highest in 78 years, thanks to the Republican-passed Tax Cuts and Jobs Act. People are paying their fair share — Washington just wants a bigger cut.

There's a saying that if all you have is a hammer, everything looks like a nail. Washington Democrats just handed the IRS a giant \$80 billion hammer along with a mandate to start swinging.

Tribal Water Wars Continue: State of unease: Colorado basin tribes without water rights The Colorado River can no longer support the 40 million people in the U.S. West who have relied on it, plus a \$15 billion agriculture industry

Garnett Querta slips on his work gloves as he shifts the big rig he’s driving into park. Within seconds, he unrolls a fire hose and opens a hydrant, sending water flowing into one of the plastic tanks on the truck’s flat bed.

His timer is set for 5 minutes, 20 seconds — when the tank will be full and he’ll turn to the second one.

The water pulled from the ground here will be piped dozens of miles across rugged landscape to serve the roughly 700,000 tourists a year who visit the Grand Canyon on the Hualapai reservation in northwestern Arizona — an operation that’s the main source of revenue for the tribe.

Despite the Colorado River bordering more than 100 miles of Hualapai land in the canyon, the tribe cannot turn to it as a water source. About a dozen tribes across the Colorado River basin similarly have yet to fully secure access to the river. Now that the river is shrinking because of overuse, drought and human-caused climate change, tribes want the federal government to ensure their interests are protected.

The Hualapai Tribe has a water settlement in Congress that comes with \$180 million for infrastructure. Still, it could be years before a pipeline is built and water flows from the river to the main town of Peach Springs or the tribe’s tourist center at Grand Canyon West.

“It was the best of a bad deal,” said Phil Wisely, the tribe’s public services director. “And the thing is, I don’t think we could get a better deal, especially now.”

The Colorado River no longer can support the 40 million people in the U.S. West who have relied on it, plus a \$15 billion agriculture industry. The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation recently mandated deeper cuts to the water supply and asked seven states to find ways to conserve more.

Tribes did not get a share of the river when the states agreed to divide it and

signed the Colorado River Compact in 1922.

Unlike other water users, tribes don’t lose access to water when they don’t use it. A 1908 U.S. Supreme Court decision known as the Winters Doctrine says tribes have the right to enough water to establish a permanent homeland. Often, tribes give up potentially huge water claims in exchange for an assured supply and federal funding to deliver it.

Tribal water rights — once they’re fully resolved — could add up to about one-quarter of the river’s historic flows, according to the Water & Tribes Initiative.

On the Ute Indian Tribe’s reservation east of Salt Lake City, a water settlement has been delayed for decades because not everyone now agrees on the amount the tribe should receive.

Tribal leaders say they’re tired of press-

ing the federal government to protect its interests. They maintain the way water has been apportioned in Utah has been unfair, though Utah state officials disagree.

“Until you start to deal with the inequities or the injustice, you can never really have any momentum going forward,” said Shaun Chapoose, chairman of the Ute Business Committee.

In a statement to The Associated Press, the Interior Department did not say how tribal water rights, which are federal rights, would be protected as the river’s flow decreases. It said it is working with tribes that are affected by drought.

Back on the Hualapai reservation, the tribe has been chasing groundwater for years.

Querta’s job is a grind, but he’s well-suited for it — analytical, quick and goal-oriented.

The truck takes a beating on the gravel and dirt road on multiple round trips of more than 30 miles most days. The side mirrors and back windows have rattled loose and are held on by red duct tape. Major truck repairs or illness can put him out of commission.

COVID-19 sidelined Querta for two weeks last year with no replacement.

“I didn’t mind because I didn’t want anybody to mess up my truck or my tanks,” said Querta. “I take care of this truck like it’s mine.”

The water he taps is sent through a pipeline just outside Peach Springs to Grand Canyon West. Revenue from tourism funds programs for the elderly, public works, the cultural center and other services. The main tourist attraction is the Grand Canyon Skywalk, a glass bridge with a view of the Colorado River 4,000 feet (1,219 meters) below.

Navajo Nation citizen will head Indian Health Service

Navajo Nation citizen Roselyn Tso was confirmed by the Senate Wednesday, September 21, 2022 to lead the Indian Health Service, the first permanent director the agency has had in nearly two years.

Tso’s term will last four years. The director of Indian Health Service is the most senior position that helps to develop healthcare policy for 2.6 million Indigenous people across the nation.

