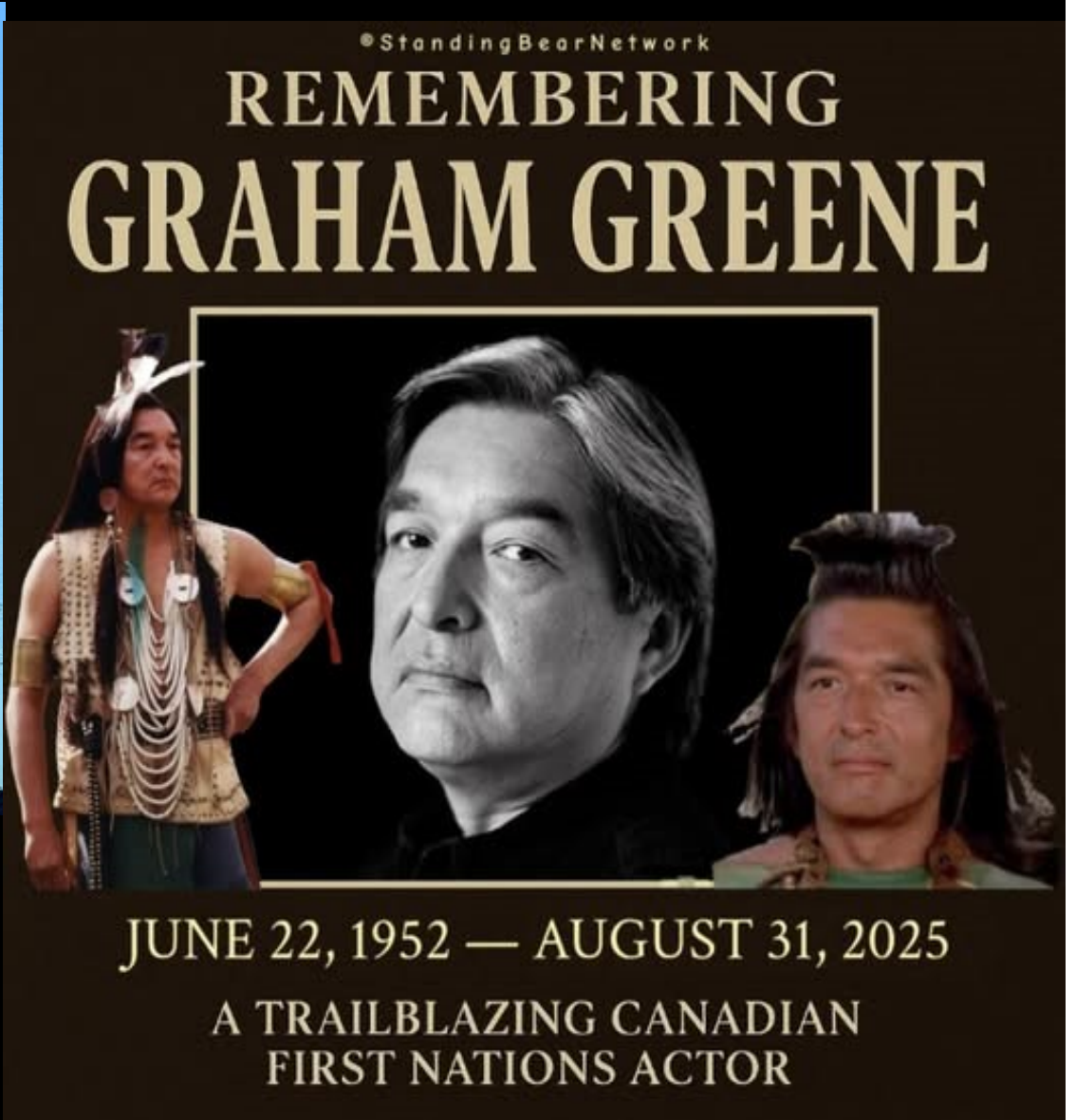

Thousands storm Manhattan calling for 'global intifada,' a phrase with a pending violence designation

Thousands of anti-Israel demonstrators reportedly flooded midtown Manhattan Saturday (Aug. 15, 2025) afternoon, calling for a "global intifada," a slogan many view as an incitement to violence against Jewish communities.

