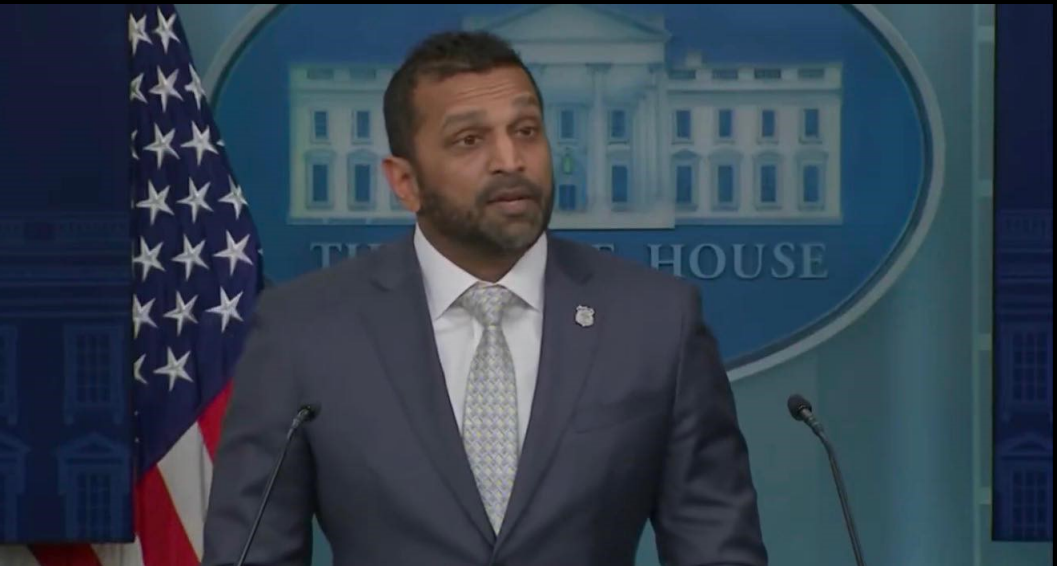

Blue state judge releases murder suspect without making him pay a cent in bail, despite gang allegations

A [judge in California](#) is facing criticism after releasing a murder suspect and alleged gang member without posting a single cent in bail. Vicente Aguilera-Chavez and Agustin Sandoval were arrested in January in connection with a June 8, 2017, shooting that left a 21-year-old dead and a 24-year-old injured, according to [KTVU](#). Aguilera was charged with murder following an alleged gang-related shooting in a Sunnyvale, California, nightclub parking lot, according to the [Mercury News](#). Both men were charged in the death of 21-year-old Edu Veliz-Salgado. A 24-year-old was also injured during the alleged shooting, but survived. The case went cold until 2024, when detectives with the Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety identified the suspects in 2024. Judge Hector Ramon released Aguilera on his own recognizance during an Oct. 31 hearing, meaning he has to pay no bail, according to [NBC Bay Area](#). Aguilera completed a prison sentence in 2022 stemming from a burglary. *(Sunnyvale lies between San Jose & Cupertino in Santa Clara County)*