It had taken seven months for Tso to be confirmed as director of the agency. President Joe Biden nominated Tso in March. Her nomination hearing was in late May.

“I will work to maximize the Agency’s resources to improve the physical, mental, social, and spiritual health and well-being of all American Indians and Alaskan Natives served by the Agency,” Tso said at her nomination hearing earlier this year. “This is particularly important as we are more than two years into a pandemic that has disproportionately affected Indian Country.”

Tso is from LeChee, Arizona. She is Deeshchii’nii, Start of the Red Streak People, born for Hashk’aa hadzohi, Yucca Fruit-Strung-Out-In-A-Line clan. Her maternal grandfather is from Zia Pueblo and her paternal grandfather is Tł’izi lání, Many Goats clan.



She graduated from Marylhurst University in Oregon with an undergraduate degree in interdisciplinary studies and from University of Phoenix in Portland with a master’s in organizational management.

Indian Health Service has been chronically underfunded making it unable to provide equitable health care for over 560 Indigenous nations in the country. In 2021, Congress appropriated \$6.6 billion for the health agency. To be fully funded the agency would need \$36.7 billion.

“The task ahead is long and difficult, and NIHBS commends Roselyn Tso for other commitments and looks forward to working together to achieve health equity within, and for, IHS,” the board said.

However, what did seem to surprise investors was the resolve with which Fed chair Jerome Powell remained committed to fighting inflation even at the cost of economic growth and a possible recession. Powell acknowledged that high rates will cause economic pain for millions of Americans, with the potential to weaken the labor market and raise borrowing costs for consumers.

For students of stock market history, Walmart’s 1% gain on Wednesday, September 21, 2022 brought back memories of the Great Recession in 2008 and 2009. During 2008, the S&P 500 fell 37%, with many large-cap stocks falling even more sharply. Yet Walmart stood out as one of the only Dow stocks to post even modest gains during that year.

On Wednesday, September 21, 2022 after another rate hike, and a promise from Fed Chairman Jerome Powell to stay the course until inflation comes down, Bridgewater founder Ray Dalio said that the Federal Reserve will probably keep tightening its monetary policy until high prices come down, no matter the consequences. As a result, a recession is likely within the next year.

Last month, Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell said that the central bank will stop at nothing until inflation is under control, even if it meant “some pain to households and businesses.”

Lawmakers call on San Benito County supervisors to apologize for demeaning Native American comment

Thirty-six legislators sign letter to local officials

After learning that the chair of the San Benito County Board of Supervisors remarked at a meeting that gathering consensus on a project was like “trying to herd a bunch of Indians,” 36 state legislators sent a letter calling on local officials to apologize. The lawmakers also urged county supervisors to engage with local tribal communities to learn more about California Native Americans. The offending comment was made without objection by the supervisor’s colleagues.

Assemblymember **James C. Ramos (D-Highland)**, the first California Native American elected to the Legislature, said the phrase used by District 3 Supervisor and board chair Peter Hernández was disrespectful

In the letter to supervisors, the lawmakers wrote, “This type and use of language reinforces the belief that people have the right to use the term Indian in a negative or derisive context without consideration for the people represented by the term.” They also cited Hernández’s response to earlier criticism of his comments. Hernández stated **he meant to use “chiefs” instead of “Indians,”** which would have also been offensive.

The assemblymembers who signed the letter observed, “**To many Native Americans in the Midwest, ‘chiefs’ have and continue to be held in the highest regard, not to be confused with trying to herd a group of people.**”

Ramos, and the legislators requested “a formal apology from the entire Board of Supervisors and that this create an opportunity for you to engage with local tribal communities to learn about California Native Americans.”



Biden admin to continue draining oil from strategic reserves through Election Day

The Biden administration announced Monday, September 19, 2022 that it is auctioning 10 million barrels of oil from the Strategic Petroleum Reserve (SPR) which it will deliver The throughout November, according to a Department of Energy (DOE) notice of sale.

The Department of Energy (DOE) announced that it will extend the period in which it aims to sell 180 million barrels of crude oil by auctioning 10 million barrels from Sept. 19 to Sept. 27 and delivering the oil from Nov. 1. to Nov. 30, according to the notice. The deliveries of the reserves, which aim to bring down gas prices, will take place during the same month as the midterm elections that take place on Nov. 8, 2022.