The Stand with Gaza protesters, carrying signs seeking to "end all aid to Israel," clanged cowbells while chanting "free, free Palestine" and "Palestine will live forever."

Since the Oct. 7, 2023, terror attack by Hamas in southern Israel, the phrase "globalize the intifada" has been referred to as a call for antisemitic violence.

Bipartisan legislation recently introduced by U.S. Reps. Josh Gottheimer, D-N.J., and Rudy Yakym, R-Ind., would denounce the term as "a call to violence against Israeli and Jewish people across the world."

Condemning it should be common sense, but some would rather play politics than tell the truth," Yakym told Fox News Digital in July. *"The violence and hatred directed at Jewish and Israeli people is reprehensible. No one, especially in America, should have to live in fear for their safety, or even their life, because of their religion or ethnicity."*

Gottheimer, who is Jewish, added the intifada refers to the horrific wave of terror attacks that killed thousands of Jews. Globalizing it, he said, is a direct call for violence against Jews.

"It must be condemned," Gottheimer said. *"I'm against hate speech targeting anyone — and everyone should be. It's insane and unacceptable to me that this antisemitic rhetoric is spreading rampant across our country."*

Absolutely unacceptable at any level. Who is next? Historically the Jewish people have been targeted for thousands of years.

On a personnel level, I grew up on the Soboba Indian Reservation during the 1940's and 50' under the influence of the Catholic Church. My first real memories of the church began when I was around 8 to 10 years of age. We had a young Italian priest, Father Luigi. He was very popular with the tribal people, especially the youth.

One of the thing that we were taught was that the Jewish people were evil and were the disciples of satan, the devil himself. And that they kill Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. So who am I to argue, I'm 8-10-years old.

World War 11 ended toward the end of 1945 when

I was 4 and Korea was around 1959. Believe me, ask anyone who grew up during WW II, you were well aware of what was happening.

After Japan's surrender on September 2, 1945 things were changing fast in the surrounding communities, but not so much on the Rez. Again, the church provided the cohesiveness and stability needed at that time.

The Catechism lessons regarding the anti Jewish people and Jesus' teaching of loving thy neighbor stuck in my mind,

I didn't knowingly know any Jewish people until a couple of years after graduating from high school that I learned that many of my classmates were Jewish. But it wasn't until 1961 that I officially met a "Real Jewish person." No horns, long pointed tail or fangs.

Every time I think about my preconceived stereotyping as a result of my early childhood church indoctrination I have to laugh at myself. I also have a better understanding of how people feel when they meet a "Real American Indian."

It also helped me to understand what Jesus meant by "loving thy neighbor" and "Shake the dust from your feet." You don't have to live with them, nor do you need to hate them.

However, I fail to recognize or accept this absolutely hideous hatred of the Jewish people and America.

AB 495 allows anyone who claims to be a caregiver, a relative or has "an established familial or mentoring relationship with the child" to sign a caregiver's authorization affidavit and be given the legal right to take a child from school. Participating in every major **#Marine** operation in the Pacific, these **#CodeTalker** teams proved essential in outmaneuvering the enemy with their swift, secure, and impenetrable communications.

Working in pairs, one handled the radio while the other translated and relayed messages in the Diné language, adapting their vocabulary for the complexities of modern warfare with a phonetic code. Their innovative

Going Home, Forever!

In autumn 1887, nine-year-old Wiyaka Wicañpi slipped out of the dormitory window of the St. Agnes Indian Boarding School in the cold pre-dawn. Her braids had been cut. Her moccasins taken. They called her Annie. But her name was Wiyaka Wicañpi—Feather Star. She ran barefoot for hours, over frozen grass and gravel. Her school dress snagged on thorns, her hands bled. She didn't cry. Her grandmother once said: "The stars watch the brave." Two days before, a teacher had beaten her for speaking Lakhotá. She didn't understand the prayers. The food made her sick. They burned her buckskin dress. But she remembered the path of the cottonwoods. The river curve. And the taste of wild chokecherries. She followed coyote tracks west, then deer, then silence. A kind Métis couple gave her water. A dog followed her for a while.

