US Supreme Court rejects race-based challenge to Native American adoption law: "Indian Child Welfare Act, 1978"

MY VIEW: I'm grateful for the 7-2 Supreme Court ruling in *Brackeen v Haaland*, which challenges the Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978 that the legislation is based on "Race" and that the "Political Relationship between the American Indian Tribes and the United States Government is not valid.

However, the Court *"kicked the can down the road"* on both issues, which Justice Kavanaugh, in a concurring opinion on Thursday (June 15, 2023), emphasized that the *"...serious racial discrimination claims made in the litigation remain undecided."* He added *"Courts, including ultimately this court, will be able to address the equal protection issue when it is properly raised by a plaintiff with standing - for example, by a prospective foster or adoptive parent or child in a case arising out of a state-court foster care or adoption proceeding."*

"The bottom line," conservative Jus-



ice Amy Coney Barrett wrote in her *"Word Salad"* on the ruling, *"is that we reject all of petitioners' challenges to the statute, some on the merits and others for lack of standing."*

Two anti-Tribal Rights conservative justices, *Clarence Thomas and Samuel Alito*, dissented from the

decision. However, my view is that had the issue of "Race" and/or the "Political Relationship between the American Indian Tribes and the United States Government, which is in reality one issue, been included in the courts decision *Roberts and Kavanaugh* would have sided with *Thomas and Alito*, and possibly *Barrett* as well.

I hate to be the bearer of bad news but, the courts ruling on the ICWA may be a "Bone" given to the tribes as another challenge to Tribal Sovereignty is soon to be before the Supreme Court.

Five of The GOP U.S. Supreme Court Justices Do not Recognized the Political Relationship between the Tribes and U.S. Government, Treaties Rights or Tribal Sovereignty and In My Humble opinion Will Rule Against the Tribes in Maverick Gaming LLC v United States.

Historically it has been held that the relationship between the American Indian Tribes and the U.S. Government is political and not racial. Although the Tribal land base and political influence has been tragically diminished over the past five centuries the agreements and treaties between the various tribes and U.S. Government and pre-independent occupants are still valid as defined by the U.S. Constitution as a Nation to Nation political relationship and that time does not diminish that relationship.

However, five of the conservative supreme court Justice's don't agree with this premise as they have recently ruled in *Oklahoma v. Castro-Huerta* overturning a 190 year old supreme court ruling, *Worcester v. Georgia* 1832 stating that the court was wrong and that if congress would have supported the 1832 court decision it would have passed legislation as such. Congress did pass several laws in support and reinforcing the Courts 1832 ruling. Yet, for some mysterious reason they were not considered, overlooked or just plainly ignored. Public Law 280 of 1953 and modified several times over the past 70 years and Public Law 93-638 of 1976, which again identified, expanded and strengthen the Political Rights of the Tribal Governments.

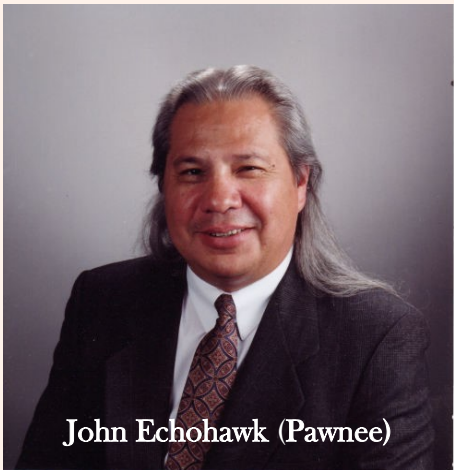
The irony is that the supreme court has historically been political, especially when reviewing American Indian Tribal Rights. And while the public relations efforts of the court have been fairly successful over the past few decades in promoting the court as a fair, natural and even minded branch of our Government tends to lean toward the political ideology of the court's majority. Given that current composition of the court Justices of a super majority of conservatives of six of the nine even though Justice Neil Gorsuch is supportive the Tribal Governments Rights as the only one with any experience with Indian Law. Roberts has been questionable as RINO, except on American Indian Tribal



