When I met Ernie Stevens Jr., one of the first thing he said to me was, **"I was born in east LA!"** and was surprised when I didn't give him an eye-roll, but instead told him yes, I know.

He was even more surprised when I told him I new his father and that I was a supporter of his when I was a youngster working as a barber in the east LA area, Pico Rivera to be specific, in 1961. Ernie Jr. was only 2 years old at the time.

I told him that his father had a major impact on my political views and strategies as I became more involved un "Tr but I was still to young to grasp a realistic understanding of the full scale of the American political system. **Money**, and the distribution their of, to the political supporters of the powers that are in control, which is true to a point. **Ernie Stevens, Jr.**, was re-elected in April 2025 to his 13th term as chairman of the **Indian Gaming Association** on the final day of the **Indian Gaming Tradeshow and Convention** in San Diego, California. The IGA is based in Washington, D.C., and works with the federal governments agencies and Congress to develop policies and advocate for tribal gaming issues.

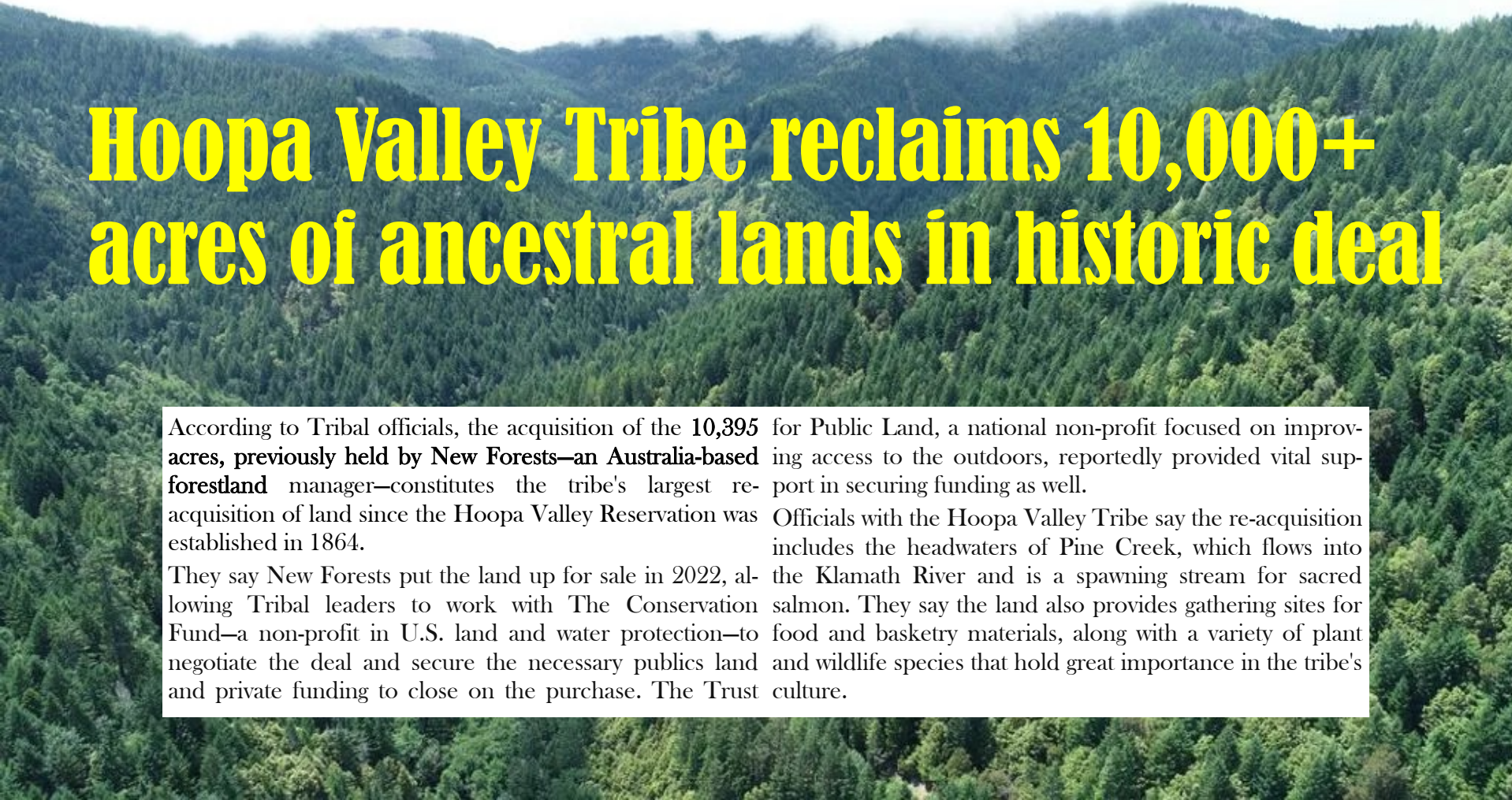

Hoopa Valley Tribe reclaims 10,000+ acres of ancestral lands in historic deal

According to Tribal officials, the acquisition of the 10,395 acres, previously held by New Forests—an Australia-based forestland manager—constitutes the tribe's largest re-acquisition of land since the Hoopa Valley Reservation was established in 1864.

They say New Forests put the land up for sale in 2022, allowing Tribal leaders to work with The Conservation Fund—a non-profit in U.S. land and water protection—to negotiate the deal and secure the necessary public land and private funding to close on the purchase. The Trust

for Public Land, a national non-profit focused on improving access to the outdoors, reportedly provided vital support in securing funding as well.

Officials with the Hoopa Valley Tribe say the re-acquisition includes the headwaters of Pine Creek, which flows into the Klamath River and is a spawning stream for sacred salmon. They say the land also provides gathering sites for food and basketry materials, along with a variety of plant and wildlife species that hold great importance in the tribe's culture.