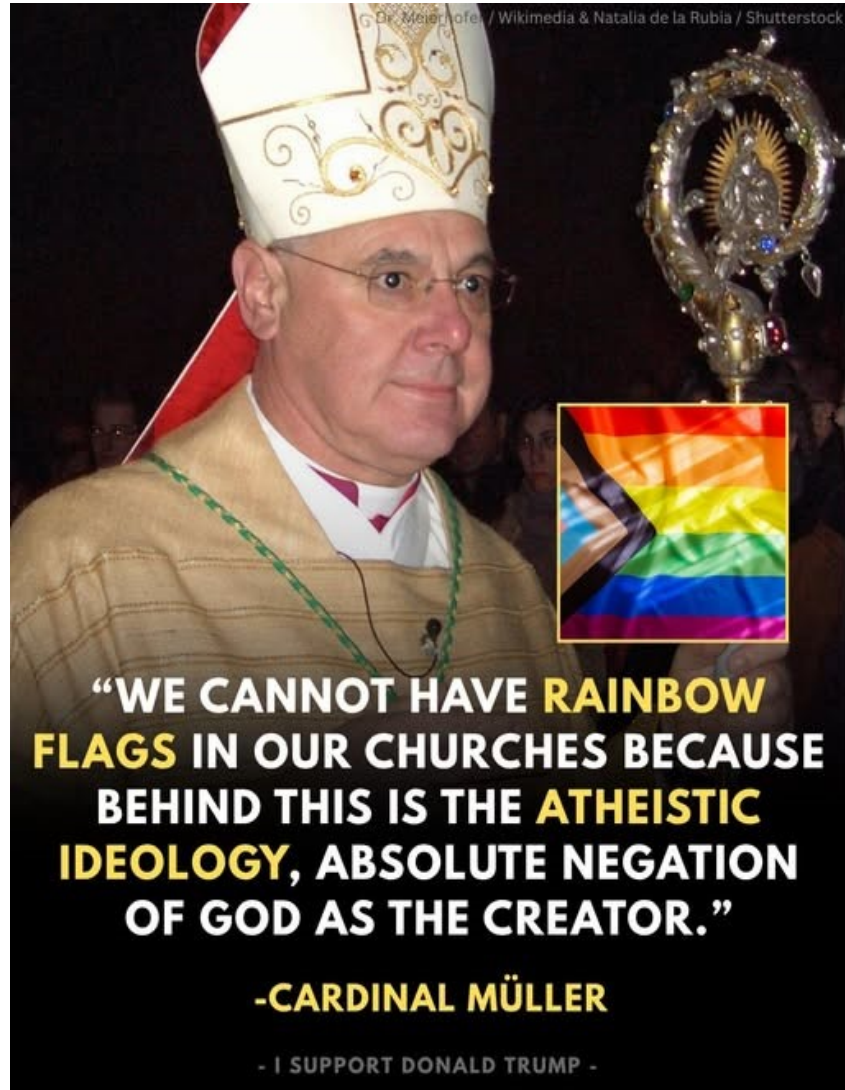

Judge that ordered release of 600 Chicago illegal immigrants slammed by DHS as activist putting lives at

A federal judge in Chicago has ordered the [Department of Homeland Security \(DHS\)](#) to release more than 600 illegal immigrants held at a suburban detention center, blasting the agency for "repeated, material violations" of a court-approved consent decree that limited who could be detained under U.S. immigration law.. U.S. District Judge [Jeffrey Cummings](#) ruled that more than 600 detainees being held at the [Broadview ICE facility](#) must be released *'on bond and into ICE's Alternatives to Detention (ATD) program'* by Nov. 21, citing what he called a *"pattern of unlawful arrests and confinement."* The order stems from [Margarito Castañon Nava v. DHS](#), a class-action lawsuit claiming that federal agents unlawfully detained hundreds of migrants who were not subject to mandatory detention or final removal orders, a direct violation of a 2021 Biden-era decree inherited by the Trump administration.

Joy Harjo: Her Heart Never Left the Rez

Joy Harjo once stood in a cold university hallway — broke, divorced, and clutching her baby. A professor looked at her with a dismissive smile and said, *“Native women don’t become poets.”* That single sentence burned in her chest. *“Then I’ll spend my life proving you wrong,”* she whispered to herself.

Born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, to the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, Joy grew up between beauty and pain. Her father, a jazz musician, filled their home with music — and anger. Her mother, gentle but strong, tried to hold the family together. When Joy’s stepfather’s violence became unbearable, she ran away at sixteen, alone and scared. *“I left because I wanted to live,”* she later said. She hitchhiked to Santa Fe and joined the Institute of American Indian Arts — the place that saved her. There, she learned that stories weren’t just memories — they were survival.