White House Press Secretary Karine Jean-Pierre said on Sept. 14 that gas prices had fallen for 90 straight days, touting Biden's efforts to bring down prices at the pump after gas prices peak at over \$5 per gallon in June 2022.

The White House is eager to continue lowering gas prices ahead of the midterm elections as it believes prices at the pump most directly affect voters' everyday lives and their perception of the economy.

The average national gas price is \$3.68 per gallon, which is 49 cents higher than it was in September 2021, according to AAA data. Biden's Energy Secretary Jennifer Granholm said on Sept. 8 that *the administration may continue to auction off oil barrels from the SPR past October to ward off increasing fuel prices in late 2022.*

Biden has released 155 million barrels of oil so far, and the November sale will bring the total to 165 million barrels out of the 180 million barrels that he sought to sell from March to Oct.

The emergency reserve fell to its lowest level since Nov. 1984 on Sept. 6 after consistent monthly releases of crude, according to DOE data.

SPR oil is sold to the highest bidder, and some of the businesses entitled to make bids are foreign companies. Biden announced in late March that he would approve SPR sales to bring down gas prices and increase the global supply of oil that is being disrupted by "Putin's price hike," according to a White House press release.

The Wall Street Journal editorial board warns of the 'real' stakes of Democrats winning the midterm elections

The Wall Street Journal editorial board warned Sunday, September 18, 2022 *'what's really on the ballot in November'* is to increased taxes, permanent changes to voting processes, and the abolishment of the Senate filibuster if the Democrats maintain control of Congress in the 2022 midterm elections.

"If the election polls are right, Democrats have a good chance of adding to their majority in the Senate and even keeping it in the House," the editors wrote.

"Toward that end they are trying to convince voters that abortion and Donald Trump are the main election issues. But the real issue, by far the most important for actual policy, is whether voters will put a legislative check on the political left," they continued.

The editors argued with Trump not on the ballot and national abortion legislation is unlikely to pass the Senate, voters should instead consider 2022 as an opportunity to limit the power of the current administration.

"The Democratic election strategy is a new version of their 2020 campaign bait-and-switch," said the editors. In 2020, they argued, Democrats presented their campaigns as a referendum on Trump and the government's COVID-19 pandemic response, but once elected, they "pivoted to advance a far-left labor agenda and enact the biggest expansion of government in modern history."

"The Democratic left hasn't given up on any of this, however, as they are admitting if you pay attention," the editorial board wrote. "The media are ignoring this as they echo the abortion and Trump narrative. So it's worth laying out what Democrats really have in mind, based on what they tried to do this Congress and are promising for the next."

The editors warned that Democrats will target the filibuster as *"priority one because a 51-vote Senate majority opens the door to everything the current House has passed,"* with their candidates already promising to kill it.

They also argued that a Democrat-led Senate would push to make D.C. a state, override right to work laws and pile on new entitlements. Further, they said Democrats would vote to fundamentally change national elections forever and mandate that any changes in state election laws first be approved by Biden's Department of Justice.

They warned that Democrats would also use their power to pass crushing environmental regulations, the consequences of which have already led to energy shortages and soaring prices throughout Europe and the United States.

"Major tax increases will also be back in play," the editors warned. *"Ways and Means Chairman Richard Neal recently told a Bloomberg reporter that Democrats will raise individual and corporate tax rates if they keep power."*

"There's much more we could include here, but you get the idea," the editors concluded. *"If Democrats add seats in the Senate and hold the House, there won't be much of a check on progressive ambitions. If they accomplish this with inflation at 8%, they will be even more emboldened. That is what's really on the ballot in November."*

Food Supply Stays Tight as Disappointing U.S. Harvest Adds to Global Challenges

A lackluster U.S. harvest this year is setting back efforts to relieve a global food supply that has been constrained by Russia's war in Ukraine, agriculture-industry executives said..

Senior executives from companies such as Bayer AG, Corteva Inc., Archer Daniels Midland Co. and Bunge Ltd. said worldwide crop supplies remain tight, and some said at least two more years of good harvests in North and South America are needed to ease the pressure. Persistent drought conditions in the U.S. and agricultural countries in South America, along with uncertainty over crop production in Ukraine, are making that harder, they said.

"When it comes to the global food-supply situation, I think things are going to continue to be tight for the time being," said Werner Baumann, Bayer's chief executive.