Adam Beach once walked off a set in tears—because the director asked him to play a Native character as a stereotype. He didn't yell. He didn't argue. He simply said, "I can't do this. My people deserve better." That quiet act of defiance, early in his career, nearly cost him future roles. But it also defined him as one of the few Native actors in Hollywood unwilling to trade dignity for screen time.

Beach's story began far from movie lots. He was just eight when both his parents died within months of each other—his father in a drowning accident, his mother hit by a drunk driver. Suddenly orphaned, he and his brothers

bounced between relatives, learning to mask grief with humor. That survival instinct never left him. On screen, whether in *Smoke Signals*, *Windtalkers*, or *Flags of Our Fathers*, he carried a rawness.

But Hollywood was cruel. After *Smoke Signals* became a breakthrough Native-led film in 1998, Beach found himself typecast in "warrior" and "alcoholic" roles. He admitted later that he battled depression, sometimes hiding in his trailer for hours before a shoot. What pulled him back wasn't ambition—it was responsibility. "If I don't do this," he once said, "there will be no one else." And yet, acts of kindness threaded

through his rise. Beach was known for mentoring younger Indigenous actors, slipping them advice, or introducing them to casting directors. He often returned to his home community in Manitoba, funding youth programs and speaking directly to kids who saw no future beyond the reservation. "*Your story matters*," he would tell them.

Adam Beach's story isn't just about breaking into Hollywood. It's about the weight of carrying a culture on your shoulders while navigating an industry built on caricatures. It's about grief transformed into fuel, pain turned into protest, and a man who decided that representation.



A Chippewa Warrior, “The Last Ghosts of the Pacific”



On July 14, 1945, a U.S. Navy Helldiver plunged into the mountains of Hokkaido, Japan. The pilot, Lt. j.g. Howard Eagleston, was killed on impact. But Radioman First Class Oliver Bullard Rasmussen—battered, bleeding, and deep behind enemy lines—refused to die.

For the next 68 days, Rasmussen evaded capture across Japan's northern wilderness, living off raw onions, frog legs, and stolen milk. He slept in barns and railway sheds, traveling by night and hiding by day. He didn't know the war had ended—Japan had already surrendered—but still he kept moving, believing survival was his only mission.