issues as he vote against the tribes 99% of the time as does Justices Alito, Thomas and the two most resent appointee Amy Coney Barrett and Kavanaugh. Still another serious issue that has surfaced over the last couple of years is the financial benefits, gratuities and gifts received by several of the Justices from "friends or supporters," of which the values vary from a few hundred dollars to thousands of dollars. Justice Clarence Thomas tops the list and has been under attack to resign and recuse himself from various cases, of which he has done neither. This is in addition to the political activities of his wife. Chief Justice John Roberts has also been call out for his wife's affiliation with a successful law firm in Washington D.C. and Justice Samuel Alito was reported to have accepted an all expenses paid fishing trip to Alaska. As to what extent, if any of them has been compromised, it has yet to be proven. However historically, the supreme court and American Indian Tribal Governments have some very real issues with ethics, conflict of interest and misconduct by former supreme court Justices as pointed out by John Echohawk (Pawnee) a Native American attorney and founder of the Native American Rights Fund in 1970, in a resent interview with In-

dian Country Today. He is also a leading member of the Native American self-determination movement. Due diligent by the Tribal Governments would be prudent to avoid any impropriety with "friends or supporters" of any court Justice. Given the courts ruling on June 15, 2023 in *Brackeen v Haaland* upholding the "Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978," based on the reason congress passed it and the plaintiff had "No Standing," thus bypassing the two primary challenges to the legislation; 1) that it was based on race and 2) The relationship between the American Indian Tribes is not valid. However, the Court "kicked the can down the road" on both issues, which Justice Kavanaugh, in a concurring opinion emphasized that the "...serious racial discrimination claims made in the litigation remain

undecided." He added "Courts, including ultimately this court, will be able to address the equal protection issue when it is properly raised by a plaintiff with standing - for example, by a prospective foster or adoptive parent or child in a case arising out of a state-court foster care or adoption proceeding." Many tribal folks, including elected tribal official were thrilled with the courts decision upholding the "Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978" they quit reading at the headlines. Adam Schiff censured by House for ‘false’ allegations on Trump-Russia collusion

The House voted Wednesday (June 21 2023) to censure Rep. Adam Schiff, D-Calif., for pushing claims that former President Trump's 2016 campaign colluded with Russia - a vote that made Schiff just the third member of the House to be censured since the turn of the century. The resolution passed 213-209 in a vote - every Republican voted for it except for six who voted "present," and every Democrat voted against it. It was the second time the House tried to pass a resolution censuring Schiff from Rep. Anna Paulina Luna, R-Fla. A resolution from Luna failed on the House floor last week because it recommended a fine against Schiff of \$16 million, which Democrats and 20 Republicans opposed.

These 20 Republicans voted with Democrats to block the censure of Adam Schiff

WASHINGTON D.C. – U.S. government for special counsel Robert Mueller's investigation into Schiff, D-Calif., failed on Wednesday (June 14, 2023) after 20 Republicans broke with their own party to join Democrats in a motion to table the resolution.

Rep. Anna Paulina Luna, R-Fla., a member of the right-wing House Freedom Caucus, sought to censure Schiff for alleging collusion between Donald Trump and Russia during the 2016 presidential election. But the House voted 225-196 to table the resolution and defeat the effort to censure Schiff.

The failed resolution also intended to fine Schiff \$16 million, approximately half the amount it cost the

U.S. government for special counsel Robert Mueller's investigation into Trump's alleged ties to Russia.

In a scathing dissent, Neil Gorsuch compared the Navajo Nation's plight to the experience of 'any American who has spent time at the Department of Motor Vehicles'



- The Supreme Court ruled 5-4 that the US is not required to secure water for the Navajo Nation.
- Justice Neil Gorsuch wrote a dissent comparing the plight of the Navajos to waiting at the DMV.
- The Navajo *"have tried it all,"* he wrote. *"At each turn, they have received the same answer: 'Try again.'"*

Supreme Court Justice Neil Gorsuch wrote an impassioned dissent comparing the Navajo Nation's fight over water rights to the experience of *"any American who has spent time at the Department of Motor Vehicles."*

"The Navajo have waited patiently for someone, anyone, to help them,

only to be told (repeatedly) that they have been standing in the wrong line and must try another," Gorsuch wrote.

