CALIFORNIA: Newsom & Comrades to Add More Gas Taxes

The new proposed gas tax is call mileage tax at 3 cent a mile which doesn't seem like much at first glance. But, added to the **59.4 cents** in state excise tax that increase over 2 cent a gallon on July 1, 2024: among the highest in the nation 18.4 cents in federal excise tax 23 cents for California's cap-and-trade program to lower greenhouse gas emissions 18 cents for the state's low-carbon fuel programs 2 cents for underground gas storage fees. And **4.4 sales tax**. We can expect these taxes to edge up.

The proposed 3 cents a mile adds up to an average of **45 cents a gallon** based on an average of 15 mile per gallon which will total \$2.97 a gallon TAX.

And the gas taxes will continue to increase until we elect leaders that care about the working people, not the Socialist ideology. Until then it's \$7-\$8 a gal.

Salmon are intertwined with our cultural identity and religion – what it means to be Yurok. Our ceremonies celebrate the annual migrations of salmon, and the harvest and preservation of salmon is central to community activities that have persisted for generations."*

In late January, Gov. Gavin Newsom released a strategic plan aimed at helping restore California's dwindling salmon population. The Salmon Strategy for a Hotter, Drier Future, lays out a plan for ensuring that California salmon and the communities who rely on them have a future in our changed climate. The Yurok Tribe applauded the Newsom administration and stood with the governor when this plan was released, and we now urge Governor Newsom to set in motion his plan by signing AB1272. ... "

In sports, every era seems to introduce a new icon that set higher standard. And within the infinity of the given sport an athlete will influence the sport at unimageable level. It is also

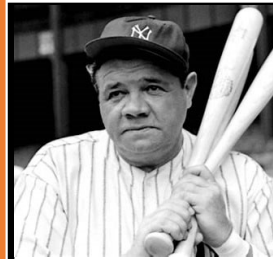

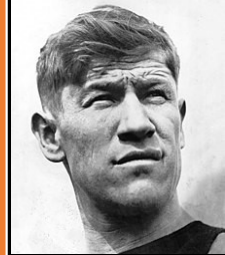
All that said, the second half of the Women’s Professional Basketball season is going to be something to see.

Again, listed below are few sports icons.

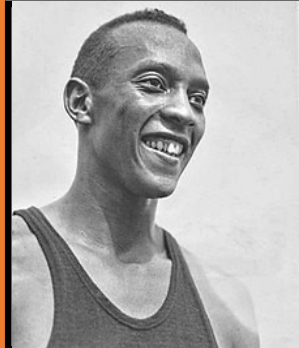


Let’s start with **George Heman "Babe" Ruth** (February 6, 1895 – August 16, 1948) was an American professional baseball player whose career in Major League Baseball (MLB) spanned 22 seasons, from 1914 through 1935. Nicknamed **“The Bambino”**.

Billie Jean King (born Nov. 22, 1943), is the former world No. 1 tennis player. King won 39 Grand Slam titles: 12 in singles, 16 in women’s doubles, and 11 in mixed doubles. She was a member of the victorious U.S. team in seven Federation Cups and nine Wightman Cups. **She made women’s tennis recognized on the world stage.** She is from Long Beach, California.



James Francis Thorpe (Sac and Fox (Sauk): May 22 or 28, 1887 – March 28, 1953) was an American Indian athlete and Olympic gold medalist for the United States in the Olympics. Considered one of the most versatile athletes of modern sports, he won two Olympic gold medals in the **1912 Summer Olympics** (one in the **classic pentathlon** and the other in the **decathlon**). He also played **football** (collegiate and professional), professional baseball, and professional basketball. Here is the irony, Thorpe as an American Indian was considered a **“Ward of the U.S. Government,”** and was granted American citizenship on June 2, 1924.



James Cleveland 'Jesse' Owens (September 12, 1913 – March 31, 1980) was an American track and field athlete who won four gold medals at the **1936 Olympic Games**. Owens specialized in **the sprints and the long jump** and was recognized in his lifetime as **"perhaps the greatest and most famous athlete in track and field history"**. He set three world records and tied another, all in less than an hour, at the 1935 Big Ten track meet in **Ann Arbor, Michigan**, a feat that has never been equaled and has been called **"the greatest 45 minutes ever in sport"**.