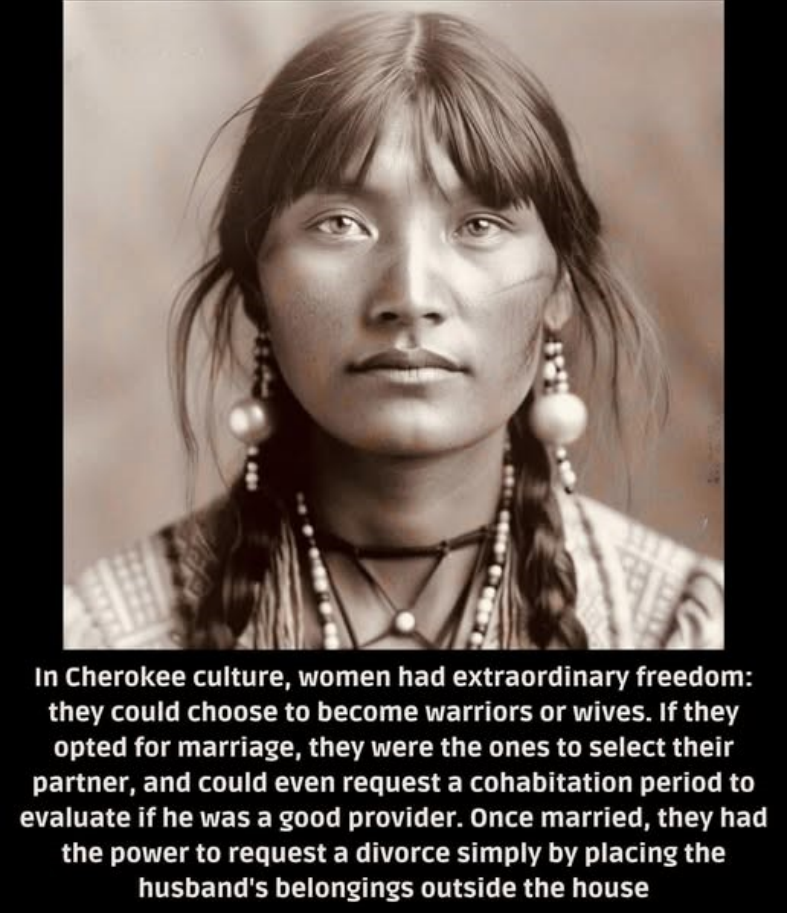
When he finally walked into the port city of Tomakomai on September 19, 1945, Japanese police were stunned to see the half-

starved airman bow and surrender. Locals joked that he was the "milk thief" who had haunted their farms all summer.

When Rasmussen was returned to U.S. forces aboard the USS Shangri-La, sailors called him "The last ghost of the Pacific." A Chippewa warrior who drew on his heritage and sheer will to live, Oliver Rasmussen embodied what it means to endure when the world turns dark.