In her early twenties, she was a single mother with no home, sleeping on friends’ couches, working wherever she could. Nights were for sketching and trying to stay sane. Then one day, she read a poem by a Native writer — and it felt like lightning struck her soul. *“I didn’t know we could do that,”* she said, tears in her eyes. *“That we could use words to fight back.”*

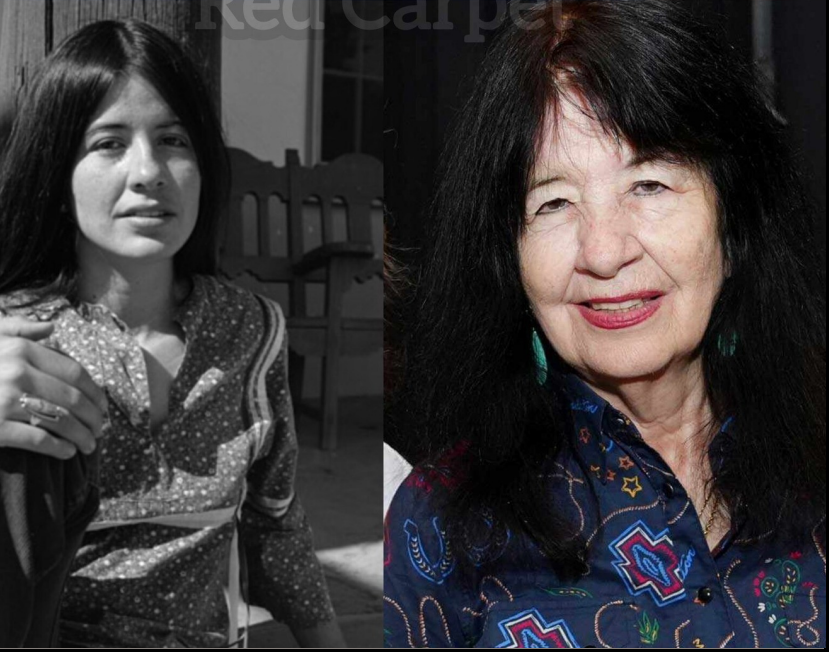
So she began to write — not for applause, but for healing. Her poems were bold, fierce, alive with rhythm and fire. *“I am not afraid to be beautiful,”* she wrote. *“I am not afraid to be wild.”* But the world wasn’t ready for her voice. Critics called her “too political.” Men shouted at her readings. Some told her to “go back to the reservation.” She didn’t flinch. *“If they can shout,”* she said, *“so can I.”*

She started performing her poems with a saxophone — the same instrument her father once played. Her voice and music merged into something sacred — a ceremony of resistance. Each note, each word, carried the spirits of her ancestors.

Years later, America could no longer ignore her. Joy Harjo became the first Native American U.S. Poet Laureate — the voice of a people who had been silenced for centuries. When the Library of Congress asked her to write a “patriotic” poem, she smiled and said, *“I’ll write one. But I’ll include the ghosts this country was built on.”*

Even in her triumph, she stayed humble. *“Every poem,”* she said softly, *“is a road back to myself.”*

Joy Harjo didn’t just write poetry — she transformed pain into power. The girl who once ran from violence became the woman who taught a nation how to listen. *“They told me my voice didn’t matter,”* she said. *“So I sang louder.”*