High temperatures this summer exacerbated drought conditions in the U.S. West and the country's Great Plains. Intense heat in states such as Kansas, Nebraska and Oklahoma set in as corn crops were pollinating in many parts of the Grain Belt, when the plants require the most water. Some corn crops were also planted late this year after a wet spring, causing some yield loss, according to agriculture analysts.

The U.S. Agriculture Department on Sept. 12, 2022 lowered its nationwide corn-production estimate to 13.9 billion bushels, 3% lower than its August projection, and 8% below 2021's total. Soybean-production estimates this month were down 3% from a record projection in August, and down slightly from a year earlier. Agriculture advisory firm Professional Farmers of America Inc. last month cut its outlook for corn yields by 13% in Nebraska and 22% in South Dakota, compared with last year.

The corn harvest this year is currently expected to come in below typical recent yields in North America and Eu-



rope, hindering 2022 from being a year of restocking worldwide supplies, said Chuck Magro, chief executive of seed and pesticide maker Corteva, at an investor presentation this week.

"The current market expectation is that global grain and oilseeds markets need two consecutive normal crop years to stabilize global supplies," Mr. Magro said.

Futures prices for wheat at the Chicago Board of Trade are up 17% over the past 12 months, while corn prices are up about 28% and soybeans roughly 14%.

Years of bad weather affecting big crop-producing regions, including in South America, had stretched global crop supplies, industry executives said. This year, Russia's invasion of Ukraine disrupted shipments from one of the world's top grain-exporting regions.

Those factors have driven up food prices this year, especially for poorer countries. In a September report on global food security in 77 low- and middle-income countries, the USDA estimated the number of food-insecure people at 1.3 billion, up about 10% from the 2021 estimate.

Northern hemispheres for the world crop supply to reach sufficient levels, he said.

The Black Sea grain-export deal has helped free up grain storage space for Ukrainian farmers, and provide them with cash for next year's crop. Without sufficient sales, farmers could struggle to buy the seeds, fuel and other goods needed for fall planting, executives and analysts said. Companies such as Bayer have stepped in to supply them with products, including equipment to remove mines from their fields, said Bayer's Mr. Baumann.

The export deal is under fresh pressure after Russian officials warned in recent weeks that they are unhappy with the terms, raising the threat that Moscow could leverage the arrangement in its widening economic war with the West.

Russian President Vladimir Putin suggested earlier this month that Russia could pull out of the United Nations-brokered deal, saying the West had taken advantage of the grain corridor at the expense of the developing world. The threat temporarily boosted wheat prices, which had been declining in recent weeks.

Russian officials have also said that parts of the agreement that were intended to help Russia sell its fertilizer and other agricultural products amid sanctions weren't having much effect. Agriculture executives said getting the deal renewed by its expiration in late November is crucial to easing pressure on global food stockpiles.

"Need to get those supplies out of there," said Greg Heckman, CEO of St. Louis-based grain trader Bunge, which is the world's largest oilseed processor. *"Not only for global food security but for the quality and to free up storage for the next crop."*

After rocketing higher following Russia's invasion of Ukraine in late February, 2022 crop prices have eased in recent months. An agreement between Russia and Ukraine, completed in July, 2022 has enabled more than a million tons of grain trapped in Ukrainian silos to be exported via the Black Sea, and helped alleviate some of the squeezes on food. Fears of a possible global recession also have weighed on agricultural commodity markets.

Archer Daniels Midland CEO Juan Luciano said at a Sept. 7 investor conference that between March and August, Ukraine exported about 40% of the grain it would normally ship in that particular period. Under the Black Sea grain deal this summer, the country has shipped about 60% of what it has done in past years, he said. For September, he said it could improve further to be closer to 80% or 90%.

"It has recovered pretty quickly," Mr. Luciano said. "Hopefully, that continues to happen because I think that it goes a long way to alleviate any pressure in the food system."

It would likely take two or three years of good crops in the Southern and

Several lawmakers blasted the Army for suggesting soldiers battling inflation go on food stamps after President Biden’s student loan handout.