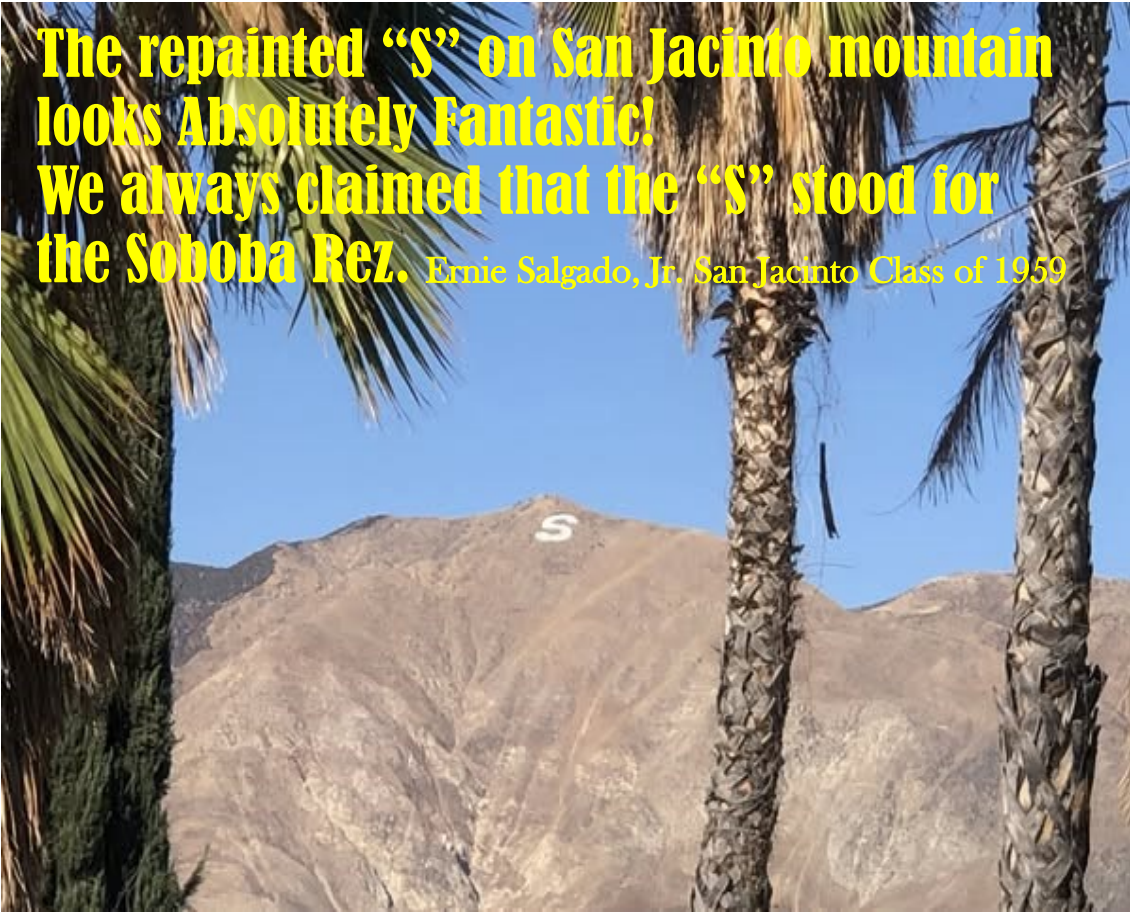
He lived quietly after the war—flying again during Korea, serving through the Berlin Airlift, and later working in science and engineering. He passed in 1980, but his spirit remains where mountains meet the sea—a testament to courage, endurance, and the unbreakable will of a man who refused to surrender.

## Forget California! Americans are abandoning the Golden State in droves — here are 3 major factors researchers say are driving the reverse rush

California remains an economic powerhouse, but rising living costs — particularly housing — are prompting more residents to consider leaving.

"There's a lot of evidence that that's driven by the high cost of living and especially the high cost of housing," Eric McGhee, senior fellow and policy director of the Public Policy Institute of California (PPIC), [told](#) KMPH Fox 26.'

**1. Housing costs and the price of staying**

Housing remains a leading pressure point. In July 2025, California's median home price [reached](#) \$828,900, according to Redfin — more than double the median in Texas (\$352,700) and significantly higher than in Arizona (\$439,200) and Nevada (\$465,200).

For families facing affordability challenges, the numbers alone make a compelling case to relocate.

California also levies a top [state income tax rate](#) of 13.3% on incomes over \$1 million — the highest in the country.

By contrast, states like Texas and Nevada impose no state income tax, making them particularly attractive to high earners.

**2. Political climate and lifestyle fit**

Politics may not be the primary reason people move, but it increasingly factors into relocation decisions.

According to the Public Policy Institute of California (PPIC), residents who left the state between 2020 and 2024 were more likely to identify as Republican, while those moving in tended to lean Democratic.

Even when finances or family are the main drivers, a state's political climate can influence where someone chooses to settle — especially when other factors are comparable.

**3. Remote work changed the game**

Before 2020, high housing costs kept many Californians tied to urban job centers. Since the pandemic ushered in remote and hybrid work, more residents have taken the opportunity to relocate.