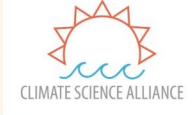

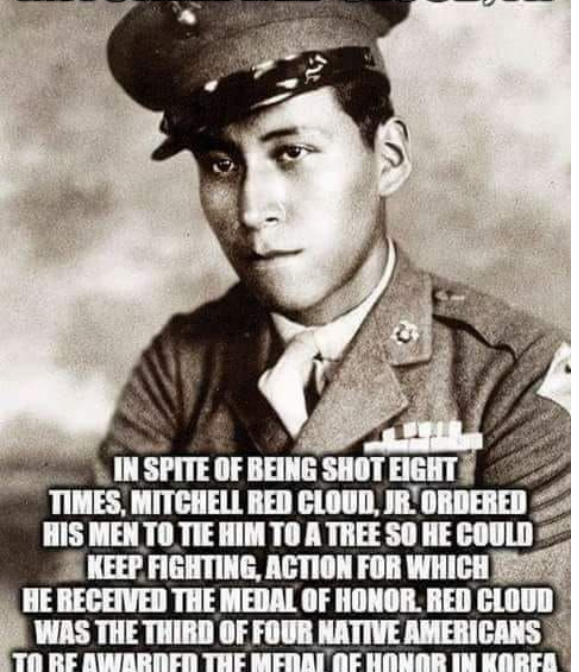

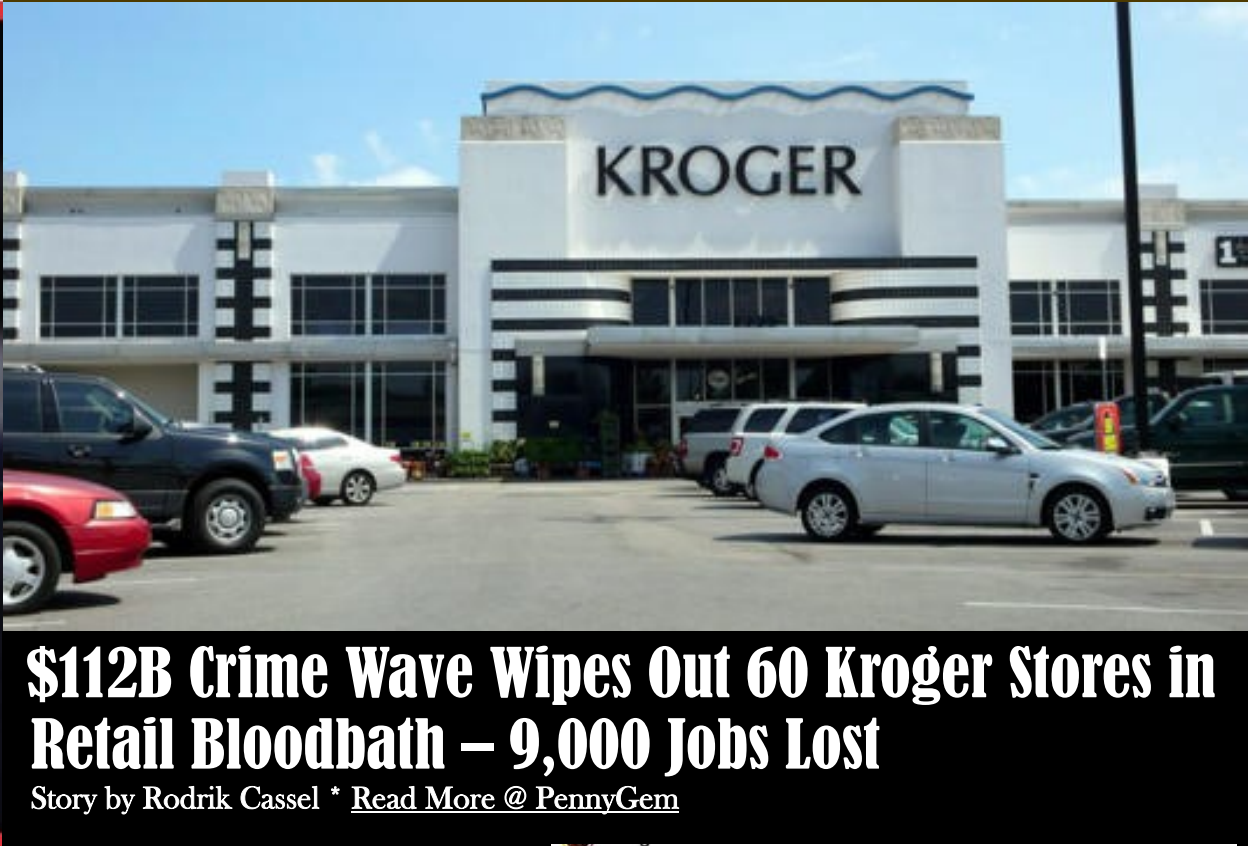

Warren Buffett's 4 Ideas to Fix Social Security for Good

Social Security is the bedrock of American retirement, but its long-term financial health is a persistent concern. As lawmakers debate the future of the program, legendary investor Warren Buffett has offered his characteristically pragmatic and straightforward insights on how to ensure its solvency for generations to come. Known for his no-nonsense approach to complex financial problems, Buffett's suggestions focus on fairness, shared responsibility, and common sense.