Fox News Digital spoke with several lawmakers from both parties regarding the Army’s suggestion that soldiers impacted by the rising inflation rate enroll in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

“The people that are in our military are protecting our country, putting their lives [at risk], they’re making great sacrifices...,” Rep. Dan Meuser, (R) Pa., told Fox News Digital. *“On the same note, if individuals who are in the Armed Services choose to go on the SNAP program, that’s up to them.”*

“Nevertheless, yeah, I think our priorities are a little mixed up when we’re choosing special interests, which is being done: those who did not pay their loans off at the sake of those who did, related to higher education,” Meuser said. *“So it’s just wrong.”*

Meuser said the student loan handout picks *“winners and losers”* and *“certainly”* does not teach *“American life lessons,”* but instead implodes them. He also noted that most of his constituents and likely *“most Americans”* are against the plan.

New York Democrat Rep. Ritchie Torres told Fox News Digital he had not yet fully read the report on the Army suggesting inflation-battered soldiers go on food stamps, but called it *“outrageous.”*

Rep. French Hill, (R) Ark., called the situation *“crazy.”*

“Let’s think about that. Now, the Biden administration has not gotten the national defense authorization bill through the Senate yet,” Hill said. *“Something where we voted for a pay increase and for benefit increases for our men and women in uniform – we need to take care of them first and foremost.”*

“Now what hypocrisy to turn around and say that we’re going to what, I’ve read to be, \$560 billion of student loan debt next fiscal year, ballooning the deficit. So, it’s typical of the Biden administration’s mismanagement on both sides of the ledger and making a bad decision, an immoral decision to forgive student loan debt – a problem created by President Obama, I might add as a footnote – and, in turn, suggesting our men and women in uniform go on food stamps because they’re not adequately being taken care of by the Army. It’s wrong on both counts.”

Rep. Nancy Mace, (R) S.C., the first female graduate of the Citadel, called the situation *“insanity.”*

“And, in fact, we’re leaving early this week because Democrats can’t get it together on a spending bill to find money to pay to feed our troops,” Mace said. *“It’s crazy.”*

The office of Rep. David Trone, (D) Md., declined to comment on the issue.

Biden’s plan to forgive student loan debt has been under fire from both sides of the aisle, with Rep. Jodey Arrington (R) Tex., telling Fox News Digital over the phone the move is *“horrible”* and *“par for the course for Bailout Biden.”*

“I mean, this is a guy that has ushered in a whole new level of entitlement in our culture in the United States and has created a new level of moral hazard,” Arrington said, noting the economic stimulus payments encouraged people to stay home instead of work, leading to a labor shortage and inflation.

Arrington called the student loan handout a payoff of pond warned *“there will be a generation of college students coming through the pipeline who will expect their government to*

pay for all of their college.”

The Texas Republican also warned the move will *“have an upward push on the price of higher education”* and that Americans *“will see fees and tuition go up as a result of it.”*

The U.S. Army has released guidance for soldiers as they fight inflation, including a suggestion that they take advantage of SNAP, commonly known as food stamps.

SNAP, a benefit for low-income Americans, is a program for which *“service members and their families may be eligible,”* the guidance said, pointing soldiers and their families to the SNAP website and phone number. SNAP is one of several options discussed as part of the Army’s Financial Readiness Program.

“With inflation affecting everything from gas prices to groceries to rent, some Soldiers and their families are finding it harder to get by on the budgets they’ve set and used before,” guidance from Sergeant Major Michael Grinston said. *“Soldiers of all ranks can seek guidance, assistance, and advice through the Army’s Financial Readiness Program.”*

‘Flat-out lie’: Doctor debunks Stacey Abrams’ ‘conspiracy’ theory on fetal heartbeats

A medical doctor slammed Democratic gubernatorial nominee Stacey Abrams of Georgia on Fox News Thursday afternoon over Abrams’ comments on fetal heartbeats.

“I’m waiting to see what’s happening on social media, waiting for those warning signs for misinformation, because this is a flat-out lie,” Dr. Nicole Saphier, a radiologist, told the “Outnumbered” panel. *“Facts matter, especially when you’re talking to people, especially when you’re in politics and you’re wanting people’s votes. People are going to believe what she has to say.”*

Abrams claimed during a campaign event that Georgia’s “heartbeat” legislation was *“a lie,”* going on to assert *“there is no such thing”* as a heartbeat

six weeks into a pregnancy and instead argued the sound was *“manufactured”* by an ultrasound machine. Abrams opposed the legislation when Georgia passed the abortion law in 2019.