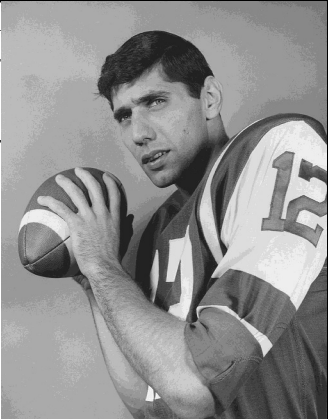
He achieved international fame at the 1936 Summer Olympics in Berlin, Germany, by winning four gold medals: 100 meters, long jump, 200 meters, and 4 × 100-meter relay. He was the most successful athlete at the Games and, as a **black American man, was credited with "single-handedly crushing Hitler's myth of Aryan supremacy"**.

Joseph William Namath born May 31, 1943, nicknamed **"Broadway Joe"**, the former football quarterback played in the American Football League (AFL) and National Football League (NFL) for 13 seasons. He spent the majority of his career with the New York Jets.

Namath cemented his legacy in 1969 when he guaranteed his heavy underdog Jets would win Super Bowl III before defeating the NFL’s Baltimore Colts in one of the greatest sports upsets of all time. The Super Bowl victory was the first for an AFL franchise, helping dismiss notions that its teams were inferior to the NFL’s and demonstrating they would enter the merger as equals.

Namath received Super Bowl MVP honors in the game, while also becoming the first quarterback to win both a college national championship and a major professional championship. He was inducted to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1985.

I know many football fans will disagree with my views on Namath at that time pro football wasn’t ready for **"Broadway Joe"**, who single handedly saved pro football from it’s self. He was the **Muhammad Ali** of pro football.



Michael Jeffrey Jordan (born February 17, 1963), As a professional **basketball** player. He played 15 seasons in the National Basketball Association (NBA) between 1984 and 2003, winning six NBA championships with the Chicago Bulls. He was integral in popularizing basketball and the NBA around the world in the 1980s and 1990s, becoming a global cultural icon. His profile on the NBA website states, **"By acclamation, Michael Jordan is the greatest basketball player of all time."**

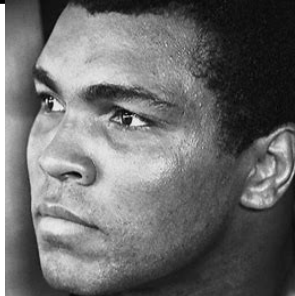
Eldrick Tont "Tiger" Woods (born December 30, 1975) is an American professional golfer. He is tied for first in PGA Tour wins, ranks second in men’s major championships, and holds numerous golf records. Woods is widely regarded as one of the greatest golfers of all time and is one of the most famous athletes in modern history.

Although there is a lot of great golf players that came before and after Tiger Woods, none inspired the world of golf as he did.



Muhammad Ali born **Cassius Marcellus Clay Jr.**; January 17, 1942 – June 3, 2016) was an American professional boxer and activist. Nicknamed **"the Greatest"**, he is regarded as one of the most significant sports figures of the 20th century and is often regarded as the greatest heavyweight boxer of all time. He held the Ring magazine heavyweight title from 1964 to 1970. He was the undisputed champion from 1974 to 1978 and the WBA and Ring heavyweight champion from 1978 to 1979. In 1999, he was named Sportsman of the Century by Sports Illustrated and the Sports Personality of the Century by the BBC.