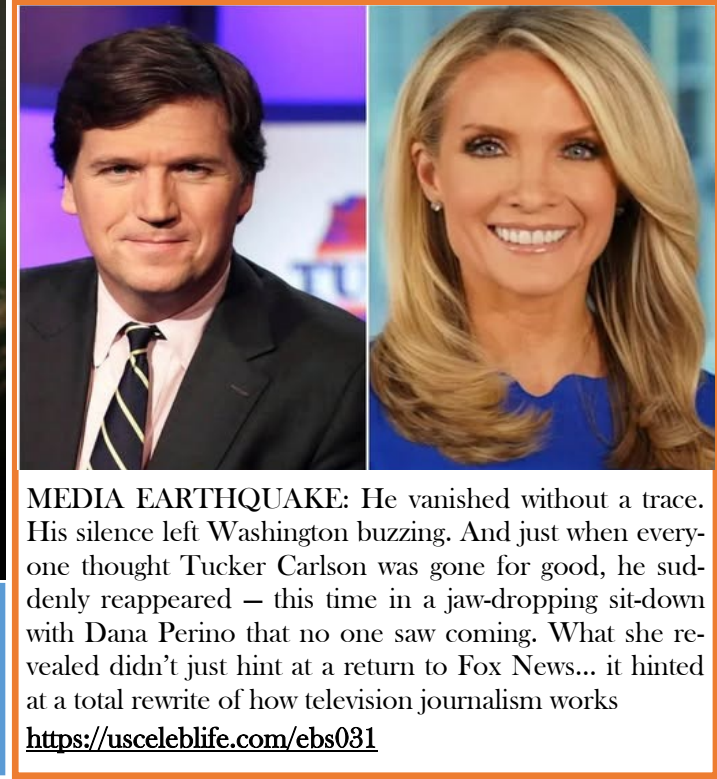
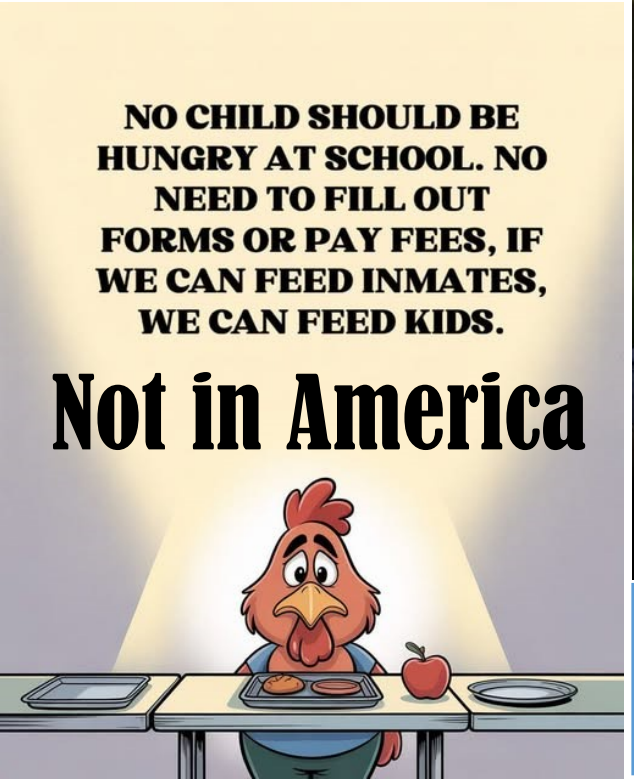
According to [data](#) from the Public Policy Institute of California, outbound migration among high earners has tilted heavily toward neighboring states like Arizona, Idaho, Nevada, and Oregon which offer more affordable housing markets.

Although this trend has cooled slightly as employers call workers back to the office, it's unlikely to disappear anytime soon.

The reasons behind California's outmigration aren't all that different from those in other states — cost of living, quality of life, political climate.

In California, those factors are amplified. Housing prices remain among the highest in the country, taxes hit top earners hard, and post-pandemic flexibility has made relocation easier.

For anyone still on the fence, the advice is simple: run the numbers yourself before making a decision.

## **Barriers are of the Mind**

**In the deeply segregated South of the 1950s**, two brothers—Carl and Ronald McNair—were inseparable. Born just ten months apart in Lake City, South Carolina, they did everything together, even dream together. But no one could have imagined just how far those dreams would reach.