The core of the problem is simple: over time, the system is projected to pay out more in benefits than it collects in taxes, leading to a funding shortfall. While not on the verge of collapse, adjustments are needed to secure its future. Here are four ideas, based on Buffett's public comments and writings, that could help put Social Security on a sustainable path.

1. Remove the Social Security Maximum Taxable Earnings Cap
2. Give the Wealthiest Americans Lower Social Security Benefits
3. Gradually Raise the Full Retirement Age (FRA)
4. Modestly Increase the Social Security Payroll Tax Rate



Wilma Rudolph: An American Icon

At age 5, childhood polio took its toll on her. Doctors said she would never walk, no less run!

Doctors said she'd never walk—at 20, she became the fastest woman on Earth and made Olympic history.

Today would have been Wilma Rudolph's 85th birthday. And if you don't know her name, you're about to understand why you should.

June 23, 1940. Saint Bethlehem, Tennessee. A tiny town in the segregated South.

Wilma Glodean Rudolph came into the world weighing just 4.5 pounds—premature, fragile, fighting for every breath. She was the 20th of 22 children born to a railway porter and a housemaid who could barely afford to feed their family, let alone pay for medical care.

Most premature babies in 1940s rural Tennessee didn't survive. Wilma did. But survival was just the beginning of her fight.

Before she turned five, Wilma had battled pneumonia twice. Scarlet fever. Whooping cough. Measles. And then came the diagnosis that would define her childhood: polio.

The disease attacked her left leg, leaving it twisted and partially paralyzed. In an era before the polio vaccine, this was often a life sentence of immobility. For a poor Black family in Jim Crow Tennessee, the prognosis was even bleaker.

White hospitals wouldn't treat Black patients. The nearest hospital that would see Wilma was 50 miles away in Nashville. Her mother, Blanche, made that journey by bus twice a week for two years, bringing young Wilma for treatments that insurance didn't cover and they could barely afford.

At home, Wilma's siblings took turns massaging her twisted leg four times a day, every day, following the physical therapy routine the doctors had taught them. It was the only chance she had.

Doctors told Blanche what she probably already feared: Wilma would never walk normally. She'd need a leg brace and orthopedic shoe for life. Maybe crutches. Maybe a wheelchair eventually.

Blanche looked at her daughter and said simply, "We're going to work on this."

For six years, Wilma wore a heavy metal leg brace. Every morning, strapping it on. Every night, taking it off. Every day at school, the other children stared. Some mocked her. Most pitied her.

Wilma hated that brace more than she hated the pain. Because the brace told everyone who saw her what she was supposed to be: limited. Broken. Less than.

At age 12, Wilma made a decision. She took off the brace. And she refused to put it back on.

She started walking without it. Then she started playing basketball with her brothers in the backyard. Her leg still wasn't strong, but she was done being told what she couldn't do.

By high school, Wilma wasn't just walking—she was running. She joined the basketball team and became a star. Her coach noticed something extraordinary:

this girl who'd been told she'd never walk normally was the fastest player on the court.

He introduced her to Ed Temple, the track coach at Tennessee State University. Temple saw it too—raw speed, natural stride, and something else: a fighter's heart. At 16 years old, Wilma Rudolph qualified for the 1956 Melbourne Olympics.

The girl who wore a leg brace until age 12 was running in the Olympic Games.

She won bronze in the 4x100 meter relay. But Wilma wasn't satisfied with bronze. She went back to Tennessee State, trained harder, ran faster, and set her sights on Rome.

September 1960. The Rome Olympics. Wilma was 20 years old, and the world was about to learn her name.

She won gold in the 100 meters. Then gold in the 200 meters. Then anchored the 4x100 meter relay team to gold and a world record.

Three gold medals. Three races. Three times standing on the highest podium while "The Star-Spangled Banner" played.

She became the first American woman to win three gold medals in a single Olympics. The Italian press dubbed her "La Gazzella Nera"—The Black Gazelle. The American press called her "the fastest woman in the world."

But those titles don't capture what she really was: a woman who rewrote the story doctors had written for her.