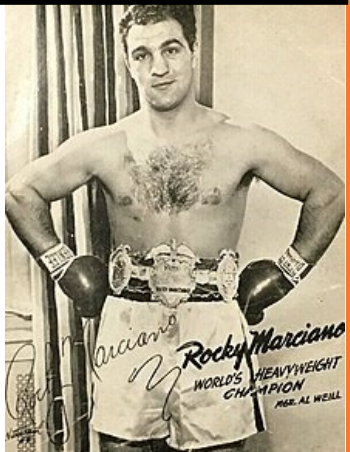
Comedian, Billy Christal was one of Ali’s closest friends and told the world at Ali’s funeral how strong he was in his religious beliefs and how at peace he was with himself/ He also told a story of how Ali supported their friendship. Christal said that they were planning to meet the next morning for breakfast and Ali suggested the local Golf Country Club and Christal told him that he wasn’t allowed to go there and Ali asked why and Christal told him that because he was a Jew and Ali said **“You’re my friend, if you can’t go there I’ll never go there again either.”** The irony of their friendship is Billy Christal is a Jew and Muhammad Ali was a Muslim. Ali was not only a great boxer, he was a great man and his real message to us, in my view is; **“Let God into your heart and peace will prevail.”**

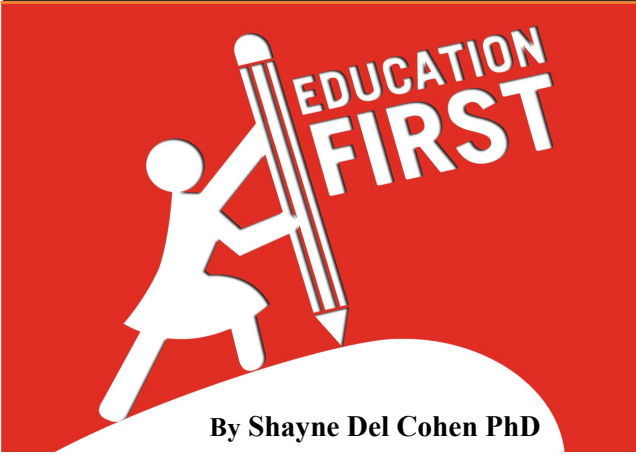


Yes, there has been a lot of great athletes in all the sports listed herein however, a large number of them had the impact on the sport as the few named herein. One excellent example is Babe Ruth hit 60 home runs within a 154 game season schedule In 1927 and Roger Maris hit 61 home runs in a 164 game schedule while very few fans remember him.

Still another boxer that many believe to be the greatest heavyweight at 5 ft 10 in and 185 pounds is **Rocco Francis Marchegiano** (September 1, 1923 – August 31, 1969; Italian, better known as **Rocky Marciano**. He had **49 fights and 49 wins with 43 KOs**. **Marciano** competed from 1947 to 1955. He held the world heavyweight championship from 1952 to 1956, and remains the only heavyweight champion to finish his career undefeated Other great boxers like Joe Louis. Jack Dempsey, Sugar Ray Robinson and Julio Cesar Chavez are to be remembered, but **Rocky Marciano** stands alone.

While **“Cage Fighting”** is a mixture of boxing, wrestling and marital arts Ken Shamrock one of best at 220 pound and a shade under 6 ft.

“Meeting the Challenges of the Ages is Key to the Survival of the Aboriginal people”



Slavery reached the epitome of world dominance during the “Age of Agriculture”, especially in US history. The economy of the south is well known to have been built and dependent upon slave labor, but in actuality, slavery was also practiced above the Mason-Dixon line and had been a part of tribal practices throughout the continent.

Founding fathers debated this practice and the 1789 Constitution bore a section forbidding slave trading by 1808. Although there is documentation of some ships still arriving after this date, slave owners merely shifted to domestic slave breeding rather than importation after the legislated date. The mixing of DNA became a lucrative pastime.

Entering into “The Industrial Age”, some refer to factory and other labor intense production as “slave labor”. Working conditions and recompense became comparable to the legacies of field workers. The labor movement (and its bloody history) was a result out of which many now enjoy a 40-hr work week, decent pay and a variety of benefits.

However, we are now in “The Age

of Information”. The Agricultural Age may have obliterated an ancient profile of slavery; the Industrial Age mechanized many traditional functions, causing labor to require new skills and organization. What are the challenges of this new age?

A 2022 survey by Junior Achievement USA showed that 60% of U.S. high school students were more interested in starting their own business instead of working traditional jobs. The same article featured one of many students who have started their own business while still in school.