The high court ruled 5-4 in Arizona v. Navajo Nation on Thursday that under an 1868 treaty, the US is not required to secure water for the Navajo Nation.

Specifically, Justice Brett Kavanaugh, who delivered the majority

opinion, argued that the Navajo Nation was asking the federal government to take "affirmative steps to secure water for the Navajos."

But Gorsuch wrote in his dissent that the majority "rejects a request the Navajo Nation never made."

Instead, he wrote, "the relief the Tribe seeks is far more modest."

The Navajo "have a simple ask: They want the United States to identify the water rights it holds for

them," he wrote. "And if the United States has misappropriated the Navajo's water rights, the Tribe asks it to formulate a plan to stop doing so prospectively."

Gorsuch, who was nominated by then President Donald Trump in 2017, has a long history of ruling in favor of Indigenous rights. And at 26 pages, his dissent in Arizona v. Navajo Nation was twice as long as the majority opinion.

Explained: What Is Cultural Appropriation



Cultural appropriation is when a majority group takes something from the culture of the minority group without giving them proper recognition or credit. So, what is culture? Culture is the ideas, customs and social behaviour (*behavior*) of a particular group or society. So, culture appropriation is when that culture of another society is represented in an exploitative, disrespectful or stereotypical way.

For example, in festivals like Coachella where new trends are celebrated in festival fashion which included the use of Native American warbonnets were worn as headdresses. In Native American countries, warbonnets are worn only by the community leaders on special occasions but, in Coachella its worn as a fashion headpiece which makes it lose its cultural significance making in cultural appropriation.

Cultural Appreciations Vs Cultural Appropriation: Cultural appreciation is described as the honouring (*honoring*) of another culture through exploration and seeking an understanding as a way to honour (*honor*) that culture and beliefs. They seek to understand the culture more deeply to broaden their perspective and connect with others cross-culturally.

Appropriation differs from it as it is simply taking one aspect of a minority culture and using it to fulfil your own interests. Appropriation is the purchasing of a jewellery (jewelry) that has a very significant meaning to a culture and wearing it as a fashion piece without understanding the deeper meaning behind it.

Federal court delivers major blow to Biden’s radical equity agenda

The Biden administration’s so-called “equity agenda” suffered a major defeat in federal court recently. In a lawsuit challenging the Minority Business Development Agency (MBDA) – a new federal agency dedicated to helping only certain preferred racial groups – a federal judge ruled that the Biden administration cannot discriminate based on race.

Historic Arizona mining town backs copper project on land that Native American groups say

MY VIEW: Their has been a lot of questionable environmental waivers and political support for this venture that will allow a foreign corporation to control the largest deposit of copper in the world. Growing up in a mining family that goes back generations, Mayor Mila Besich knew Oak Flat as the place where she attended union picnics as a girl and stood in a clearing to hear the World Series on her radio.

Now, Besich is overseeing Superior's fight to build a new copper project at Oak Flat amid worries about the town's economic future.

Today, the national forest land in the heart of Arizona's "Copper Corridor" is scattered with 20 rustic campsites amid ancient oaks and a hand-painted sign that reads: "Protect Oak Flat, Holy Land." Buried deep underground is the world's third-largest deposit of copper ore, big enough to yield 40 billion pounds (18 billion kilograms) of the metal over 60 years.

Resolution Copper Mining, a joint subsidiary of UK and Australian mining giants Rio Tinto and BHP, hopes

to build one of the world's largest underground copper mines at the site outside Superior, about 70 miles (113 kilometers) east of Phoenix. Managing partner Rio Tinto says the mine could satisfy a quarter of growing U.S. demand for copper used in electric vehicles and smartphones.

Resolution began the permitting process nearly a decade ago, but the project has been delayed amid legal and political wrangling between U.S. agencies and the nonprofit Apache Stronghold, which challenges a planned land swap that would make the project possible.

The full U.S. 9th District Court of Appeals is considering Apache Stronghold's request to permanently halt the project, but the only thing stopping it now is the lack of a new environmental impact statement.