After five days, her uncle found her near the Rosebud Creek, collapsed but alive. He wrapped her in his coat and whispered: "Wiyaka Wicañpi is home." She never returned to a white man's school. he grew up teaching songs, dances, and names that the government tried to erase. They called her old-fashioned. She called herself still standing. She kept the burnt hem of her school dress in a pouch, as a reminder: "They tried to bury me in silence. I came back singing." MY VIEW Ernie C. Salgado, Jr., For every Wiyaka Wicañpi, hundreds of thousands didn't get home. The Motto of the U.S. Government Indoctrination Schools was "Kill the Indian, Save the Man." 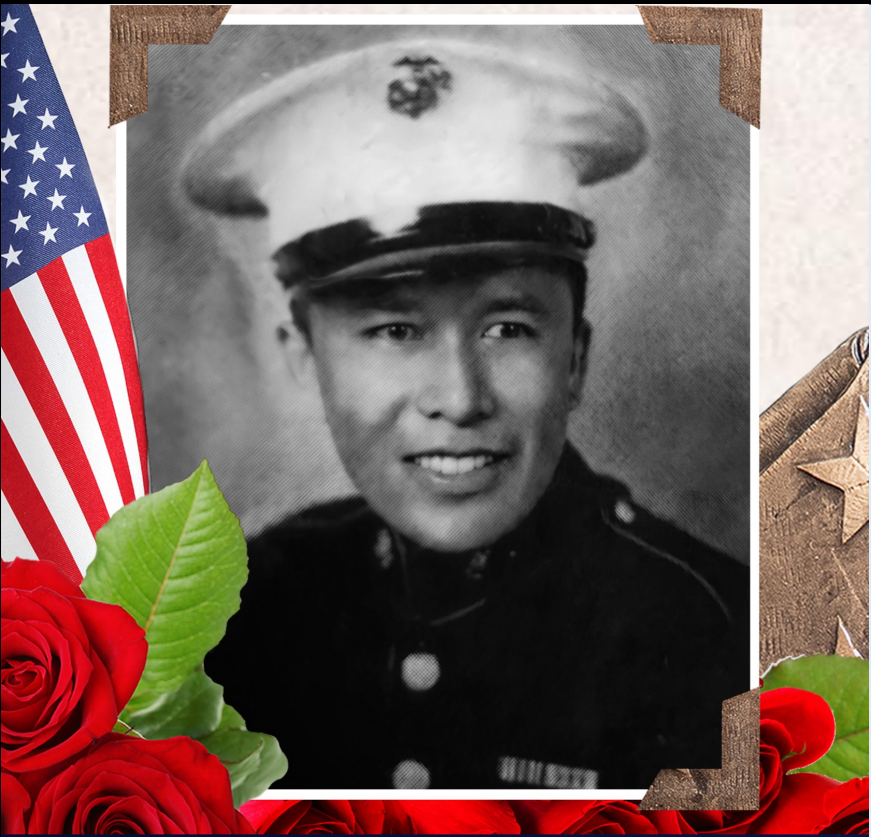

The Navajo Code Talkers were an acclaimed group of Marines who used their native language to create an unbreakable code that confounded Japanese forces during World War II. Pfc. Bill Toledo served with the 3rd Marine Division in the Pacific, including Bougainville, Guam, and Iwo Jima. Born in Torreon, New Mexico, he joined the Marines in October 1942 with his uncle Frank and cousin Preston. All three became Code Talkers. Pfc. Bill Toledo died on May 5, 2016, at the age of 92, and is interred at Santa Fe National Cemetery. 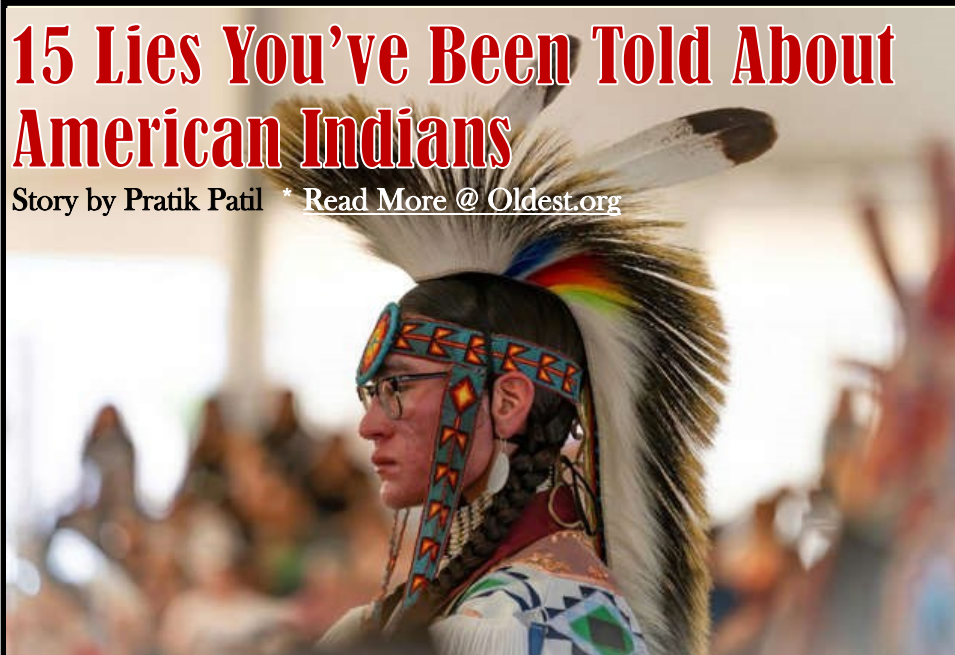