This is of course is facilitated by all the new tools available: internet for marketing, apps for picture taking, accounting, etc. Education, health care, limited product generation, all kinds of services and entertainment can be made, marketed and profitable in many new ways.

While news may decry many stores closing, it is often a function of a long-time business owner being “tired” and kids not wanting the business or a simple business decision not to pay rental of space and upkeep, lease agreements requiring

a percentage of profit, or the ability to operate efficiently with less staff. The latter does require Age of Information knowledge of a whole set of new tools and processes. It also provides a new landscape of possibilities for any idea.

What may have been “science fiction” in the past is now reality. One is literally plugged into the world - and all its little worlds - at a moment’s notice.

Though exhilarating, it can also be overwhelming. And at this point, only a twenty four years into it, one can still opt out of it, choosing to live one’s life in the reality into which they were born.

Traditionally, tribal leaders used the maxim “for seven generations” hence in making decisions. Many of those decisions came from a tradition and natural world that does not necessarily exist now. The rapid adoption of cell phones and everything associated bears testimony to this.

The challenge, therefore for tribal councils, is producing policy and operations that reflect the vision of the “younger generation” whose re-

ality may be completely different from those that were born into times of no electricity, no internal potable water sources, no wireless connections and no economic control over destiny.

We cannot even imagine the world of seven generations hence, although one can see the signs of population living in thirty-story buildings, eating cell-grown products, losing ties to the land, etc.

What does your community envision?

Take the time to invite everyone five years and older to provide their vision of the future. It will be different for each age-group but should provide a wide swath of subjects to include in your planning and setting vision. Take the wisdom of seven generations past and be the connector to the seven generations coming.

And record the journey. We have the tools through which you can communicate to future centuries. You may not be able to physically time-travel, but your thoughts, debates and actions can.

Country singer Dolly Parton wrote the songs "I Will Always Love You" and "Jolene" on the same night. When the first song was at the top of the charts in 1974, Elvis wanted to record his own version of the song. Dolly was interested until Colonel

Tom Parker, Elvis' manager, said that it was standard procedure that when the king of rock and roll covered a song - half of the rights to that song would go to him in the future. She refused it. *"I said, 'I'm really, really sorry' and cried all night. It was terrible for me, on the one hand, it's Elvis. People told me: 'You are crazy.' It's Elvis Presley...' but I just couldn't do it. Something told me in my heart not to do it and I didn't. I know he would rock with that song. But I couldn't. And then Whitney Houston came along with her version and I made enough money from the rights to buy Dollywood."* She grew up in severe poverty and no one famous has done more for the education of the poor than her. In 1990, the percentage of students who did not graduate from high school in her hometown was over 30%. She introduced the "Buddy Program", where all high school graduates received a nice sum when they graduated. It wasn't just a waste of money, she personally came and explained the concept to them - everyone should find a buddy, and whoever doesn't succeed she will find one for them. Everyone had to sign that they will graduate and do everything in their power to ensure that their

buddy also graduates. She taught young people about friendship and helping. The number of school dropouts dropped to below 6% and has remained so until today. When 900 families lost their homes in the 2016 fires, she paid each family \$1,000 for the next five months. When she came to the bank to finish the paperwork, she gave each family another \$5,000 to find. A total of nine million dollars. Also, her work - Imagination Library from 1995, was inspired by her realization that young people in rural areas and poor families already fall behind when they start school and that this prevents them from pursuing higher education. The goal of her program was for every child in her district to receive one book, once a month, from birth to school, completely free of charge, without any conditions. It started as an initiative in her hometown and has spread to a huge number of countries around the world. By 2018, over 100 million books were distributed in this way. She is also known for her witty statements, at the beginning of her career she said-*"I'm not offended by jokes about stupid blondes because I know I'm not stupid... and I'm not really blonde either."* Credit goes to the respective owners