One afternoon in 1959, nine-year-old Ronald walked into the town’s public library, searching for science books far beyond his grade level. Carl tagged along, as always. Inside, white patrons stared. The librarian told Ronald plainly: **“This library is not for coloreds.”** But Ronald didn’t flinch. He placed his books on the counter, sat down, and quietly said, **“I’ll wait.”**

The police arrived. So did their mother. And that day, because of her insistence—and perhaps a flicker of decency in the officer—the boy was allowed to borrow the books.

Ronald never stopped reading. Never stopped learning. In 1976, he earned a PhD in Physics from MIT. He soon joined NASA, defying every odd. As Carl would later say, **“Ron didn’t accept society’s limitations. That was for other people.”**

**In 1984, Ronald became the second African American astronaut to travel to space**, flying aboard the Space Shuttle Challenger. He was living his dream—a mission specialist, a pioneer, a star among stars.

**But on January 28, 1986**, the Challenger broke apart just 73 seconds after liftoff. Ronald was 35 years old.

He never made it back to Earth. But in every sense, Ronald McNair had already reached the stars. His story still reminds us: courage doesn’t wait for permission. It takes a seat, holds its ground, and lifts off.

His brother is an author, an educational consultant and an inspirational speaker. He has carried on his brothers legacy and established a foundation in his honor.

It was in Korea where Blocker met James Garner, who encouraged Blocker to give acting a try!

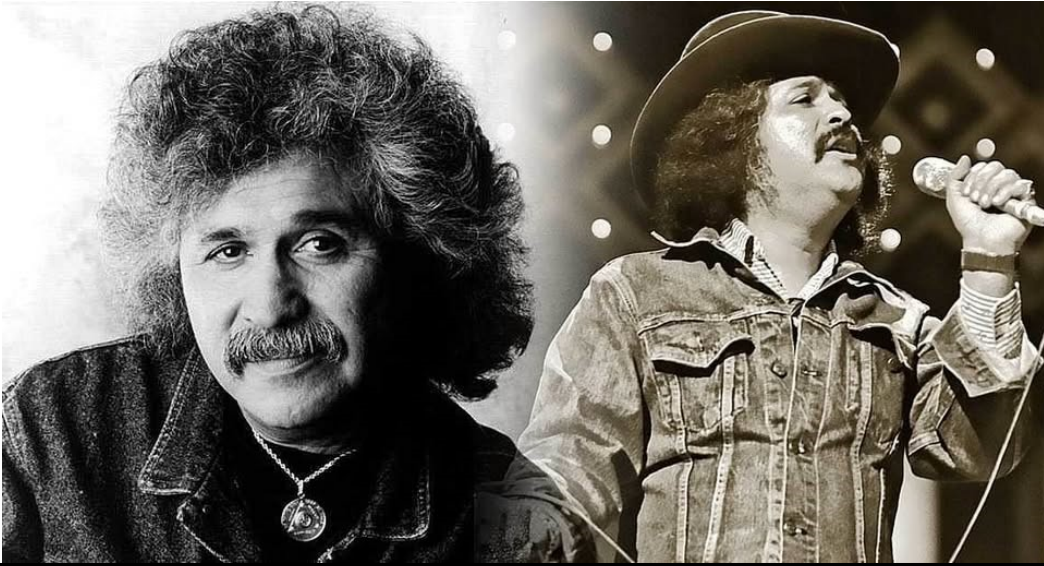

It is a violent armed resistance designed to incapacitate the essential operations of the duly-elected federal government, by force.