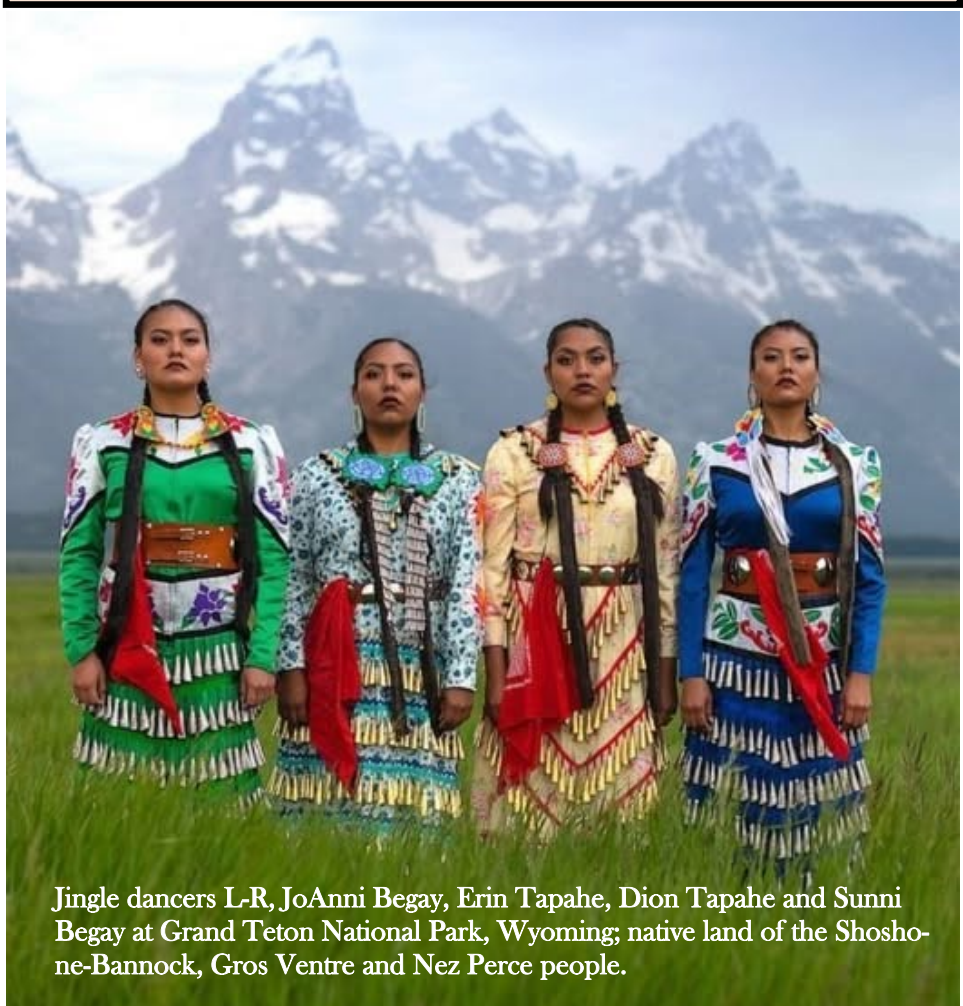


Captured in the 1880s by the studio of Buehman & Hartwell in Tucson, Arizona Territory, this stark and powerful photograph freezes a moment heavy with sorrow and strength. The image shows a two Apache warriors, leaders, sons, and fathers that represents hundreds of other tribal men and women warriors. Each one carried with them the stories of their people, the struggles to defend their homeland, the loss of sacred ground, and the relentless clash between prisoners—men and women who once rode free across the vast deserts and rugged mountains of the Southwest, now sitting silently behind bars. But even in captivity, their eyes speak volumes: pride unbroken, spirit unyielding. These were not faceless captives—they were between two worlds. Their chains were real, but so was their legacy. This image is more than a historical record; it is a solemn reminder of resilience in the face of forced removal and systemic erasure. Today, their memory lives on. Their descendants walk the same lands, speak the same languages, and carry forward the heartbeat of Aboriginal identity. As the desert wind sweeps across the land they once roamed freely, it carries their whispers, their strength, and their names. Let us not just look upon them as prisoners of the past—but as the proud and enduring spirit of a people who refused to disappear. For over three hundred years the struggle of the Aboriginal people continues in the halls of congress, court rooms and within our own people to gain a general consensus.

1. “Everyone prefers ‘Native American’ as the universal term”
This assumption seeks one polite, blanket label that all Indigenous people supposedly prefer. The standardization occurred as outsiders looked for appropriate terminology and educational materials adopted uniform language. Preferences actually vary significantly by community and individual: many prefer specific tribal names (Cherokee, Navajo, Lakota), while others use “Native American,” “American Indian,” or “Indigenous.” Federal institutions and many tribes still officially use “American Indian,” demonstrating that terminology remains diverse.
 2. “Casino money makes all tribes wealthy”
This myth suggests tribal gaming creates universal prosperity and special privileges for all Native people. The misconception grows from misunderstanding gaming revenue, occasional per-capita payments in select tribes, and political rhetoric that oversimplifies sovereignty into “handouts.” Media often amplifies visible success stories while ignoring broader economic realities. In truth, only some tribes operate profitable gaming operations, depending heavily on location and state regulations. Most tribal communities still face significant economic challenges, and per-capita payments remain rare, usually resulting from specific legal settlements rather than universal entitlements.