Moms for Liberty emerges as a force in the 2024 U.S. presidential election



PHILADELPHIA (Reuters) -Top rivals for the 2024 Republican presidential nomination on Friday addressed the **national conference of Moms for Liberty**, appealing to the conservative

parents-rights advocacy group with vows to bolster education and keep discussion of gender identity out of the classroom.

"Don't mess with America's moms," former President Donald Trump told the crowd in Philadelphia, calling the group a *"grassroots juggernaut."*

The appearance of Trump and rivals Ron DeSantis and Nikki Haley at the summit served as a testament to the weight their campaigns are placing on race- and gender-based cultural issues related to education heading into next year's nominating contests.



Culture war issues have animated parts of the Republican base, and the Republican rivals are hoping to appeal to parents of school-age children, particularly suburban women, an important voting bloc in U.S. presidential elections'

"You know what they want?" he said. *"They want peace. They want lower taxes. They want good education."*

Trump vowed to *"take historic action to defeat the toxic poison of gender ideology to restore the timeless truth that God created two genders, male and female."*

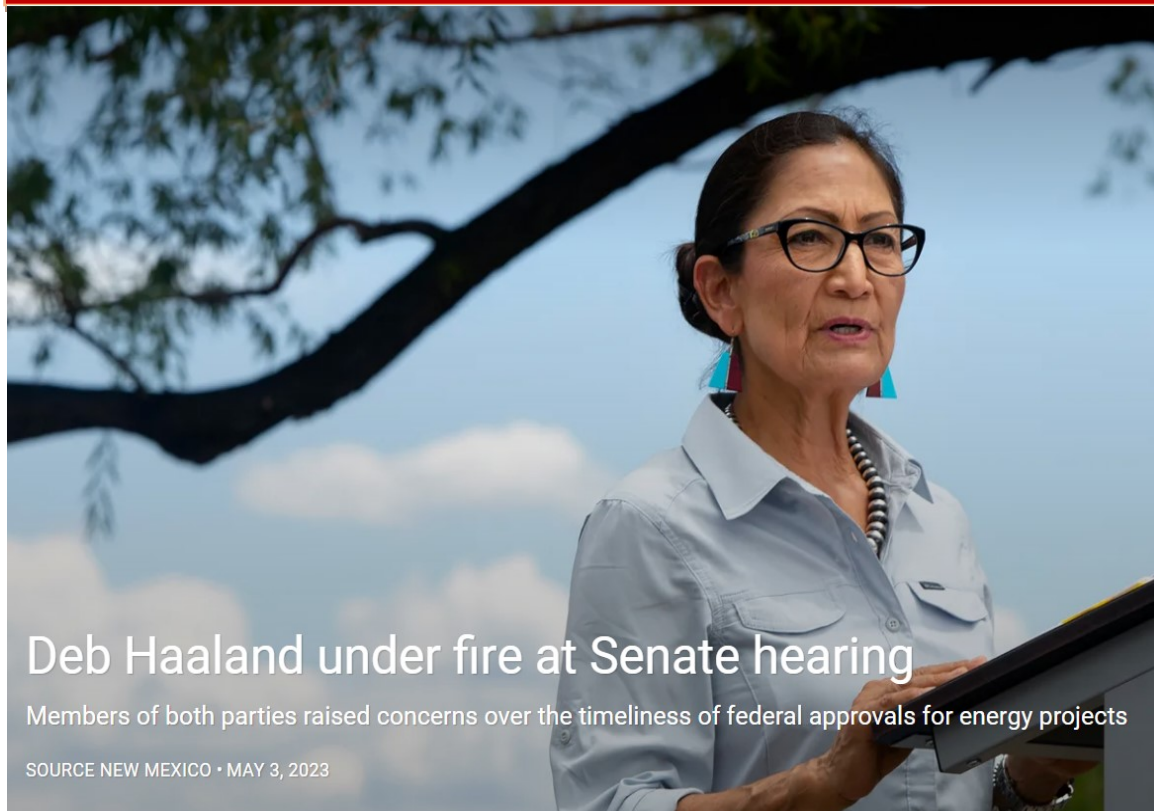

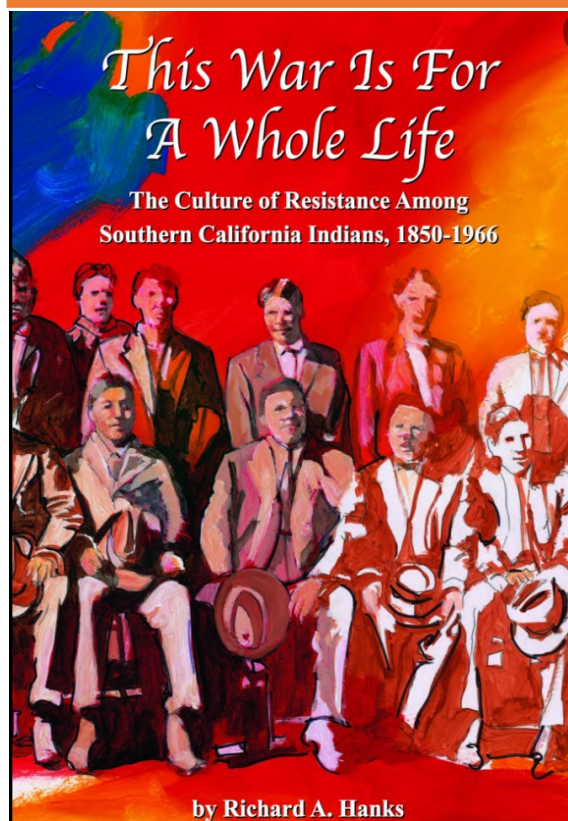
Members of the U.S. Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee used a Tuesday hearing on the Interior Department's fiscal 2024 budget to voice their displeasure with the administration's energy production policies to Secretary Deb Haaland.

The strongest criticism came from Republicans on the panel, though Chairman Joe Manchin III, a centrist West Virginia Democrat with ties to the state's coal industry, also expressed disappointment with how the department has managed oil and gas production. Members of both parties raised concerns over the timeliness of federal approvals for energy projects.