“It is a manufactured sound designed to convince people that men have the right to take control of a woman’s body,” Abrams said during the event, going on to assert that six weeks into a pregnancy was too soon for a woman to know she was pregnant.

“I’m going to deliver the truth and point out it is a complete lie, so at about three weeks after gestation – after conception, the heart of the cells of the heart starts to rhythmically contract so really, the heart starts beating at three weeks,” Saphier said. *“Yes,*

I mean, we’re seeing what a fundamental transformation of this nation looks like.

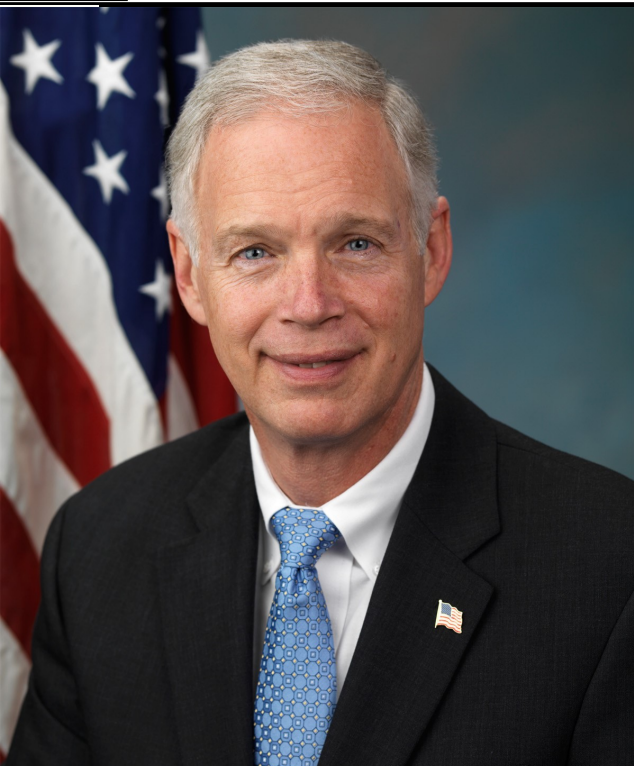

"Make Time to Play"



With the world of technology, children are spending less time playing or engaging in parent-child activities which can impact a child's opportunities to learn new and exciting things such as naming geometric shapes or cutting with scissors. Children need various types of play to support their social-emotional, physical, language, and cognitive development.

Here is a list of types of play:

1. **Functional Play:** Correct form of play. For example, instead of kicking a basketball, the child will throw the ball.
2. **Relational Play:** Using tools in combination. For example, the child may put the baby doll in the stroller.
3. **Symbolic Play:** Using objects to represent another object or idea. For example, using a hairbrush as a microphone.
4. **Constructive Play:** Creating or building something such as a building a tower with blocks or making a collage.
5. **Rough Play or Tumble Play:** Boisterous physical play such as chasing, tumbling, or wrestling.
6. **Games with rules:** A structured game that has rules and limits such as a board or table games.

7. **Unstructured free play:** Freedom to explore and simply have fun.

Do adults need play?

In a **PsycCentral** article over a decade ago, several doctors and psychologists made some compelling observations.

"Our society tends to dismiss play for adults." Play is perceived as unproductive, petty or even a guilty pleasure. The notion is that once we reach adulthood, it's time to get serious. And between personal and professional responsibilities, there's no time to play.



"The only kind [of play] we honor is competitive play," according to **Bowen F. White, MD**, a medical doctor and author of **Why Normal Isn't Healthy**. But play is just as pivotal for adults as it is for kids."

"We don't lose the need for novelty and pleasure as we grow up," according



to **Scott G. Eberle, Ph.D**, vice president for play studies at The Strong and editor of the **American Journal of Play**.

"Play brings joy. And it's vital for problem solving, creativity and relationships."

Author and psychiatrist **Stuart Brown, MD**, founder of the **National Institute for Play** found that lack of play was just as important as other factors in predicting criminal behavior among murderers in Texas prisons. He also found that playing together helped couples rekindle their relationship and explore other forms of emotional intimacy.

Brown calls play a catalyst. A little bit of play, he writes, can go a long way toward boosting our productivity and happiness.

Among several recommendations, both **White** and **Brown** recommend **Play with little ones**. Playing with kids

helps us experience the magic of play through their perspective.

Play can mean many things, from talking to the dog, to taking a walk, from knitting to jumping in puddles, from reading to one another to doing what excited you as a kid.