Assemblymember James C. Ramos Plays The Victim Card in Political Tirade

Assemblyman Carl DeMaio (R-San Diego) challenged assemblymember James Ramo D-San Bernardino) on his lack of due diligent with regards to the redistricting of Tribal lands. He said, *“I have a colleague from San Bernardino who likes to always tell us how he fights for the tribes. But do you know this map splits tribal reservations?”* DeMaio argued that the proposed map divides several tribal reservations across different congressional districts. *“So much for the voice of the people,”* DeMaio added. Ramos was clearly despondent as he was caught completely off guard and shocked, as he has been treated with reverence by both side of the aisle since his election to the State Assembly. It was obvious that he was not aware of the Redistricting Map and realignments of Tribal lands. I’m

sure the following staff meeting was vocal and tense. But, to Ramos’ credit, he did an amazing job of recovering, deflecting the challenge and taking control of the narrative. If there were any reservations with respect to his professional qualifications, abilities and political savvy, it went up in smoke on the floor of the California Assembly on Thursday, August 21, 2025. Ramos, visibly troubled, took the Assembly floor, and immediately went “Old School,” (*Going on the offence is a better defense*) by criticizing DeMaio for using American Indian tribes to advance his political argument. *“I have to raise my mic and be able to talk when a colleague from the other side is talking about history, talking about California’s first people, drawing them into this conversation,”* Ramos said. Today, I called out a colleague’s remarks in the highly contentious redistricting issue as *“divide and conquer”* tactics used against tribal communities.

With that lead-in, he changed the narrative as skillful as a used car salesman doing a *“bait and switch”* ploy. And in an instant, DeMaio’s challenge vanished and the historical victimization of the California Tribal people over the past 175-years became the narrative, which had nothing to do with the subject matter. He then went on a epic rant that could be the envy of any Academy Award hopeful. Pure theater, at its finest. The Assembly Democrats and liberal press went bananas. However, DeMaio missed a great opportunity to refocus his comments, or he was satisfied with getting his message to Ramos that the *“Honeymoon”* is over and letting the many Tribal Leaders in the San Diego area & State, that Ramos may not have their best interest at heart. If nothing else, DeMaio created the doubt, simply because Ramos was not aware of how the Democrats totally disregarded the various San Deigo American Indian Reservation’s boundary’s as if they didn’t exist, matter or they don’t care.