In the course of my lifetime I have lived in two distinct cultures. I was born into a culture that lived in communal houses. My grandfather’s house was eighty feet long. It was called a smoke house, and it stood down by the beach along the inlet. All my grandfather’s sons and their families lived in this dwelling. Their sleeping apartments were separated by blankets made of bull rush weeds, but one open fire in the middle served the cooking needs of all. In houses like these, throughout the tribe, people learned to live with one another; learned to respect the rights of one another. And children shared the thoughts of the adult world and found themselves surrounded by aunts and uncles and cousins who loved them and did not threaten them. My father was born in such a house and learned from infancy how to love people and be at home with them. And beyond this acceptance of one another there was a deep respect for everything in nature that surrounded them. My father loved the earth and all its creatures. The earth was his second mother. The earth and everything it contained was a gift from See-see-am...and the way to thank this great spirit was to use his gifts with respect. I remember, as a little boy, fishing with him up Indian River and I can still see him as the sun rose above the mountain top in the early morning...I can see him standing by the water’s edge with his arms raised above his head while he softly moaned...”*Thank you, thank you.*” It left a deep impression on my young mind. And I shall never forget his disappointment when once he caught me gaffing for *fish “just for the fun of it.” “My son”* he said, *“The Great*

Spirit gave you those fish to be your brothers, to feed you when you are hungry. You must respect them. You must not kill them just for the fun of it.” This then was the culture I was born into and for some years the only one I really knew or tasted. This is why I find it hard to accept many of the things I see around me. I see people living in smoke houses hundreds of times bigger than the one I knew. But the people in one apartment do not even know the people in the next and care less about them. It is also difficult for me to understand the deep hate that exists among people. It is hard to understand a culture that justifies the killing of millions in past wars, and it at this very moment preparing bombs to kill even greater numbers. It is hard for me to understand a culture that spends more on wars and weapons to kill, than it does on education and welfare to help and develop. It is hard for me to understand a culture that not only hates and fights his brothers but even attacks nature and abuses her. I see my white brothers going about blotting out nature from his cities. I see him strip the hills bare, leaving ugly wounds on the face of mountains. I see him tearing things from the bosom of mother earth as though she were a monster, who refused to share her treasures with him. I see him throw poison in the waters, indifferent to the life he kills there; and he chokes the air with deadly fumes. My white brother does many things well for he is more clever than my people but I wonder if he has ever really learned to love at all. Perhaps he only loves the things that are outside and beyond him. And this is, of course, not love at all, for man must

love all creation or he will love none of it. Man must love fully or he will become the lowest of the animals. It is the power to love that makes him the greatest of them all...for he alone of all animals is capable of love. Love is something you and I must have. We must have it because our spirit feeds upon it. We must have it because without it we become weak and faint. Without love our self esteem weakens. Without it our courage fails. Without love we can no longer look out confidently at the world. Instead we turn inwardly and begin to feed upon our own personalities and little by little we destroy ourselves. You and I need the strength and joy that comes from knowing that we are loved. With it we are creative. With it we march tirelessly. With it, and with it alone, we are able to sacrifice for others. There have been times when we all wanted so desperately to feel a reassuring hand upon us... there have been lonely times when we so wanted a strong arm around us...I cannot tell you how deeply I miss my wife’s presence when I return from a trip. Her love was my greatest joy, my strength, my greatest blessing. I am afraid my culture has little to offer yours. But my culture did prize friendship and companionship. It did not look on privacy as a thing to be clung to, for privacy builds walls and walls promote distrust. My culture lived in a big family community, and from infancy people learned to live with others. My culture did not prize the hoarding of private possessions, in fact, to hoard was a shameful thing to do among my people. The Indian looked on all things in nature as belonging to him and he expected to



share them with others and to take only what he needed. Everyone likes to give as well as receive. No one wishes only to receive all the time. We have taken something from your culture...I wish you had taken something from our culture...for there were some beautiful and good things in it. Soon it will be too late to know my culture, for integration is upon us and soon we will have no values but yours. Already many of our young people have forgotten the old ways. And many have been shamed of their Indian ways by scorn and ridicule. My culture is like a wounded deer that has crawled away into the forest to bleed and die alone. The only thing that can truly help us is genuine love. You must truly love, be patient with us and share with us. And we must love you—with a genuine love that forgives and forgets...a love that gives the terrible sufferings your culture brought ours when it swept over us like a wave crashing along a beach...with a love that forgets and lifts up its head and sees in your eyes an answering love of trust and acceptance. This is brotherhood...anything less is not worthy of the name. I have spoken

Arctic Iñupiat Continue To Read

A nonprofit group representing Arctic Iñupiat communities in Alaska’s North Slope Borough is suing the Bureau of Land Management over newly implemented regulations for the National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska (NPR-A).