The department is still lagging on oil and gas initiatives required under the climate law and the 2021 bipartisan infrastructure law, Manchin said.

"In my view, Interior's failure to comply with laws Congress has passed is not a question of funding," he said. "It's a question of misplaced priorities, or perhaps a willingness to ignore certain requirements."

The Mission Indian Federation (MIF) was Southern California's most popular and long-lived grassroots political organization.

Between 1919 and 1965, its membership wrestled with some of the most difficult political and legal questions of the 20th century.

Mission Indian Federation's slogan; "Human Rights and Home Rule"

This work follows the path of Native leadership, resistance and adaptation that provided direction during times of confusion, showed strength when outside forces seemed overwhelming and inspired hope when days seemed darkest.

Resistance takes many shapes. For Indians of Southern California, it ranged from escape when possible to violence and assassination when forced. Acts of civil disobedience incorporated blocking roads to blocking legislation.

They lobbied in the halls of Congress and argued in courtrooms while they struggled to secure their lands, natural resources and respect for themselves and their way of life.

Whether with guns or law books they fought for the rights guaranteed through treaties which were so callously discarded by indifferent or hostile federal and state governments. However, they never surrendered their beliefs or their homes easily to the Euro-American invaders of their land."

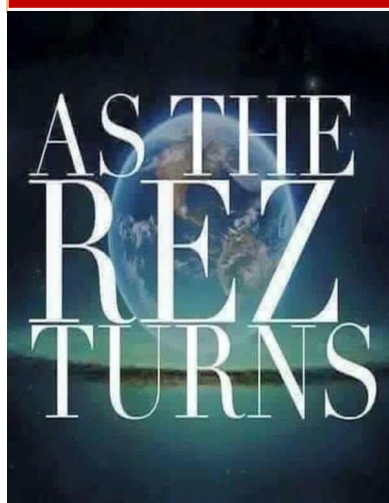
Carey Terrance (Mohawk) taken by Anaheim Ducks in second round of NHL draft