1 -James McDougal

- Clintons convicted Whitewater partner died of an apparent heart attack, while in solitary confinement. He was a key witness in Ken Starr’s investigation.

2 - **Mary Mahoney** - A former White House intern was murdered July 1997 at a Starbucks Coffee Shop in Georgetown .. The murder ...happened just after she was to go public with her story of sexual harassment in the White House.

At the time of his death Brown was being investigated, and spoke publicly of his willingness to cut a deal with prosecutors. The rest of the people on the plane also died. A few days later the Air Traffic controller committed suicide.

5 - **C. Victor Raiser, II** - Raiser, a major player in the Clinton fund raising organization died in a private plane crash in July 1992.

6 - **Paul Tulley** - Democratic National Committee Political Director found dead in a hotel room in Little Rock , September 1992. Described by Clinton as a **“dear friend and trusted advisor”**.

7 - **Ed Willey** - Clinton fundraiser, found dead November 1993 deep in the woods in VA of a gunshot wound to the head. Ruled a suicide. Ed Willey died on the same day his wife Kathleen Willey claimed Bill Clinton groped her in the oval office in the White House. Ed Willey was involved in several Clinton fund raising events.

8 - **Jerry Parks** - Head of Clinton’s gubernatorial security team in Little Rock .. Gunned down in his car at a deserted intersection outside Little Rock Park’s son said his father was building a dossier on Clinton He allegedly threatened to reveal this information. After he died the files were mysteriously removed from his house.

9 - **James Bunch** - Died from a gunshot suicide. It was reported that he had a **“Black Book”** of people which contained names of influential people who visited prostitutes in Texas and Arkansas

10 - **James Wilson** - Was found dead in May 1993 from an apparent hanging suicide. He was reported to have ties to Whitewater..

11 - **Kathy Ferguson** - Ex-wife of Arkansas Trooper Danny Ferguson, was found dead in May 1994, in her living room with a gunshot to her head. It was ruled a suicide even though there were several packed suitcases, as if she were going somewhere. Danny Ferguson was a co-defendant along with Bill Clinton in the Paula Jones lawsuit Kathy Ferguson was a possible corroborating witness for Paula Jones.

12 - **Bill Shelton** - Arkansas State Trooper and fiancée of Kathy Ferguson. Critical of the suicide ruling of his fiancée, he was found dead in June, 1994 of a gunshot wound also ruled a suicide at the grave site of his fiancée.

13 - **Gandy Baugh** - Attorney for Clinton’s friend Dan Lassater, died by jumping out a window of a tall building January, 1994. His client was a convicted drug distributor.

14 - **Florence Martin** - Accountant & sub-contractor for the CIA, was related to the Barry Seal, Mena, Arkansas, airport drug smuggling case. He died of three gunshot wounds.

15 - **Suzanne Coleman** - Reportedly had an affair with Clinton when he was Arkansas Attorney General. Died of a gunshot wound to the back of the head, ruled a suicide. Was pregnant at the time of her death.

16 - **Paula Grober** - Clinton’s speech interpreter for the deaf from 1978 until her death December 9, 1992. She died in a one car accident.

17 - **Danny Casolaro** - Investigative reporter, investigating Mena Airport and Arkansas Development Finance Authority. He slit his wrists, apparently, in the middle of his investigation.

18 - **Paul Wilcher** - Attorney investigating corruption at Mena Airport with Casolaro and the 1980 “October Surprise” was found dead on a toilet June 22, 1993, in his Washington DC apartment had delivered a report to Janet Reno 3 weeks before his death.

19 - **Jon Parnell Walker** - Whitewater investigator for Resolution Trust Corp. Jumped to his death from his Arlington ,Virginia apartment balcony August 15, 1993. He was investigating the Morgan Guaranty scandal.

20 - **Barbara Wise** - Commerce Department staffer. Worked closely with Ron Brown and John Huang. Cause of death: Unknown. Died November 29, 1996. Her bruised, naked body was found locked in her office at the Department of Commerce.

21 - **Charles Meissner** - Assistant Secretary of Commerce who gave John Huang special security clearance, died shortly thereafter in a small plane crash.