When Wilma returned to Clarksville, Tennessee, they wanted to throw her a parade. But Wilma had one condition: the celebration had to be integrated.

In 1960 Tennessee, that was revolutionary. Black citizens and white citizens didn't gather together for anything.

Wilma insisted. If they were going to honor her, they would honor her on her terms.

Clarksville held its first integrated event—a homecoming parade for the girl who'd proven that human potential can't be measured by what doctors predict or what society prescribes.

After her Olympic career, Wilma didn't fade into history. She became a teacher. A coach. A civil rights advocate who used her platform to speak about equality, opportunity, and breaking down barriers—not just in sports, but in life.

She worked with underprivileged children. She established the Wilma Rudolph Foundation to promote amateur athletics. She showed that her greatest race wasn't on a track—it was the lifelong race toward justice and opportunity for others.

In 1994, at just 54 years old, Wilma Rudolph died of brain cancer.

She should have lived longer. Should have seen more victories. Should have celebrated her 85th birthday today.

But in her 54 years, she accomplished what most people couldn't in a hundred lifetimes.

She proved that doctors don't write destinies—we do. She showed that a leg brace doesn't define your speed—your determination does.

She demonstrated that being told "you can't" is just the starting line, not the finish.

Today, on what would have been her 85th birthday, we remember:

The 20th of 22 children who wasn't supposed to survive.

The little girl who wasn't supposed to walk.

The teenager who wasn't supposed to run.

The woman who became the fastest on Earth.

Wilma Rudolph didn't just break records. She broke every limitation anyone tried to place on her—medical, social, racial, economic.

And then she spent the rest of her life helping others break through their own barriers.

That's not just athletic excellence. That's a life well-lived.

That's a legacy worth celebrating.

Happy 85th birthday, Wilma. The world is faster, stronger, and more just because you refused to accept what you were told you couldn't do.

You taught us that the only race that matters is the one we run against our own limitations. And you won every single one.