The group, Voice of the Arctic Iñupiat (VOICE) alleges in the lawsuit that the federal agency failed to adequately consult with the North Slope Iñupiat during the rulemaking process, and **the rule changes will jeopardize the tribes’ economic well-being.**

The Borough is a county-like government in Alaska comprising 8 communities across an area roughly the size of Minnesota. The Borough sits within the NPR-A, one of the largest oil reserves in the country. More than 95 percent of the Borough’s tax revenues stem from property taxes leveraged against oil and gas development. If those revenues are impacted by stymied development, it’s going to harm tribal members, VOICE asserts.

The lawsuit centers on a revision of regulations governing NPR-A that aims to balance **oil-and-gas development with environmental protections.** As implemented, the new rules ban development on roughly 10.6 million acres. The ban comes with additional restrictions on building roads and other infrastructure in the NPR-A, per the lawsuit.

In addition, the rule establishes a framework to designate and manage “special areas” with strict regulations on oil and gas development. That could further limit oil and gas growth on an additional 13 million acres, according to a spokesperson for VOICE.

“Taking 13 million acres off the table for development poses a real threat to the services that the North Slope Borough provides,” Kate Wolgemuth, program and government affairs manager of VOICE, told *Tribal Business News*. **“The economic opportunity out here is very low, and the cost of living is very high. When we lose the ability to provide that support, we lose jobs, and then we lose people because they move away, and then we lose our culture because they take that with them.”**

In effect, the Bureau of Land Management, an agency within the U.S. Department of the Interior, “shut out” dissenting voices from speaking against the finalized rule, Wolgemuth said.

“We knocked on every door that anybody ever told us to go to, and it has been an extremely frustrating process,” Wolgemuth said. **“To this day we don’t still have clear answers on who made the decision to create this rule, move forward with this rule, or even why it was created.”**

Subsequent attempts to contact the Department of the Interior directly were unproductive. The tribe met with lower officials who couldn’t explain or impact the decision or “stonewalling” from Interior Secretary Deb Haaland, Wolgemuth said.

“To say that we were getting the runaround is like an understatement,” Wolgemuth said. The Department of Interior declined to comment on this story.

In a statement, VOICE President Nagruk Hacharek said **“The North Slope Iñupiat had been “silenced” by the responses from the Bureau of Land Management.”**

The U.S. Department of the Treasury announced \$65 million in funding to support Native American small business and entrepreneurship through the State Small Business Credit Initiative (SSBCI).

The announcement on July 2 marks the fourth SSBCI funding approval over the past year. The initial announcement was in June 2023, followed by subsequent announcements during the White House Tribal Nations Summit in December 2023 and the Reservation Economic Summit (RES) in March 2024.

To date, the total SSBCI capital commitment to tribal governments has reached \$330 million, supporting 93 Tribes. Funding for SSBCI comes from a \$10 billion pot of money under the American Rescue Plan Act and includes a total of \$500 million set aside for tribes.

The funds are intended to provide capital and technical assistance to help tribal governments create programs that offer funding to tribal small

businesses, including equity/venture capital, loan participation, loan guarantees, collateral support, and capital access programs.

Listed are a few Tribes funded this year.

Mesa Grande Band of Diegueno Mission Indians of the Mesa Grande Reservation: Approved for up to \$5,307,619. They will operate one equity funds program to provide affordable access to capital for pre-seed, seed, and early-stage small businesses owned by the consortium Tribes and their Tribal citizens, targeting investment capital in sectors such as technology and renewable energy.