22 - **Dr. Stanley Heard** - Chairman of the National Chiropractic Health Care Advisory Committee died with his attorney Steve Dickson in a small plane crash. Dr. Heard, in addition to serving on Clinton ‘s advisory council personally treated Clinton’s mother, stepfather and brother.

23 - **Barry Seal** - Drug running TWA pilot out of Mena Arkansas, death was no accident.

24 - **Johnny Lawhorn, Jr.** - Mechanic, found a check made out to Bill Clinton in the trunk of a car left at his repair shop. He was found dead after his car had hit a utility pole.



25 - **Stanley Huggins** - Investigated Madison Guaranty. His death was a purported suicide and his report was never released.

26 - **Hershell Friday** - Attorney and Clinton fundraiser died March 1, 1994, when his plane exploded.

27 - **Kevin Ives & Don Henry** - Known as “The boys on the track” case. Reports say the boys may have stumbled upon the Mena Arkansas airport drug operation. A controversial case, the initial report of death said, due to falling asleep on railroad tracks. Later reports claim the 2 boys had been slain before being placed on the tracks. Many linked to the case died before their testimony could come before a Grand Jury.

Hopi Rez Kid Wins Silver at First Olympic 10,000-meter race, 1912

On this day in Native history—July 8, 1912—a quiet runner from the Hopi Nation stepped onto the world stage in Stockholm, Sweden.

His name was Louis Tewanima, and he came from the ancient village of Shungopavi in northeastern Arizona.

He wasn't wearing fancy shoes. He had no coach or team of sponsors. He ran barefoot—fueled by heart, heritage, and the memory of the mesas back home.

The event? The very first Olympic 10,000-meter race.

Tewanima, representing both the United States and his Hopi people, moved across the track with relentless grace—and when the dust settled, he had earned the Silver Medal.

Pictured Above is Giants catcher “Chief” John Meyers and Jim Thorpe. “Chief Meyers”: (left) was a Tribal member of the Santa Rosa Band of Mt. Cahuilla Indians in So. California. He was a star catcher for the New York Giants from 1908 to 1915. He was known for his hitting and his partnership with legendary pitcher Christy Mathewson.

Thorpe was a multi-sport athlete renowned for his prowess in baseball, football, and track and field. He won two Olympic gold medals in the 1912 Stockholm Games in the pentathlon & decathlon



And 52-years later at the 1964 Olympic 10,000-meter race in Tokyo, Japan another Rez Kid, Billy Mills won the Gold. Mills is from the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota and Oglala Lakota. No American has won gold in the 10k in the 61-year since Mills in 64. Tewanima's Silver is unmatched for 113-years.

But their stories is about more than medals.

They ran with the spirit of a people who'd been walking, running, and thriving across land for generations. They trained by running the rough terrain they called home.

They ran not to escape, but to honor.

And over a century later, their legacy still echoes—in every Native athlete who dares to dream, in every runner who draws strength from the land beneath their feet.

Hundreds of women will flock to Washington on Friday (Aug. 22, 2025) to take their first swings at turning pro baseball dreams into reality.

Some at the historic tryout will be seasoned veterans and trail-blazers in the women's game. Plenty others are beginners chasing a shot at the pros.

They'll meet on the same field in a camp organized by the **Women's Pro Baseball League**. Set to debut next year, the league is holding the first pro women's baseball tryouts in more than 80 years this weekend in partnership with Major League Baseball's **Washington Nationals**. The U.S. hasn't had a pro women's league since the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League — the one immortalized in "A League of Their Own" — dissolved in 1954.

Budget Role-Playing Part II



Budget Role-Playing Part II

After completing Part I, (AIR July 15, 2025 issue) some of your group may have disappeared. Hopefully they will depart with an understanding that budgeting is a little more complex than finding a few dollars in the couch that can be used for an extravagant ice cream cone, extra smokes, etc.

For those willing to plow on, they can now allocate the imaginary dollars within your challenge. Given a budget sheet to fill out is the fun part.

It should also stimulate the following discussion:

What are the Tribe’s accounting practices?

What reports are required? When? To Whom?

What obligations does the Tribe have that are addressed in this budget? ie Utilities, Rental, etc

Again, the purpose of the role-playing exercise is to help those interested in tribal administration to find out if their governing body has “proper” administrative, fiscal, and evaluation policies and procedures and what they are.