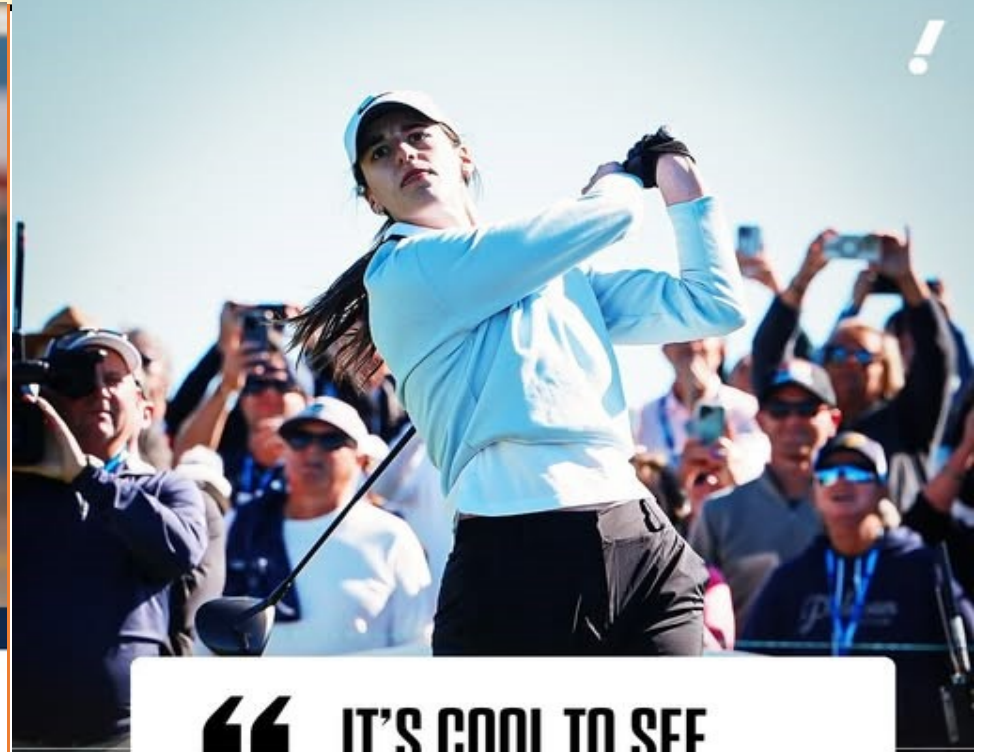

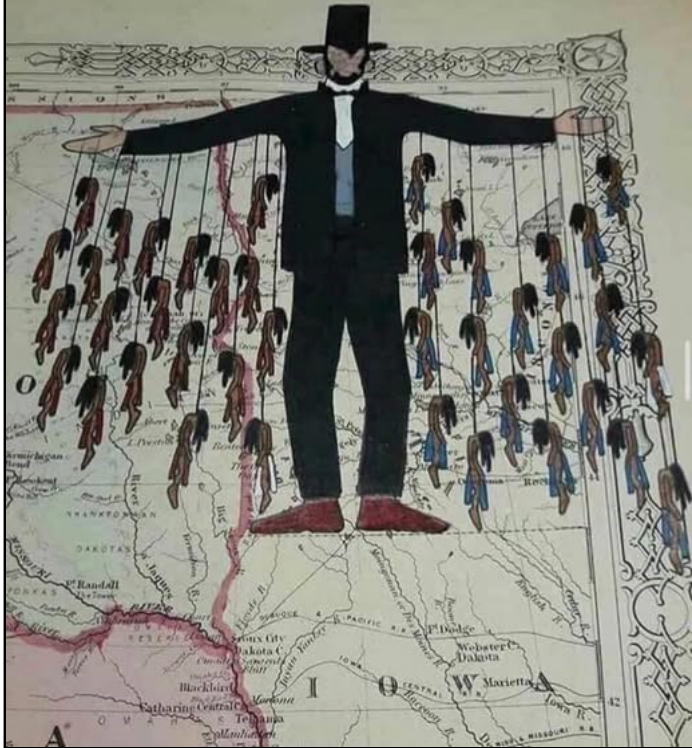

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163 Years Ago on December 26, 1862, The Largest Mass Hanging Execution in US History Occurred

The execution was signed off by President Abraham Lincoln the day after Christmas. At 10:00 am on December 26th 1862, 38 innocent Natives of the Dakota Sioux prisoners were led to a large hanging scaffold specially constructed for their execution. One Dakota sentenced to hang was given a reprieve at the last minute. An estimated 4,000 spectators crammed the streets of Mankato Minnesota and surrounding land to witness this horrific event that was glorified by the US Government. The native people were allowed reservations which was their own sovereign lands and nation; the United States has made agreements through treaty agreements that allowed the native people to utilize the land as their own. After months of making these treaty agreements, the USA allowed hunters onto tribal lands where they were met with armed natives. They were either removed from tribal lands or killed by the natives for trespassing and this is the reason Lincoln hung 38 Dakota, to set an example for others who killed trespassers on their lands. When we were younger in grade school we were taught lies about the US Government and bigger lies about their leaders like President Lincoln and we're taught Lincoln was the greatest president who ever lived. Truth is, the government wrote their own narrative that they taught to the children and it was nothing

An Illinois State University faculty member was arrested after he was accused of flipping a Turning Point USA student group's table and tearing down promotional flyers on campus last week.

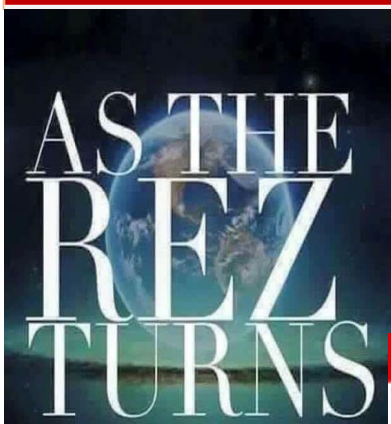
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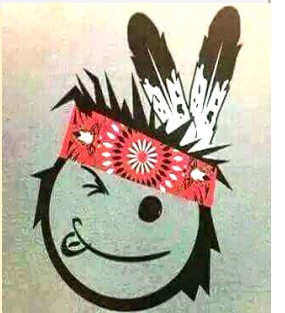