Muscogee (Creek) Nation, Oklahoma: Approved for up to \$20,168,057. They will operate three programs: one loan participation program (LPP), one collateral support program (CSP), and one equity direct program. These programs will provide critical access to capital for traditionally underserved small businesses, serving a wide variety of industries and targeting financing

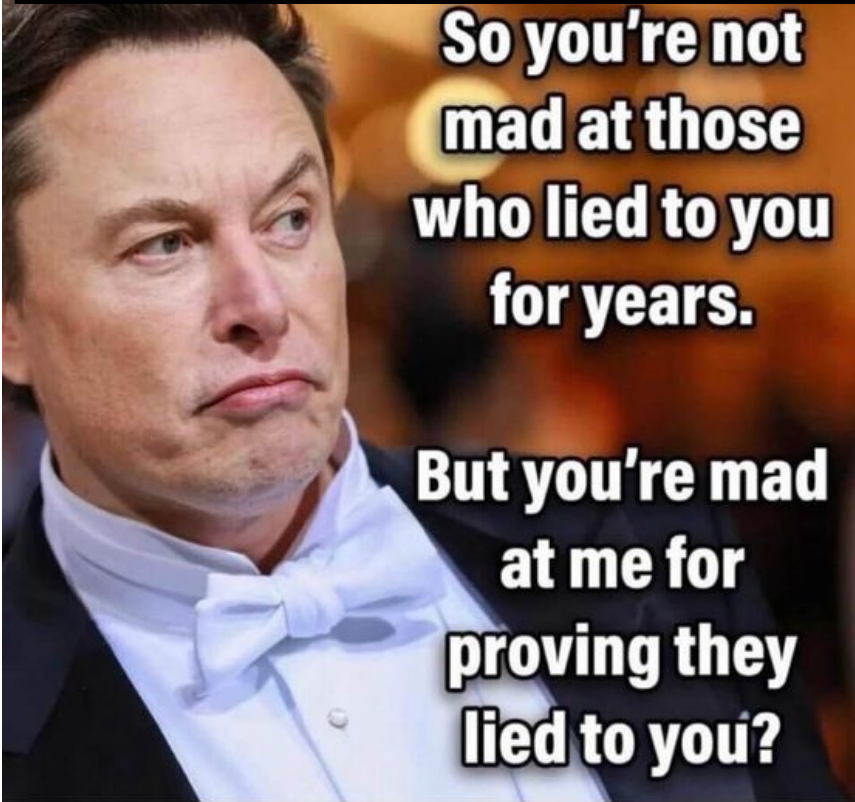
for start-ups, with the goal of diversifying the Nation's economic base, creating more employment opportunities for Tribal citizens, and establishing relationships with lenders.

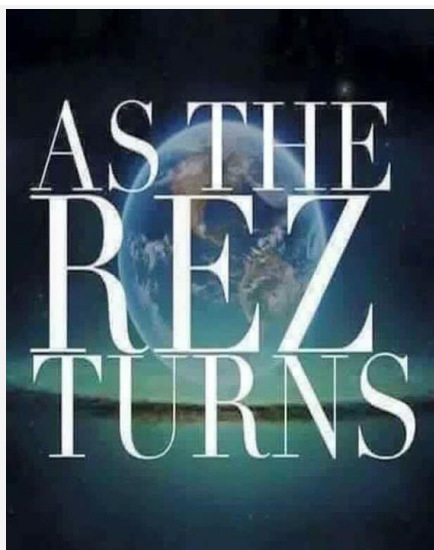
The Manzanita Band of Diegueno Mission Indians of the Manzanita Reservation, California: Approved for up to \$619,889. They will operate one loan participation program (LPP) to provide affordable access to capital for qualified construction and working capital borrowing needs of Tribally owned enterprises and small businesses owned by tribal members, with a focus on the clean energy, education, elder care, and health sectors.

The funds are intended to provide capital and technical assistance to help tribal governments create programs that offer funding to tribal small businesses, including equity/venture capital, loan participation, loan guarantees, collateral support, and capital access programs.