As the world has seemingly evolved to electronic management, the “generation gap” between those accustomed to paper records, etc. versus those conversant with some pretty incredible software that can track, analyze, and project. This should stimulate a lively conversation!

Evaluation.

Most people think evaluation mean good v. bad. **This is a fatal flaw in outlook.**

Evaluation is what happened and why. If, for instance, a tribe has a construction project with a timeline it does not meet, why? Were there weather conditions interfering with the calendar? A permitting process out of their hands? A supply chain issue? There are mitigating factors that are often beyond local control that should be transparently communicated. These can be negotiated into budget and calendar adjustments, not a pronouncement that the project managers are good or bad.

Evaluation also means outcome.

If, for instance, a project to immunize members against a threatening disease is successful, the outcome will probably be greater longevity with higher activity levels. This means population growth and different needs for the community population that now need to be considered.

Thinking back over the last decade, think of what electricity, clean water systems and decent shelter have made, to say nothing of cars, road paving and internet. And think of both the good and bad consequences!

There are always unintended consequences that should be recorded. They are neither good nor bad;

they just are. These recordings are particularly historically valuable in that they will reflect conditions and decisions made at a certain point so that future councils/committees can understand the governing body’s decision making.

Needless to say, it is also a way to build a viewpoint of tribal history over decades. (My plug for tribal archives, museums and libraries!) But I digress.

By now your role-playing group should have come “full-circle” and has a project and budget to present and/or share with the community.

How will this be done? Will it be a written submittal to the Council? Will it be a formal verbal presentation. Each method demands different skill sets.

Will each participant be invited to share their own personal journey in terms of knowledge/perceptions gained or lost, interest grown or diminished in tribal government? New things about which they would like to learn?

Each community has thousands of different stories. Each story is couched in the age, experience, and education of the person telling it. Role playing over a specific task to produce a product is one way to invite disparate views to come together. Have fun!

And here’s to the next era of tribal leadership.

Yurok Tribal Member Christine (Butler) Williams Named Senior Assistant Attorney General for Native American and Tribal Affairs for the State of California

California Attorney General Rob Bonta recently hired the Honorable Christine (Butler) Williams to serve as the Senior Assistant Attorney General for Native American and Tribal Affairs.

(Butler) Williams, a Yurok citizen, is a nationally recognized authority in Indian Law and a steadfast champion for tribal sovereignty. She has 25 years of experience in tribal jurisprudence with a focus on Indian child welfare, tribal court development, and cultural resource protection and repatriation under the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA).

For the past fifteen years, she has worked as Chief Judge for seven tribes across the state. Additionally, she developed the first joint Family Wellness Court in California and only the second in the nation. Rooted in restorative justice, the dual-jurisdiction, culturally responsive Family Wellness Court in El Dorado County was established to support families impacted by substance use and address child welfare challenges. The court is used as a model throughout the United States. She has served as member of the California Judicial Council's Tribal Court State Court Forum and a Tribal court representative on the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit Tribal and Native Relations Committee since it was formed in 2024.

“Christine exemplifies visionary leadership in tribal justice. Her ability to build bridges across jurisdictions, el-

vate Indigenous legal systems, and lead with integrity will make her an extraordinary asset to the AG’s office and a powerful force for progress in California,” said Joseph L. James, the Chairman of the Yurok Tribe.

“It is an honor and a privilege to take on this new position,” (Butler) Williams said. “The decision to take on this important role is not one I made lightly. The work I was able to be a part of developing tribal courts, providing training and consulting services to the Cal State System and representing – Tribes, especially my own Tribe in the Yurok Office of the Tribal Attorney, will be a continuing source of pride as I move forward in this new chapter of my career. I plan to use my skills and experience to positively influence tribal communities across the state for the benefit of all of California.”

As the Senior Assistant Attorney General for Native American and Tribal Affairs, (Butler) Williams will serve as a technical expert and legal advisor to the Attorney General, Governor, and state agencies on complex tribal issues such as cultural resource protection, civil and criminal jurisdiction, gaming compact negotiations, and government-to-government consultation. She will also develop and analyze legislation affecting Native American communities, provide legal counsel to other state and local agencies, and ensure compliance with laws and regulations concerning tribal lands and resources.