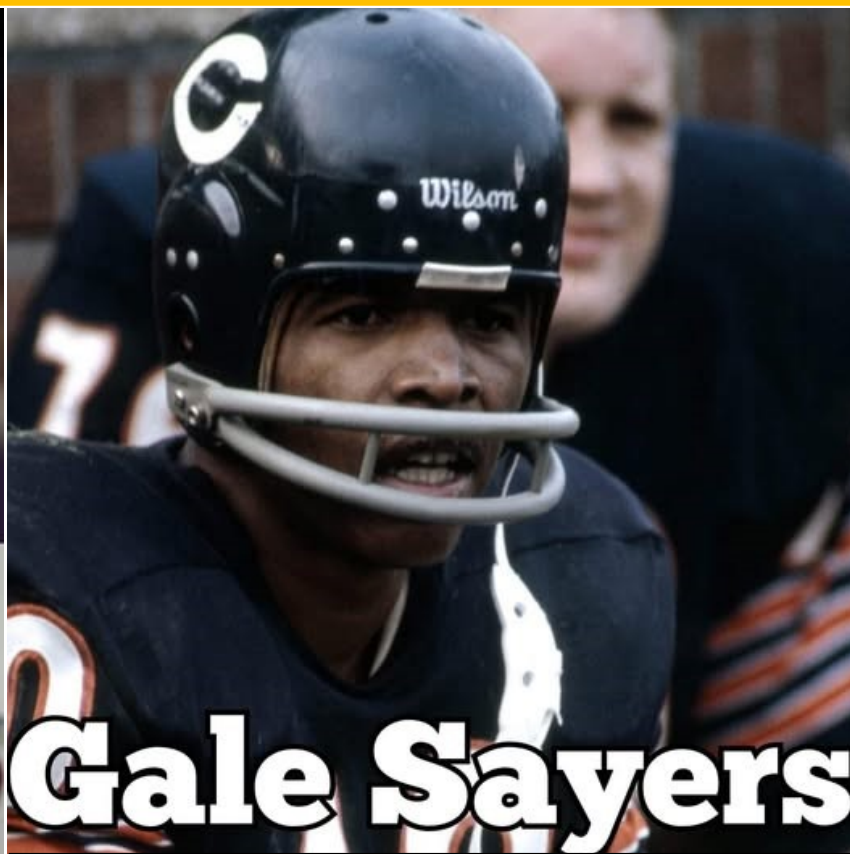

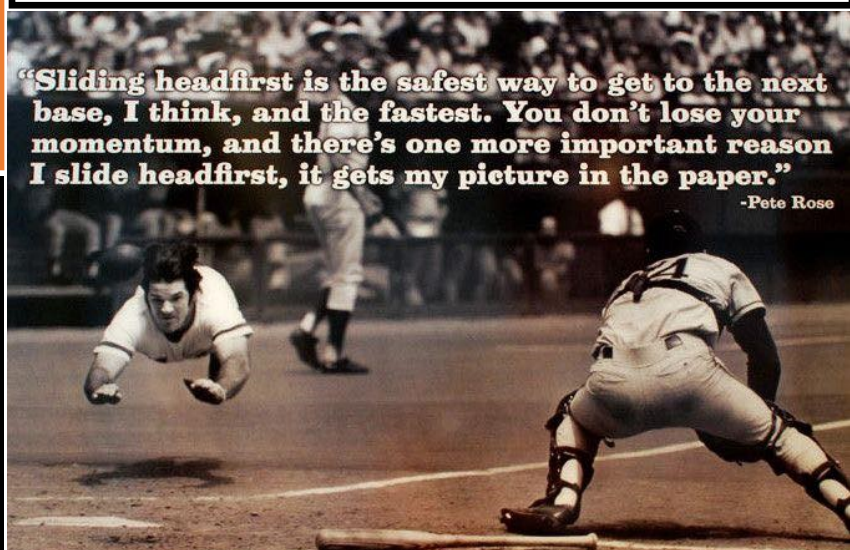

In 2023, Wes Studi, the trailblazing Cherokee actor who redefined Native representation in Hollywood, was honored with the Chief Standing Bear Humanitarian Award for Courage. This award recognized not only his extraordinary career but also his lifelong commitment to truth, dignity, and storytelling rooted in his people's heritage.

From unforgettable roles in Dances with Wolves, The Last of the Mohicans, Geronimo: An American Legend, to Hostiles, Studi brought a rare authenticity to the screen, portraying Native characters with strength and complexity at a time when Hollywood often fell into stereotype.

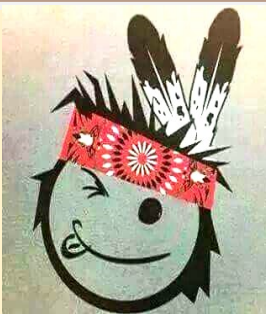