It can be "educational": cooking for instance is chemistry and art and necessitates a lot of math. Running a mile involves anatomy, physiology, and lots of history. Time you think play is a waste, remember that it offers some serious benefits for both you and others.....play can lead us to sacred spaces and touch people. **White** further says, "Any in powerful ways."

As **Brown** says in his book, "Play is the purest expression of love."

So love your kids and play with them!

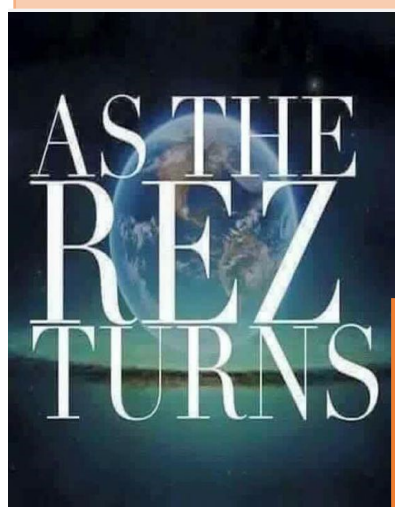

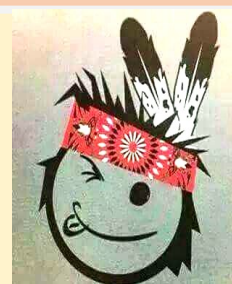

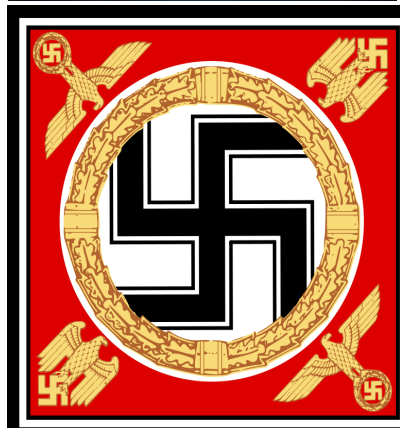

But, like Hitler told the German people: “*Fur Ihre Sicherheit*” “*It’s for your safety,*” we are told the same BS.

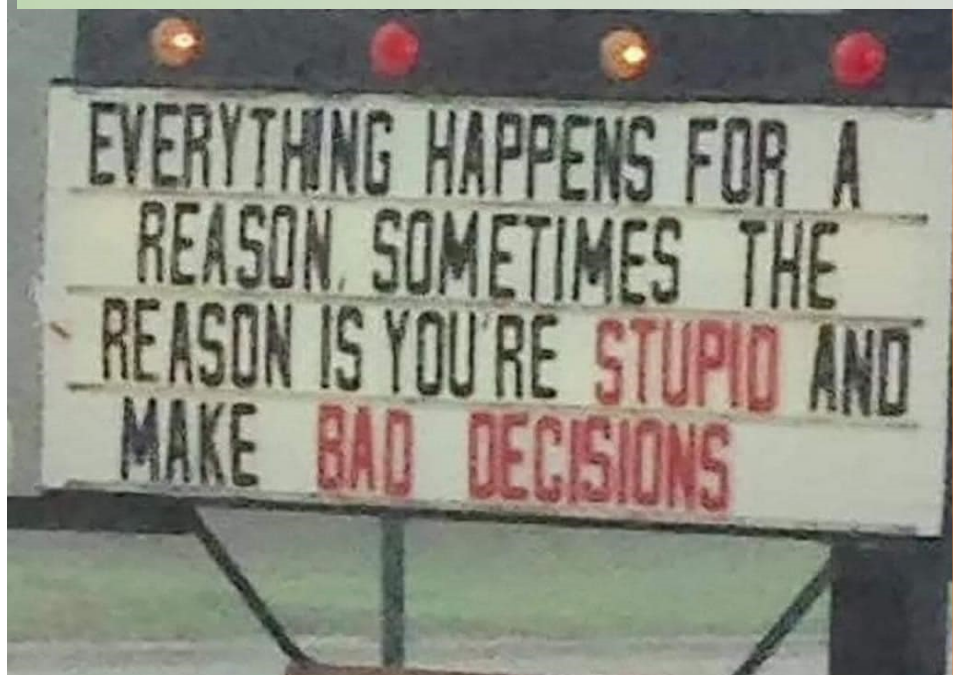
